

The Hemorrhaging Woman and The Dead Teenager

Today Mark relates these faith stories as a way of portraying Jesus as one who has power to heal. The historical context helps us enter into these stories and make them our own. To help us, I draw upon "The Cultural World of Jesus," by renowned biblical scholar and author John Pilch..

Pilch says we must remember that in Jesus' time the notions of germs, microscopes, CAT scans, and drug therapy were unknown. The ancient world knew at least two kinds of healers: professional physicians and folk healers. *Professional physicians* hesitated to treat patients because if they died, the physician could be put to death too. So they preferred to discuss illness as a philosophical reflection. The Hebrews considered God to be their chief healer so they developed an ambivalent attitude toward physicians. *Folk healers* were more commonly available to peasants. They were willing to use their hands, touch people, and even risk failed treatments. People considered Jesus to be a *folk healer* ... a spirit-filled prophet who could restore folks to their proper place in the community. Healing is the restoration of meaning to people's lives no matter what their physical condition might be.



In the 1st century, 60% of live births usually died by their mid-teens. Mark (written in Greek) retains Jesus' Aramaic words "Talitha koun" ("little girl, get up") reflecting the ancient belief that power is in the original words. As proof that the girl is healed, Jesus commands that she eat with her family and be restored to her rightful place in the community.

So ... a question for us to ponder: To what extent are we healers and how open are we to receive healing from Jesus and from others?


