

Reconciliation is also available by appointment at any time

Confirmation: Is a 2-year preparation process. Call Christian Formation Office for details.

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): Call the Christian Formation Office for information.

Marriage: At least one individual should be a parishioner who practices our faith. Please contact one of our Priests or Deacons to begin preparation which takes approximately 1 year.

Anointing of the Sick: Parishioners facing surgery or struggling with serious illness may request the sacrament by calling our Parish Office at 644-7300 .

From Our Pastor's Desk

Dear Fellow Saints-in-the-Making,
Greetings in Christ.

With praise and thanksgiving to God, we have a new shepherd of our Diocese: Bishop William Koenig. He was ordained a Bishop and then immediately installed the Tenth Bishop of the Diocese of Wilmington on July 13, the Feast of St. Henry, a holy and pious German king. This is rather fitting, given that Bishop Koenig has German ancestry and that his name translated in English means “King.” As Bishop of our Diocese, he is entrusted with the sacred duty of governance of our salvation by “preserving and teaching the fullness of truth and the fullness of beauty of the Catholic Church” as he said in his remarks during the official announcement of his appointment in April.

In previous Pastor Notes, I mentioned that all bishops have a coat of arms, also called a shield, as a visual representation of his life of service to the People of God. I am delighted to share the meaning of Bishop Koenig’s coat of arms, information for which was included in the program for his Ordination. The explanation of the shield will be in two installments: this week and next.

Part I:

As we look at the image of Bishop Koenig’s coat of arms below: the left half is the coat of arms of the Diocese of Wilmington; the right, that of Bishop Koenig. They are side by side to demonstrate Bishop Koenig’s personal and sacred commitment to serving our Diocese as our Shepherd.


The images included in his coat of arms have deep personal, priestly, and scriptural meaning. The wolf alludes to St. William the Abbot (1085-1142), our Bishop’s baptismal patron saint, who tamed a wolf to assist at labors around the monastery. The wolf watches over the lamb, as the Shepherd watches over the Diocese. Bishop Koenig first served as pastor at St. William Parish in Seaford, NY.

The lamb symbolizes St. Agnes, the patroness of the Bishop’s home Diocese of Rockville Center, NY. Agnes sounds like the Latin word for lamb, Agnus, hence the lamb on the shield.

Let us pray daily for Bishop Koenig and for our Diocese. May our Shepherd lead us closer to our Savior and Lord, the Lamb of God.

Also, a blessed day for all Grandparents and the “Young At Heart” as the Church celebrates the FIRST “World Day of Grandparents and Elderly.” As St. Joseph is in 5th Century art on, often depicted as a man of mature years, we recognize that this represents the wisdom God imbues him with in order to raise Christ as his own son. Through the intercession of St. Joseph and through the grandparents saints of Jesus, Saints Joachim and Anne, may our Lord bless you who are grandparents and of mature years abundantly for your wisdom and your gift of life to us. God love you! We do!



GUIDELINES FOR ADORATION UNDER COVID-19 CONDITIONS

Revised May 21, 2021

- The Adoration Chapel is open for Adoration as regularly scheduled - Monday, 4 am, through Saturday, 12 noon; and Sunday, 11 am to 9 pm.
- The chapel door is unlocked during the day from 7 am to 7 pm, and it is locked during the night from 7 pm to 7 am, at which time the lock code is required for entry.
- Assigned adorers should adore at their designated hours, subject to their discretion about any risk of Covid infection they feel they may incur in the chapel environment.
- Those fully-vaccinated - who have received both shots of a two-dose series at least two weeks ago - no longer need to wear a face mask in the chapel. No proof of vaccination is needed. Those not fully vaccinated are to wear a face mask in the chapel. Anyone who prefers to wear a mask may do so.
- Use of the hand sanitizer provided in the chapel is recommended.
- Adorers are recommended to keep socially distanced in the chapel, three feet apart.
- Before leaving the chapel if no one else is present, adorers must close the tabernacle door to repose the Blessed Sacrament, and upon arriving open the tabernacle door to expose the Blessed Sacrament if the door is closed.
- Missallettes, the library, sign-in, petition, and thank-you sheets will return.
- These guidelines remain in effect until further notice.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 25, 2021

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

St. Oscar Romero said, "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is the beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

There was a group of ladies many years ago who made quilts. They were beautiful creations reflecting inspirational designs artfully composed from the simple scraps of fabric each woman would bring to their individual pieces. There was no plan for the finished project as each finished work became the combined creation of what each woman contributed. They abounded in vibrant colors and dazzled the beholder with intricate patterns and their myriad textures. They were so beautiful that they became coveted family treasures passed from generation to generation. Those women never realized the power of their work. Countless babies rested in the comfort of those quilts warmly nestled in the legacy of tradition they were fortunate to inherit. They adorned countless homes with their beauty and brought joy and solace to many faces.

We cannot do everything. We are not meant to. Our work in life is to contribute our individual piece, a piece that reflects the unique thumbprint I claim as my own. We only have to do small things well. Then, as St. Oscar Romero reminds us, the Lord's grace will enter and do the rest. We have to trust that this is true just as those women trusted in the eventual beauty of their final work.

Eucharistic blessings are blessings that start small and multiply. We all come to life with only a few loaves of bread and a few fish. Not any single one of us has all that it takes to transform our world. Who knows what God will do with the little we have and how many will benefit from our kindness, compassion, wisdom, courage, conviction, love, warmth, zeal, faith, and hope? That young lad never dreamed that his few leftovers would do all that they did. God shows up in unexpected ways! Where would life's adventure and fun be if it were any other way? Being able to be part of bringing God's creative, transforming, healing to the world opens us up to wonder, awe, and excitement! We can all bring our little piece to the bigger work of God that can result in being a coveted jewel passed generation to generation. This is good news indeed!

Bread and wine transform into Christ's Body and Blood and we become what we eat. Trust that.




