





Dear Fellow Saints-in-the-Making,

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

We celebrate the Nativity of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ with family gatherings, surrounded by those we love, by those God has given to us as family.

Today, within the Octave of Christmas (the eight days that stretch from Christmas Day to January 1, the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, making this liturgically an eight-day-long Christmas Day), we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, the Family into whom the Christ is born and in whom the Christ Child is raised. That God has chosen to become Flesh and to be one like us in a family means that He hallows and sanctifies family life. There is no part of our human existence, except sin, that our Savior has not Himself experienced, and therefore, there is no part of our human existence that our Lord has not redeemed.

We are all called to be a holy family, and so we should increase our devotion to Jesus, Mary and Joseph. As a family, gather around the Nativity Set and pray that your family might be a holy family. Once the Christmas Season is over (which by the way isn't until January 9!), keep the figurines of Jesus, Mary and Joseph set up in some prominent place in your home throughout the year. Gather together there after dinner, whether your children are still at home or not, and pray to be a holy family.

After all, we gather together as a family here and now and so anticipate gathering together as a family forever after in Heaven.

I am grateful to God for the gift of my family, and I am grateful to God for the gift of you, my Parish family. I pray daily that my family, both of my birth and of my Parish, may be holy, because I want nothing less than Heaven for us all!

May you know the great joy of the Christ Child and become the holy family God calls you to be.

### GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 26, 2021  
 The Holy Family of Jesus,  
 Mary, and Joseph

Families can be very difficult things to negotiate. This is true not only of our families of origin, the current family of which we are a part, the family of our Church, our society, and our global family as well. Everything human can be found in family stories. Those stories speak of wonderful life-giving successes as well as painful spirit-robbing abuses. Our greatest joys and our greatest wounds are usually connected with the experience of family. Our needs, experiences, and unresolved baggage often color what we bring to our familiar relationships. They contribute to our level of defensiveness, how guarded and protected we become, and what prejudices we believe.

In order to break the cycle of dysfunction we have to remember that it is not only by human effort that we negotiate the difficult and challenging events of our lives. There is a Divine Effort that work as well. For sure, the human effort can create quite a mess and easily destroy lives. This is true of any family with which we are associated. Today's Feast of the Holy Family serves to help us understand that there is a Divine Story being told as well. It is a story of perseverance in the face of hardship, determination in the face of despair, healing when we see nothing but wounds, and light where there is darkness.

Do we believe that God is always working, guiding, restoring, and leading? Unless we do, we will never be free from the imperfections and wounds that bind us and never be able to understand what it really means to forgive. Pope Francis tells us that the "light which comes from the Holy Family encourages us to offer human warmth to other families." While this is most certainly true, we can only really begin to do this when we realize that we are still works in progress, not anchored to the wounds and sins of our past, and still a leading star in God's continually unfolding story of love. The Holy Family persevered and radiated warmth because they knew they were not alone. We can too.

In 1897, Therese Martin, a 24-year-old Carmelite cloistered nun in Lisieux, France, passed away from tuberculosis. This obscure young woman would be canonized a saint shortly thereafter, in 1925, and has become one of the most well-known and beloved of saints. Her doctrine of “the little way of trust and love” was explained in *The Story of a Soul*, and led to her being proclaimed in 1997 one of only four women Doctors of the Church.



**January – February 2022**








