## From Our Pastor's Desk

HS

Saints-in-the-Making,

As we celebrate the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, we are reminded that the Church's use of the word "Ordinary" does not mean that this time is unspectacular. Rather, it is, as all time is, **ordered** to God and simply the Time that is outside of the Seasons of Solemnities such as Easter and Christmas. The Church counts these weeks with **ordinal** numbers (First, Second, Third...) and reminds us that we are to devote our time, really all of our time, ordinary and otherwise, to the Lord.

This is what St. Joseph, to whom this Holy Year is dedicated, did so very well. He provided for Mary and the Child Jesus by ordinary actions of work, care, and prayer. and He did so for love of God. St. Joseph was quite content, as humble and just persons are, with living an "ordinary" life with extraordinary love. This Patron Saint of the Universal Church and the Head of the House of Nazareth has much to teach us on loving extraordinarily in ordinary moments of our lives.

This is why Pope Francis has dedicated this year to St. Joseph, and why he has decreed that a plenary indulgence might be made at particular times throughout the year, including the 19<sup>th</sup> of each month and every Wednesday, a day traditionally dedicated to St. Joseph, just as Fridays are dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Saturdays to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

A plenary indulgence allows for the complete remission of all sin, that is the consequences of our sins, by being free from the attachment of all sin, including venial as well as fulfilling the following: 1) in a span of 8 days either before or after the day, participate In sacramental Confession; 2) in a span of 8 days either before or after the day, receive Holy Communion; and 3) pray for the Pope's intentions, generally one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be. The plenary indulgence may be applied to you or to anyone, known or unknown to you, who is deceased.

To deepen our imitation of St. Joseph and his virtues as well as to facilitate the plenary indulgence, St. Jude Parish will be offering many opportunities of prayer and devotions, including this **Tuesday**, **January 19 at 6PM with a Holy Hour in the church**. In the context of Eucharistic Adoration, we will pray the private devotion of the Joyful Mysteries from the perspective of St. Joseph that is being promoted from the Diocese of Steubenville.

We will also be praying for our country and a peaceful transfer of power, for an end to all divisions within our beautiful country, including conflicts of race and creed, and most especially for the legal protection of the sanctity of all human life from conception through natural death, as Friday January  $22^{nd}$  is the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.

St. Paul reminds us in this weekend's reading that we are to "glorify God in our body"," for we have been purchased at a price." Since we are body and soul, one way to glorify God in our body is through prayer as a parish body, that is, as a parish community, as a parish family, ordering our ordinary time to God.

I look forward to seeing you at the church on Tuesday January 19 at 6PM.

Until then, let us daily pray:

St. Joseph,

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, To you God entrusted His only Son; In you Mary placed her trust; With you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us, too, Show yourself a father And guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, And defend us from every evil. Amen.

God love you! I do.

#### Weekly Masses Now Live Streamed in Real Time!

Our weekly Saturday-Sunday Masses are now being LIVE-streamed in real time on our YouTube Channel!

Using a state-of-the-art digital studio platform plus four to six digital cameras mounted around the church, parishioners can now view the Mass from the comfort of their home as it is taking place. For those that cannot view it live, the system automatically records and retains the recorded version so parishioners can view it at a later time.

Currently, the only LIVE Mass offered is the 4 p.m. Saturday, however it is anticipated that we will be adding further weekend services in the very near future. (To locate our YouTube channel go to YouTube and search "St. Jude The Apostle Church, Lewes DE" and Subscribe. Tune-in to the channel 5-minutes in advance of the service for the LIVE broadcast.)

Moving to this "new" system is an adjustment for those coordinating its broadcast and there will be a "learning curve" as we better each new airing. Various improvements to the broadcasts will be made over time. It is hoped that we will be able to add things like the Spiritual Communion prayer in the future as we become more proficient with the system. Be patient with us as we grow.



#### GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

January 17, 2021 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our faith is not just about ideas. It's really about having an encounter with God and, in particular, the Risen Christ! Once we give ourselves over to the notion of God's presence, we have to train ourselves to listen for God's voice and be attentive to God's call. Having companions on our faith journeys is so incredibly important as they can help us fine-tune our listening skills and discern God's voice from others we may be hearing. Faith is all about having these profound encounters not only with God but with our brothers and sisters, and creation itself. Anyone or anything that is alive with God's presence becomes an occasion for God to speak and call us to deeper graces and experiences. "Come, and you will see."

The example and teaching of Jesus, the lives of the saints, those living among us and those glorified in heaven, and the wonder and beauty of creation can all serve to help us listen more clearly and assist in positioning ourselves for this profound God meeting. It is an encounter that can quickly and easily lead to a friendship and intimate intertwining of our souls to their Maker, making a claim on us like no other. Then, the Word of God moves from being just a body of ideas to something we simply accept and do. The person of Jesus Christ swiftly moves from being just a good prophet in word and deed to the incarnate presence of God Himself, the Lamb of God. The voice leads us to the Person behind it.

The Gospel is hard to follow. We can intellectually debate whether what Jesus said is really what we are asked to do. The Gospel ideas do not always make sense in our practical, secular world. The person of God always does. We can debate the practicality and sense of ideas and doing so often keeps the more difficult ones at a safe distance away from us. Jesus said to love our enemy, but we really don't need to do that, our minds try to convince us. It just doesn't make sense. Yet, if we are truly in love with the God who is behind the voice of those words, they make perfect sense. Our deep and intimate love of this God would even find us laying down our lives for Him if necessary. Speak Lord, your servant is listening.






From Little Rock Scripture Study By Marie Noonan Sabin, PhD.

In 1897, Therese Martin, a 24-year-old Carmelite cloistered nun in Lisieux, France, passed away from tuberculosis. This obscure young woman would be canonized a saint only a few years later, in 1925, and has become one of the most well-known and beloved of saints. Her doctrine of "the little way of trust and love" was explained in , *The Story* 

of a Soul, and led to her being proclaimed in 1997 one of only four women doctors of the church.


