

## Notes from the Pastor

Every January, we are reminded of the sacredness of human life. On the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision, the Church in America pauses for a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children or, in other words, for an end to abortion.

In scripture, the first sin that cries out to God for vengeance is murder, the murder of Abel by Cain. Of course, murder can take many forms, some seemingly more egregious than others, but murder all the same. If we easily flinch at those murders that make the front pages of our papers, why don't we flinch at the murder of an innocent, defenseless child in its mother's womb? What does that say to us about our society? We correctly advocate for an end to the death penalty, that people who have committed heinous crimes should not be put to death. We expect the legal system to hold responsible those people who take the lives of others. At the same time, as a nation, we can't bring ourselves to provide legal protection for those who have done nothing wrong?

One of the roots of the problem is relativism. We shy away from advocating for something objectively good for society because we have reduced truth to a subjective reality instead of the objective reality that it is. We erroneously believe that there can be different truths about a single reality. "That's your truth", we say, "but my truth is otherwise." We can't bring ourselves to defend God's divine law "you shall not kill" because some may not believe in God. What's so strange, though, is that believers or non-believers who choose to end the lives of their unborn children suffer tremendously because their God-given and God-created conscience cannot be silenced. God is not limited by whether we believe in Him or not. He still speaks.

If God has created the universe for us to live in, it is perfectly reasonable that He has established the "rules of the house" that He expects us to follow if we are to have peace in the human family. If no reasonable human father would create "rules of the house" knowing they would bring misery on the family, how much less would our Heavenly Father establish rules to make us miserable. The difficulty we face living in God's house is that we find it hard to accept the fact that if we follow His rules, which are certainly demanding sometimes, we will be truly happy. Sometimes, someone needs to have the courage to say this is the way it needs to be simply because it is true. Can we be that someone?

## **Everyday Stewardship**

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good parent, a good spouse) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever He tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers – do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us. – TEW


## St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 - 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave. One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.

#### **Christmas Collection**




