

#### ABOUT THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

(Luke 13:1-9)

The parables that Jesus used help us explore in many different ways the rich significance of Jesus' teachings. In the story of the fig tree, we can see ourselves. We are called to produce good fruit but sometimes we are not successful. However, we are not forsaken. The gardener advocates for mercy to allow the tree one more chance to produce good fruit. Jesus teaches that when we repent, and when we cultivate our relationship with God, we will bear fruit.

#### ON THE WAY HOME FROM MASS

If the fig tree in the gospel represents us, who can the gardener be? How do you think the tree will respond to being allowed to grow once more?

#### LIVING THE WORD

As a family, schedule an education visit to a greenhouse or botanical garden. Some questions to discuss with your children are: Why does a gardener need to prune plants to help them to stay healthy? What would a gardener do to cultivate the soil around a tree to help it to produce more fruit? How much patience must a gardener have to work with plants?

#### 3 TIPS TO TALK ABOUT CANCER SCREENING

3 tips you can use to talk to your loved ones:

- Be compassionate. Make it clear that you want to have the conversation because your loved one is very important to you and you want them to be healthy and safe.
- Be patient if they object. There may be personal reasons why people don't want to schedule a cancer screening. Listen carefully without interrupting, offer to look up information if needed, and encourage them to talk to their doctor about risks and benefits.
- 3. **Give them time to think.** If your loved one isn't ready to commit to scheduling a screening test right away, ask them to think about it and set a time in the near future to come back to the conversation. Then put a reminder on your calendar and stick to that date!

You may be able to help catch cancer early. Lead by example by making sure you're up to date on your own screening tests. Then talk honestly with your loved ones about how important screening is. The decisions we make today can mean a brighter future for all of us.

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

#### **Question:** Confirmation Sponsor

What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

#### Answer:

Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes.

**First**, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor).

**Second**, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made).

**Third**, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on."

**Fourth**, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment.

**Fifth**, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1).

In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.

To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship.


