

Confirmation: Is a 2-year preparation process. Call Christian Formation Office for details.

Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): Call the Christian Formation Office for information.

Marriage: At least one individual should be a parishioner who practices our faith. Please contact one of our Priests or Deacons to begin preparation which takes approximately 1 year.

Anointing of the Sick: Parishioners facing surgery or struggling with serious illness may request the sacrament by calling our Parish Office at 644-7300 .

From Our Pastor's Desk

Dear Fellow Saints-in-the-Making,
Greetings in Jesus Christ our Lord.

In five months, Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth will be the first British monarch to celebrate her Platinum Jubilee: 70 years of reigning on the throne. No British monarch has reigned longer.

But as the Head of the Church of England, she recognizes that another Queen far surpasses her both in length of reign and status, a Queen that the Orthodox Church and the Catholic Church recognize as well: Mary, the Queen of Heaven and earth.

Mary rightly holds this title, as her Son Jesus Christ is King of Heaven and earth.

"But, Father," I hear you asking, "isn't the Queen the spouse of the King, and not his mother?" That is true in the secular realm and in mythology. When it comes to our Christian faith and the Jewish roots of that faith, the relationship between a Queen and the King follows an entirely different understanding, and one that is scripturally-based.

While pagan kings have their wives as queen, the Israelites recognize the Queen as the mother of the King. For example, David's son Solomon succeeds him as King, and Solomon places his mother Bathsheba in a seat of honor to his right, which conveys that she holds the highest position of authority next to the King (1 Kings 2:19). She is Queen during Solomon's reign.

When Solomon dies, his sons Rehoboam and Jeroboam divide the Kingdom, with Jeroboam reigning over 10 tribes of the Kingdom of Israel and Rehoboam over 2 tribes of the Kingdom of Judah (1 Kings 12:21). Each time a successor King is named, immediately following, his mother is identified by name, but only for the King of Judah, (e.g., 1 Kings 14: 21). This is important, because it is from the Tribe of Judah that the Lion of Judah, that is, Jesus Christ, will come (Rev. 5:5). It is also important, because what happens for the other Kings happens for Jesus; for example, once Matthew mentions Jesus in his genealogy, he immediately names His Mother Mary (Matt 1:16).

Since Jesus is King, Mary His Mother, then, is Queen.

To honor our Sovereign Lord and King, let us honor His Mother this day by praying a family Rosary together: the Glorious Mysteries, the last of which is the Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Feast the Church usually celebrates on August 22, unless that date falls on a Sunday, as it does this year. All the same, we should still celebrate Mary our Queen through prayer, because the family that prays together stays together.

It is a privilege to pray the Mass with and for you, my parish family, every week and to pray for you every day. I do so, because I want my parish family to pray together and so to stay together, here and now, and forever after in Heaven.

May Mary Queen of Heaven and earth intercede for us and draw us closer to her Son, Jesus Christ the King of the Universe.

GUIDELINES FOR ADORATION UNDER COVID-19 CONDITIONS Revised May 21, 2021

- The Adoration Chapel is open for Adoration as regularly scheduled - Monday, 4 am, through Saturday, 12 noon; and Sunday, 11 am to 9 pm.
- The chapel door is unlocked during the day from 7 am to 7 pm, and it is locked during the night from 7 pm to 7 am, at which time the lock code is required for entry.
- Assigned adorers should adore at their designated hours, subject to their discretion about any risk of Covid infection they feel they may incur in the chapel environment.
- Those fully-vaccinated - who have received both shots of a two-dose series at least two weeks ago - no longer need to wear a face mask in the chapel. No proof of vaccination is needed. Those not fully vaccinated are to wear a face mask in the chapel. Anyone who prefers to wear a mask may do so.
- Use of the hand sanitizer provided in the chapel is recommended.
- Adorers are recommended to keep socially distanced in the chapel, three feet apart.
- Before leaving the chapel if no one else is present, adorers must close the tabernacle door to repose the Blessed Sacrament, and upon arriving open the tabernacle door to expose the Blessed Sacrament if the door is closed.
- Missalette, the library, sign-in, petition, and thank-you sheets will return.
- These guidelines remain in effect until further notice.

After the 8 a.m. daily Mass and continuing every Wednesday, all are invited to stay and pray the Rosary together.

GOSPEL MEDITATION
ENCOURAGE
DEEPER UNDERSTANDING
OF SCRIPTURE

August 22, 2021
21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Far be it from us to forsake the Lord for the service of other gods.” We struggle with our gods. They appear in the forms of things like money, power, prestige, popularity, privilege, and self-fulfillment. We like these “gods” because they make us feel good and ask very little of us in return. When we worship them, we worship ourselves. How can you go wrong with that? We buy into the illusion that if something can give us a comfortable life, free of want and need, then it is worth setting other things aside to pursue it. In essence, we sell our souls. Our struggle with “who is God” and to whom do we belong is a real one and one that can easily find us empty and experiencing disillusionment.

The devil tempted Jesus in the desert and promised him more. We are promised “more.” But in pursuing the “more” and the “satisfying” we lose track of the cost, and the cost is great. We sacrifice our very life in pursuit of something disguised as life. We sacrifice truth for something that only “feels” true. While the true and real God certainly promises us many things, many things are also required. It is not about the warm and secure feelings and self-absorption the world wants to provide, but of giving back. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God’s Kingdom (not our own), love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, that we must die to ourselves in order to find ourselves, and trust that Jesus truly gives us His Flesh and Blood to eat and drink. These are hard things to accept and even harder to put into practice. It is no wonder that many who may be attracted to Jesus at first walk away in pursuit of the “more self-satisfying” gods.

But truth is truth. If we cannot accept it from the lips of Jesus Christ, then where else will we find it? To whom can we go? There is only one source of truth and life: Jesus Christ. Jesus has the words of eternal life and if we do not go to Him, then where else will we find this gift? But we must be faithful and buy into the whole package deal that requires sacrifice and fidelity. When we do, we find ourselves, through the Body and Blood of Christ, connected to the Source of all life and then intimately bound with our brothers and sisters. We all have to decide whether we want to stay or go and if we can accept what Jesus has to say. It’s a choice we all have to make.



In 1897, Theresese Martin, a 24-year-old Carmelite cloistered nun in Lisieux, France, passed away from tuberculosis. This obscure young woman would be canonized a saint shortly thereafter, in 1925, and has become one of the most well-known and beloved of saints. Her doctrine of "the little way of trust and love" was explained in *The Story of a Soul*, and led to her being proclaimed in 1997 one of only four women Doctors of the Church.




