

### RESURRECTION ROLLS RECIPE

1 Can Pillsbury Crescent Dough 8 Large Marshmallows Cinnamon & Sugar mixed together in a bowl Water



A fun Easter treat that teaches children (and adults!) the real reason behind the holiday of Easter. These resurrection rolls are so easy to make and absolutely delicious!

- First, gather the kids together (or your significant other, grandparents, aunts, uncle, whoever). Get your ingredients out and preheat the oven to 375°F. Spray a cookie sheet with cooking spray or line with parchment paper.
- 2. Unroll the crescent rolls, separating each triangle. Explain that this is like the cloth they wrapped Jesus in.
- 3. Give your child a marshmallow and explain that it represents *Jesus. It's white and pure because He was without sin.*
- 4. Roll the marshmallow in a small bowl of water. *This symbolizes the embalming oils.*
- 5. Now, roll the marshmallow in the cinnamon & sugar mixture. *This is like the spices used to prepare his body for burial.*
- Place marshmallow in the top of the crescent roll and roll into a crescent roll shape, then secure the sides by tucking them under and pinching them closed. This represents how they wrapped Jesus' body.
- Place crescent rolls on cookie sheet and place in the oven (symbolizing the tomb) and bake in preheated oven for 8-10 minutes or until golden brown.
- 8. When the cook time is up, remove rolls from oven. When they're cool enough to handle, let your child(ren) open one and discover what happened to the marshmallow. It's disappeared! This signifies how Jesus has been resurrected.

"...and Jesus said, "whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, Mary Magdalen said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you laid him, and I will take him away." And Jesus said to her, "Mary".......John 20: 15-16

Is this Jesus alive? How do you know? Have you seen him? Why would you believe that someone, after three days in a grave, has been restored to life? We can learn a lesson from Mary of Magdela.

Her life when she met this Jesus, was crowded with demons. And when he drove them out, her emptiness was filled only with him. Her life would never be the same since this encounter. Mary now knew what real love was all about.

But then he was taken from her, put through a sham trial, tortured, and finally executed in front of her eyes, helplessly nailed to a cross. And she felt helpless too. Oh, she must have thought, "He saved me, but I cannot save him." And then after three hours, it was over - he died -before her eyes.

Three days later, crushed by grief, on the first day of the week she went to the tomb were they had put him. What horror when she peered into the tomb and discovered it was empty- the final indianity – grave robbers.

Jesus asked Mary, "Whom are you looking for?" He asks you and me that same question: "who are you, or I, looking for in our lives?" If it isn't for a personal relationship with Jesus, then what else or who else will take his place in our hearts? Many have come to ask that question of themselves because of the Covid-19 epidemic.

How does Mary Magdalen come to recognize that he is alive? Because he calls her by her name! So close was she to her savior that immediately when he spoke her name she knew it was him.

For us, following her example, we must so attune the ears of our soul to his voice speaking to us every day that it is like answering our phone, and hearing the voice of someone who truly loves us.

This requires a commitment: to prayer, to living a sacramental life so we can encounter Jesus every time we come to holy Mass, and to surrounding ourselves with others who also are searching to find this Jesus. There will be times when we want to give up, overwhelmed by temptations and distractions and health scares. But he will ALWAYS be there for us, waiting to call us by name!


