

Notes from the Pastor

The Little Flower aspired to greatness and wanted to do many things for Jesus and His Church. Among other things, she wanted to be a missionary; she wanted to be a priest. Of course, neither of those were possible. She was a cloistered nun and a woman. So, those particular "inspirations" were, at face value, misguided. Regardless, she did not stop looking for her true vocation in the Church. With a disquieted heart, she says, she turned to St. Paul's writings, especially the 12th and 13th chapters of his letter to the Corinthians. There, in a moment, she found the answer to her desire for excellence: "Brothers and sisters: Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way," Paul writes, before continuing with his classic treatise on love, today's Second reading. He concludes with the acknowledgment that, after all is said and done, faith, hope, and love remain, but the greatest is love. There was her answer. At that moment, she determined her vocation in the heart of the Church was to be love! At the same time, she found the recipe on how to love: love is patient, kind, not jealous etc... I believe we all want to be "lovers" in the Christian sense, as described by St. Paul, but it's hard sometimes. We ask ourselves whether our seemingly unappreciated acts of love are worth it, should we continue forgiving and not brooding over injury, for example. The final answer is simple and resounding: YES! because love never fails.

St. Blaise | February 3

St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer: Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

"Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe.

Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?).

A sense of division – whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else – is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen – especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree – even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window.

As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us – even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read – and remember, love never fails. – TEW





Annual Appeal

Every year, in early January, the Archdiocese begins their Annual Appeal. The Appeal is intended to raise funds for those charitable works that are too big for any one parish to sponsor on their own or those which benefit the faithful of the Archdiocese at large. As the pastor, I am required to make the appeal to the parish on behalf of the Archbishop and I will do that in the coming weeks. According to information I received from the Archdiocese, all registered parishioners should have received a letter and brochure from the Cardinal last week. In addition, those who participated in last year's Appeal will receive materials to renew their participation. If you have not previously given, please consider making a contribution this year. Many of our less fortunate brothers and sisters truly depend on and benefit from Archdiocesan programs.

BMT Parish has a history of being very generous. Last year, we surpassed our \$50,674 goal by about \$5000! The excess contributions will be returned to the parish.

Usually, a parish's goal has been set at 10% of their Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections from two years ago. In 2020, everyone's income saw a steep decline because of the pandemic. If the Archdiocese were to continue implementing a 10% rule for the Appeal Goal, the Archdiocesan Goal would be about 17% less than last year while the financial necessity remains the same, if not greater because of inflation. Therefore, this year, the Archdiocese is providing two goals: the normal 10% of income goal and a stretch goal which is equivalent to last year's goal. Meeting our stretch goal, which should be no problem for us, will gain for us a 2% reduction in our annual assessment due to the archdiocese and any monies we contribute above our stretch goal will be returned to the parish.

Our base goal for the 2022 Annual Appeal is \$42,154 and our stretch goal is \$50,675.

As in year's past, we will not be placing the pledge envelopes in the pews. Instead, you are encouraged to make your contribution directly to the Archdiocese through their on-line portal.
