

Archbishop Leonard P. Blair's Requirement on Mass attendance in the time of COVID-19

The following is an abridged summary of Archbishop Blair's requirements and/or recommendations sent to all active priests of the Archdiocese of Hartford regarding Sunday Mass and Holy days.

- The Dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of obligation is extended to **Tuesday**, **February 16**, **2021**, the eve of Ash Wednesday.
- No social gatherings either before or after Mass, including the parking lot.
- <u>All members of the Congregation need to wear masks</u>. [People who claim an exemption for a legitimate health reason (one that does not pose a risk to others) may forego wearing the mask.
- No congregational singing at all.
- There should be no holding of hands, during the Our Father and no invitation to exchange a sign of peace.
- All Communions lines should be single file, with people wearing masks, approaching row by row and keeping
 six feet apart. Neither the priest nor the communicants should wear gloves during the distribution of Holy
 Communion.
- <u>Communicants will receive the consecrated host in their hand,</u> step to the side, lower their mask, consume the host, replace the mask, and return to their pew.
- <u>Tape on the floor should indicate where to stand as a communicant approaches to receive Communion</u>. There also will be tape on the floor to show where to stand to unmask, and consume the host, and arrows showing how to return to the pews.
- At the end of Mass people should observe safe distancing in exiting, pew by pew.

St. Pauly Clothing Shed REOPENS at St. Thomas the Apostle Church

The clothing donation shed, which was temporarily closed due to global effects of the pandemic, has now been reopened to the public.

If you're not familiar with the clothing donation shed, it's designed to give community members a uniquely clean, convenient, and well-cared-for option to donate their used clothing to. St. Pauly Textile Inc., the company that has provided the shed, partners with businesses and various organizations to distribute donated items both here in the U.S. and worldwide, where they're ultimately re-worn by people who need them. St. Thomas the Apostle Church receives funding for donated clothing, and additionally has the option to use donations to serve community needs.

With over 1,300 clothing drop-off sheds in place, St. Pauly Textile Inc. collects over 90,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries (including the U.S.) yearly. In 2019, the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills, which clothed an estimated 2.5 million people worldwide. The company was founded in 1996 and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau.

Accepted items: clothing, shoes, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, curtains, pillowcases, and stuffed animals.

Ouestion:

Why do parishes have the Blessed Sacrament in a separate room?

Answer:

While many Catholics of a certain age have memories of the Blessed Sacrament being housed in the tabernacle on the high altar of the church, many parishes in the decades since the Second Vatican Council have chosen to build a separate space — a reservation chapel — where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. Although this practice is not universal, it is in keeping with the guidance offered by the US Bishops in their document Built of

Living Stones (see nos 77-78). The goal is to create a space that is separated from the nave and sanctuary, but which is "integrally connected with the church" which can foster "reverence and can provide the quiet and focus needed for personal prayer." This can be especially important for communities that have continuous eucharistic adoration, allowing people to come and pray in a space separate from the normal activities of parish life.

The practice of reserving the Eucharist in a separate space — or in a dignified location away from the altar where Mass is celebrated — is that it emphasizes the importance of the liturgy itself, which is the "source and summit" of the life of the Church.

As with many things in the Church, the practice of placing the tabernacle in the sanctuary or in a separate chapel is not universal (as can be seen in visits to historic churches in Rome and other places). The important thing is that as communities question where to place the tabernacle, they listen to the voice of the Church, explore the ancient and varied liturgical tradition of the Church, consider the needs and life of the community, and also take into account the architecture and limits of the spaces they might already have.
