Catholic Life...

Question: I have been away from the Church for a few years and really want to get active again, not so much for me, but for my children. Is this a bad reason to come back to Church?

Answer: If you are on your way to the supermarket, and you are forced to detour from your usual route because of road work, does the food you buy taste different? Is the meal less filling? Are the vegetables less tasty? Of course not. In our faith journey, there are many detours called sin. Some are greater than others, some are even a bit longer. But God's grace comes to us in ways we understand and recognize and need. Your children leading you back to the Church is not as important as the fact that you are back.

This is an opportunity for you to renew, strengthen, and deepen your faith. Regardless of how we get to Church, or what draws us closer to God, the fact is we are there. Do what you need to do to get right with God and the Church. Go to confession, begin good family religious practices, and be involved in the ministries your parish offers. Be more than a lukewarm parishioner. Be the kind of Catholic you want your children to be.

Baptism/Confirmation Sponsors

The Church, indeed, every parish, has a singular mission: to make Saints. She fulfills her mission through catechesis and the celebration of the Sacraments. In order to live a sacramental life, one needs to be initiated and that begins with Baptism and is completed with the reception of Holy Communion and Confirmation. Living a Christian life is not something that just happens through catechesis and the reception of the Sacraments. The Church has always recognized the need for new Christians to have someone who can serve as a mentor, someone to show the new Christian how to live the faith in concrete ways, usually by example. For this reason, the Universal Church has some basic requirements for individuals who would like to sponsor someone else's initiation. The requirements are generally an expression of the old adage: "You can't give what you don't have". To begin, sponsors must be at least 16 years old and they cannot be a parent of the person being sponsored. The remaining criteria include: they must have received all the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation); they need to be living a life in harmony with Christ's teaching, including attending Mass on a weekly basis; and, if they are married, they need to be in a sacramental marriage, that is, married in the Church. If the person meets all of the criteria, we gladly issue the certificate. Sometimes, we are unable to issue the certificate until the candidate removes the obstacles that prevent us from issuing it.


Anyone who has not received the Sacrament of Confirmation should do so in anticipation of the possibility of being asked to be a sponsor. Preparing for Confirmation is at least a year-long process with classes usually beginning in the Fall. Look for bulletin announcements in the Summer.

If the proposed sponsor is married, it is necessary for the marriage to be a sacramental marriage. The reason is quite simple: since Marriage is one of the seven Sacraments, the Church has the unique authority to celebrate it for Catholics. Therefore, civil marriages for Catholics are invalid. This has been true since the Council of Trent.

Most Catholics attempt marriage outside the Church for one of two reasons. They are either unaware of the need to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony or they are impeded from celebrating the sacrament because a previous marriage has not been annulled. *These problems can be fixed!* If both parties are free to marry, meaning there are no previous marriages that need to be annulled, the couple simply needs to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage. The celebration can be quite simple: the bride and groom and two witnesses.

If one of the parties is still in a sacramental marriage that needs to be annulled, that person should contact the Archdiocesan Tribunal (see the following article) and take appropriate steps. If an annulment is necessary, it may take a while for the process to take place. Sometimes these obstacles seem insurmountable, but they're not. They can be resolved, but they can't be overlooked. The priests are always available to help remove whatever obstacles may present themselves.

Finally, potential sponsors need to be practicing their faith by going to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. It is hard to imagine having a mentor at work who never interacts with the company they work for. The person being mentored will only advance in the company with great difficulty. Parishes usually verify Mass

attendance by one of two ways. First, priests may not know everyone's name, but we do recognize faces. If the person attends Mass regularly, we see them every week during communion. If we don't recognize someone, we check their envelope usage, not for how much they give, but that they are using their envelopes on a regular basis. If an adult child, living at home, is old enough to be a sponsor, they are certainly old enough to be using their own envelopes!

Finally, in order to be recognized as a sponsor, the candidate should obtain a Sponsorship Certificate from the parish where they go to weekly Mass, not where they received their Sacraments of Initiation, unless they are one-and-the same parish.

Marriage Annulments

The Sacrament of Marriage establishes a permanent bond that can only be broken by death, provided both parties truly want to enter into a marriage. Some marriages flourish while others "fail". Flourishing marriages prove the existence of the grace of marriage. Failed marriages give rise to the question as to whether the marriage failed because one of the parties did not truly want to enter into a marriage, thus preventing the bond from being established, or whether human sinfulness squandered the grace of the sacrament after the bond was legitimately established. This either/or situation requires competent individuals to evaluate the circumstances present on and before the wedding day. This is essentially the annulment procedure and its goal is to determine whether the bond could have been established. If not, it is determined that the marriage never took place because the bond was never established. Please understand, attempting a subsequent marriage, civil or sacramental, without a Decree of Nullity necessarily leads to an objectively grave situation.

It used to be necessary for the parish priest to process the necessary paperwork for an annulment on behalf of a parishioner. The Archdiocese recently changed that requirement in an effort to streamline the process. Anyone who would like to investigate the possibility of getting an annulment should now contact the Archdiocesan Tribunal directly. They will arrange for a brief phone interview during which they will evaluate the situation and advise the party how to proceed. The Tribunal can be reached at (973) 497-4145.

Marriage Convalidation

It is our hope that civilly married couples will decide to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony and partake of the abundant graces Our Lord provides to married couples. Convalidation ceremonies can be as simple or elaborate as the couple desires. Not long ago, we celebrated the marriage of a couple who had been together for decades. It was a private ceremony and they brought their original witnesses from their civil ceremony. It was great! We've had couples marry at Sunday Mass and we've had others who have had full-blown weddings. Weddings are always joyous regardless of how big or small. Contact one of the priests if you'd like to celebrate the Sacrament of Matrimony.
