

Notes from the Pastor

Going... Going... Not quite gone. The sale of St. Andrew's School and Convent, has been extraordinarily frustrating.

To recap: Years ago a private developer contracted with the Archdiocese to buy the property. Shortly after, the Bayonne Board of Education expressed interest in buying the property. The legal arrangement was that the contract with the original buyer was assigned to the City. The City then assumed responsibility for fulfilling the contract. Mayor Davis and I chatted on the front steps of ASCA during the drive by graduation in June 2020. He told me he hoped to have everything wrapped up "by the end of the year". For whatever reason, that deadline passed and the sale was scheduled to close at the end of March 2021.

Around Christmastime in 2020, I received a call. The City could not secure the necessary funds in time for March, could they have a nine month extension, closing on December 31, 2021? The extension was granted, for a price. The "price" was intended to recover the expenses the parish continued to incur on the property while the City/BOE protracted the closing date. Quite honestly, the delayed closing dates have cost the parish significant sums of money.

A few weeks ago, just after Christmas and days before the contractual closing date, I received another call from the archdiocese. The City still has not procured the necessary permissions and, evidently, the money. Can we extend the deadline to March 1, 2022? was the request. Contrary to my personal desires, the extension was granted.

Since that time, I can tell you that the City has received permission from the State Department of Education to acquire the property and we are now finalizing the sale documents. Some day soon I hope to publish in big bold letters "SOLD".

While I am updating you on the school sale, let me also update you on the City's decision to require us to pay property tax on St. Andrew's Rectory.

Forgive me if I've already told you this part of the story. In November 2020 when most offices were closed, including City Hall, and most children were learning from home, the Tax Assessor asked to look at all the parish buildings to see if they were being used for tax-exempt purposes. In the convent, in the school, in the rectory, she asked "what is the building being used for now?" That was a tough question considering everything was closed in anticipation of the City purchasing the property. She was even in my bedroom at St. Mary's Rectory, making sure it was being used as a rectory! The end result was that she determined, despite the presence of religious Nativity statues in the garage, a legitimate tax-exempt use, that the St. Andrew's Rectory was not being used for Tax-exempt purposes and that we would, therefore, be required to pay in excess of \$22,000 per year in property tax. That's about 5% of our income.

We appealed the decision to the Hudson County Board and lost. The appeal is now at the State level. The discovery period for the hearing will close in February before the case is heard.

Everyday Stewardship

One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a quiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters.

But are we mindful – truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."


We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word. So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of God – giving it true spirit and life. – TEW

Annual Appeal

Every year, in early January, the Archdiocese begins their Annual Appeal. The Appeal is intended to raise funds for those charitable works that are too big for any one parish to sponsor on their own or those which benefit the faithful of the Archdiocese at large. As the pastor, I am required to make the appeal to the parish on behalf of the Archbishop and I will do that in the coming weeks. According to information I received from the Archdiocese, all registered parishioners should have received a letter and brochure from the Cardinal last week. In addition, those who participated in last year's Appeal will receive materials to renew their participation. If you have not previously given, please consider making a contribution this year. Many of our less fortunate brothers and sisters truly depend on and benefit from Archdiocesan programs.

BMT parish has a history of being very generous. Last year, we surpassed our \$50,674 goal by about \$5000! The excess contributions will be returned to the parish.

Usually, a parish's goal has been set at 10% of their Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections from two years ago. In 2020, everyone's income saw a steep decline because of the pandemic. If the Archdiocese were to continue implementing a 10% rule for the Appeal Goal, the Archdiocesan Goal would be about 17% less than last year while the financial necessity remains the same, if not greater because of inflation. Therefore, this year, the Archdiocese is providing two goals: the normal 10% of income goal and a stretch goal which is equivalent to last year's goal. Meeting our stretch goal, which should be no problem for us, will gain for us a 2% reduction in our annual assessment due to the archdiocese and any monies we contribute above our stretch goal will be returned to the parish.

Our base goal for the 2022 Annual Appeal is \$42,154 and our stretch goal is \$50,675.

As in year's past, we will not be placing the pledge envelopes in the pews. Instead, you are encouraged to make your contribution directly to the Archdiocese through their on-line portal.
