

Notes from the Administrator

This weekend's readings draw our attention to the saving sacrifice of Christ on Mount Calvary and the enduring gift He gives to humanity at that moment. On this mountain, the prophet Isaiah writes, the Lord will destroy death forever and provide for all peoples a feast of the richest food and wine. Undoubtedly Isaiah foretells the crucifixion that wins our salvation and the gift of the Holy Eucharist that pours forth from His Sacred Heart.

I just returned from the first of our three classes for the children who will receive their First Holy Communion at the end of this month. I confess it is a daunting task. How can a weak, imperfect priest begin to convey to these children the splendor of the Holy Eucharist in a way that excites in them a fervent desire to receive the King of the Universe into their hearts? How can he help them to understand the depth of Christ's love for them and His desire to see them and nourish them not just every Sunday, but even every day of their lives? Of course the simple answer is that he doesn't. He just needs to provide the framework for the Holy Spirit to do the rest.

One of the necessary elements of preparing for Holy Communion is to remember the need to approach the sacrament worthily, in a state of grace. It is true that receiving the Holy Eucharist can purify us of our sins, but not all sins. It is an absolute truth that Jesus cannot be in the presence of sin. Now, if it is also true that venial sin does not prevent us from receiving Holy Communion, then it follows that when Jesus does come to us He would need to clear out the venial sins to make room for Himself. Mortal sins are another thing. The only thing that can cleanse us of mortal sin are the words of absolution pronounced during a good confession. If we receive Jesus in the state of mortal sin, nothing good happens to us. We don't receive any grace, He does not cleanse us of our sins. In fact, we heap sin upon sin. We do tremendous harm to ourselves. To receive Holy Communion in a state of sin is the sin of sacrilege. What a shame it is to receive Holy Communion when we shouldn't because we might be afraid of our neighbors noticing and what a shame it would be to "wonder why so-and-so didn't receive Communion today." The gift of the Eucharist is the most sublime gift God could have ever given to us. How many Saints were moved by such faith and love as to sacrifice their mortal lives in defense of the Holy Eucharist and win the heavenly crown in return? Do we all approach the heavenly banquet with a heart so disposed to be converted by the graces the Eucharist offers us? The very reality is that the smallest particle of the Eucharist has the capacity to make us Saints in an instant. Nothing is lacking on God's part. But I need to continuously prepare myself to receive His graces and be made into an image of Him. What a privilege we have. What an unbelievable privilege that's not even accorded to the angels.
