

Marriage: At least one individual should be a parishioner who practices our faith. Please contact one of our Priests or Deacons to begin preparation which takes approximately 1 year.

From Our Pastor's Desk

HS JMJ

My Dear Fellow Saints-in-the-Making,

Greetings with joy in Christ Jesus the Eternal High Priest!

As parishes throughout the United States celebrate Priesthood Sunday this weekend, I am reminded of a Rector's conference I once attended at St. Mary's Seminary in Roland Park. (The Rector of a seminary functions in many ways like a Pastor of a parish).

The Rector's name is Fr. Hurst, and he posed this question to us seminarians: "Gentlemen, what are your devotions?"

He gave us a few moments to consider, and then he said words I shall never forget: "Men, devotion to Eucharistic Adoration is a beautiful practice. So is the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. So is reading Sacred Scripture daily and practicing lectio divina. All of these will help you become a holier person, yes. But gentlemen, if your primary devotion is not the People of God entrusted to your pastoral care in your parish, you have no business being a Priest."

I can still hear the awed silence in the room after he said this, and I credit Fr. Hurst for revealing to me what my primary focus must be as a parish Priest: you!

Through the Grace of the Holy Spirit, you are the reason I am joyful to serve at St. Jude and to endeavor with (I hope) a continually-growing Priestly heart to serve, like Jesus Christ does, and minister to the People of God of St. Jude the Apostle Church. I know Fr. Jones feels the same way.

May I ask a favor of you, please, on this Priesthood Sunday? Would you kindly pray the following prayer as a family or by yourself today at some point? You are welcome to pray it at any other time as well, but especially today, please, on Priesthood Sunday. It was composed and prayed daily by one of my closest and dearest friends in Heaven, whose Feast Day is coming up this Friday, October 1: St. Therese of the Child Jesus, also known as The Little Flower.

I'd be eternally grateful.

St. Therese of Lisieux's Prayer for Priests: O Jesus, Eternal Priest, keep Your Priests within the shelter of Your Sacred Heart, where none may touch them. Keep unstained their anointed hands, which daily touch Your Sacred Body. Keep unsullied their lips, daily purpled with your Precious Blood. Keep pure and unearthly their hearts, sealed with the sublime mark of the Priesthood. Let Your holy love surround them and shield them from the world's contagion. Bless their labors with abundant fruit and may the souls to whom they minister be their joy and consolation here and in Heaven their beautiful and everlasting crown

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 26, 2021 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Who are the little ones? They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. They are the ones in the womb who want to be born. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealously, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid.

In 1897, Therese Martin, a 24-year-old Carmelite cloistered nun in Lisieux, France, passed away from tuberculosis. This obscure young woman would be canonized a saint shortly thereafter, in

1925, and has become one of the most well-known and beloved of saints. Her doctrine of "the little way of trust and love" was explained in *The Story of a Soul*, and led to her being proclaimed in 1997 one of only four women Doctors of the Church.

CHURCH RENOVATIONS ARE COMING

As mentioned in last week's bulletin, we have had a significant deterioration of our church pews. They were installed some 60 years ago when the church was built and have been in need of attention long before COVID, which has hastened the need for action. Instead of reconditioning the pews, it is more cost effective and fiscally responsible to replace the pews outright which also minimizes installment from months to only 3 weeks – October 24 thru November 19, 2021.

With the new pews we will be replacing the flooring with luxury vinyl tile in the pew areas and carpet in the aisles plus front and rear of the main sanctuary (same as we currently have). The entire project will cost the parish about \$190,000, which is a significant sum.

The Finance Council put on their thinking caps to determine how to pay for this. The Maintenance Fund has been an important part of parish finances. As you may recall, just this past year we needed to replace the heating system in the church and we used Maintenance monies for this \$100,000 replacement. We remain in a good position due to the generosity of our parishioners and will not need a special funding request as the pew project will come from the Maintenance Fund. Please keep in mind that the Maintenance Fund comes from the second collection on the first weekend of each month. Please help us with this important collection.

In the coming weeks, we will have a sample pew and flooring materials available for your view in the vestibule of the church. This will give you a good idea of what to expect. We are excited for the coming new look and comfort of our church and want to extend our thanks to each of you for your support. We have a wonderful, caring parish family.

Ministry of Social Concern

Dear Parishioners.

The Ministry of Social Concerns (MOSC), as part of their mission to educate you on matters of faith, would like to share some information on Catholic Social Teaching, gleaned from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Conference, from a book "Go and Do Likewise – Catholic Social Teaching in Action"* by Mia Crosthwaite. We, Committee Members, hope this will inspire you to start consciously living out social justice, as Jesus commands.

The 1998 U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops document "Sharing Catholic Social Teaching: challenges and directions" offers seven key themes as a framework for discussing Catholic social teaching: The First is:

* "Life and Dignity of the Human Person Contrary to what most people think, this does not simply imply just the rights of the unborn, but instead: "every human person . . the elderly, the poor, the condemned, the unborn, the young, the minority, the discouraged, as well as the rich, the powerful, and the strong."*

Daily Exercises:

- Smile at people who are a different race or ethnicity than you or those you usually don't smile to.
- Treat the elderly with respect . . . assuming they can make decisions for themselves until proven otherwise.
- Pay better attention to people you ordinarily "dismiss."
- Teach your children and grandchildren to love
- Reflect on the gift of your own life or the value and dignity of someone we despise.

Actions:

- Donate or volunteer at the Food Bank.
- Write letters to legislators on current topics of faith (abortion, immigration laws, death penalty, assisted suicide, etc.
- Join the Right to Life Organization and/or the March for Life.
- Donate to a Pregnancy Center.
- E-mail your diocesan prison ministry and ask how you can become a pen pal to someone on death row.


