Confirmation: Is a 2-year preparation process. Call Christian Formation Office for details.

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): Call the Christian Formation Office for information.

Marriage: At least one individual should be a parishioner who practices our faith. Please contact one of our Priests or Deacons to begin preparation which takes approximately 1 year.

Anointing of the Sick: Parishioners facing surgery or struggling with serious illness may request the sacrament by calling our Parish Office at 644-7300.

From Our Pastor's Desk

Dear Fellow Saints-in-the-Making,

Greetings in Christ Who sets us free.

As a Church, we celebrate the 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time this weekend and as a nation, we celebrate the 245th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, where Thomas Jefferson writes the truths our Founding Fathers agreed upon for the establishment of the United States as a nation of its own, independent of British rule and tyranny.

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." All are created equal, a great and irrefutable truth first introduced to humankind by God Himself in the Book of Genesis, when He creates the woman from the man's side. He does not create her from a bone in the man's skull so that she be above him; nor does He create her from the bone of the man's foot, so that she be beneath him; nor does God create the woman from a bone in the man's back so that she be behind him. Rather, the Creator fashions woman from the man's rib, from his side, so that she is his equal.

All are created equal: Brown, Red, Black, Yellow, White, Male, Female, Young, Young-At-Heart. All have unalienable Rights, the foremost of which our Founding Fathers specify is Life. If all are created equal—and they are—then let us work with Christian charity that all in our great nation might enjoy the freedoms God has given to us simply by creating us in His image. Let us fulfill Jesus' command to love one another as He has loved us so that all—the child in the womb, the downtrodden, the homeless, the aged, the poor, the vulnerable, the sick, the lonely, the outcast, the dying—might realize how much their life matters to us and to God and so know the One—and only One—Who makes us free: Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

May you and your family have a blessed, safe and relaxing Fourth of July.

Let us together thank God for the gift of our great nation and our freedoms, including the Freedom to Worship.

We are blessed as a parish community with the Real Presence of Jesus Christ exposed in our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel from 4 AM Monday through 12 Noon Saturday And from 11 AM to 9 PM on Sunday.

Remarkably, and thankfully, here at St. Jude's adorers can be with Our Eucharistic Lord any time, day or night, whether for a few minutes or for an hour or more. Jesus continues to call persons to adore Him on a regular basis and be graced - helped, healed, renewed, and saved - by Him.

Please listen: He is calling.

With increased interest in earlier Sunday morning Adoration, we seek someone to be assigned to the Sunday 10 am hour so that we might start scheduled Adoration an hour earlier. Also, we continue to place a priority on hours with only one adorer.

GUIDELINES FOR ADORATION UNDER COVID-19CONDITIONS Revised May 21, 2021

- The Adoration Chapel is open for Adoration as regularly scheduled - Monday, 4 am, through Saturday, 12 noon; and Sunday, 11 am to 9 pm.
- The chapel door is unlocked during the day from 7 am to 7 pm, and it is locked during the night from 7 pm to 7 am, at which time the lock code is required for entry.
- Assigned adorers should adore at their designated hours, subject to their discretion about any risk of Covid infection they feel they may incur in the chapel environment.
- Those fully-vaccinated who have received both shots of a two-dose series at least two weeks ago - no longer need to wear a face mask in the chapel. No proof of vaccination is needed. Those not fully vaccinated are to wear a face mask in the chapel. Anyone who prefers to wear a mask may do so.
- Use of the hand sanitizer provided in the chapel is recommended.
- Adorers are recommended to keep socially distanced in the chapel, three feet apart.
- Before leaving the chapel if no one else is present, adorers must close the tabernacle door to repose the Blessed Sacrament, and upon arriving open the tabernacle door to expose the Blessed Sacrament if the door is closed.
- Missalettes, the library, sign-in, petition, and thank-you sheets will return.
- These guidelines remain in effect until further notice.

July 4, 2021 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's all so ordinary that we can easily miss it. The seagulls hunting and diving for mollusks at the beach offer a display of determination and precision as they gather their food for the day. It's simply what these creatures do. Yet, there's a magical artfulness and skill to their work that speaks volumes about the One who breathes life into their being. This is pretty much the way it is with God's presence. God comes in common ways through common things and ordinary people. Sadly, we are so engulfed in our little worlds of order and ideas to notice the beauty and wonder of it all. Many have numbed themselves to the Divine spark at the essence of all life because that's just the way it is. What's so special about it? A sunset is a sunset and a seagull is a seagull. That's precisely what they thought about Jesus too. After all, isn't he just the carpenter's son? What merit can his words possibly have?

If we're looking for God to come in an event that is so dramatic and intense that it knocks our socks off, then think again. When pondering God's relationship with His people and God's action in our lives, we have to go back to the stable and the recurring, creative, unending power of God's presence. It was a quiet, run of the mill kind of night. There was nothing spectacular or extraordinary. To the naked eye, a woman gave birth to a child and there wasn't anything extraordinary to see. We have a hard time understanding God's ordinary-ness. Jesus grew up in an ordinary town, had neighbors and did normal human things. Perhaps that's why we don't always like the Gospel. It doesn't dazzle us with extraordinary things but simply challenges us to take a different look at our ordinary stuff. That makes us uncomfortable. We prefer things as they are. Our lack of faith can even cause us to take offense at what Jesus says and does, dismissing it as folly.

God's life-giving presence continues to sustain that seagull in flight and keep all things in being regardless of whether we have the faith to see and understand this. Our personal agendas, preconceived ideas, misconceptions, and expectations can often cause us to be hardened and blinded to what God is doing or desiring to do. While God continues to do what he has done for all eternity, faith is needed for God's presence to bear fruit. The blinders we wear and the expectations we bring to life can often prevent us from seeing graced moments that radiate with God's graceful presence. They also prevent God's transforming, healing, and hope filled vision for our world from being realized. If we have no faith, God won't be able to do much for us either.

In 1897, Therese Martin, a 24-year-old Carmelite cloistered nun in Lisieux, France, passed away from tuberculosis. This obscure young woman would be canonized a saint shortly thereafter, in 1925, and has become one of the most well-known and beloved of saints. Her doctrine of "the little way of trust and love" was explained

in *The Story of a Soul*, and led to her being proclaimed in 1997 one of only four women Doctors of the Church.

Respect Life

Catechism 2267 Assuming that the guilty party's identity and responsibility have been fully determined, the traditional teaching of the Church does not exclude recourse to the death penalty, if this is the only possible way of effectively defending human lives against the unjust aggressor.

If, however, non-lethal means are sufficient to defend and protect people's safety from the aggressor, authority will limit itself to such means, as these are more in keeping with the concrete conditions of the common good and are more in conformity to the dignity of the human person.

Today, in fact, as a consequence of the possibilities which the state has for effectively preventing crime, by rendering one who has committed an offense incapable of doing harm - without definitely taking away from him the possibility of redeeming himself the cases in which the execution of the offender is an absolute necessity "are very rare, if not practically non-existent."




