

Baptism (of Infants): Contact our Parish office for information about the Baptism Class and to schedule a Baptism.

Reconciliation: Every First Friday 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the Christian Formation Building Saturday 8:45 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. in the Christian Formation Building or longer as needed Reconciliation is also available by appointment at any time

<u>Confirmation</u>: Is a 2-year preparation process. Call Christian Formation Office for details.

<u>Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)</u>. Call the Christian Formation Office for information.

<u>Marriage</u>: At least one individual should be a parishioner who practices our faith. Please contact one of our Priests or Deacons to begin preparation which takes approximately 1 year.

Anointing of the Sick: Parishioners facing surgery or struggling with serious illness may request the sacrament by calling our Parish Office at 644-7300.

Greetings in Christ Jesus, the Beloved Son in Whom God is well pleased!

As we observe the liturgical celebration of the Baptism of the Lord this Sunday (and the official end of the Christmas Season), we are reminded of our baptismal calling to live and preach the Good News of Jesus Christ and to keep our white baptismal garment (i.e., our soul) free from the stain of sin. But there are also grace-filled effects that happen to us because of the Sacrament of Baptism.

1. Purification—Baptism cleanses us from all our sins: original and personal sins. Once baptized, the Sacrament of Reconciliation cleanses us from our sins.

2. Filiation—we become adopted daughters and sons of God the Father

3. Incorporation—we become members of the Body of Christ

4. In-dwelling—we become temples of the Holy Spirit, that is, God lives within us. All the more reason to keep ourselves free of the stain of sin.

5. Accountability—we are expected to be responsible for living our baptismal call of service to God and to others (the two great Laws Jesus gives)

6. Permanence—once baptized, always baptized. Never to be repeated and can never be "reversed," or "undone."

7. Indelible—Baptism confers a character on our soul—an ontological change, that is, transforming us at the very level of our soul. Our soul is different after Baptism, noticeably so to God. How well we live our baptismal call to serve makes our living the Sacrament of Baptism visible to others.

On this last point, I'd like to recognize two members of our parish who have notably lived out this noble call to serve our parishioners for a significant length of time: Lois Runco and Carl LoRicco.

Lois has been the chairperson for the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs) for quite some time and coordinates visiting the sick, the homebound, those in nursing homes, and the hospitalized. Her organizational skills and zeal for the Eucharist have been strong assets in this ministry and in guiding the other EMHCs to serve. After a long ministry of service, Lois is stepping down as chairperson, but you will still find her outside after the 10:30am Mass handing out religious items and sacramentals to our youth and doing so with her characteristic smile. Thank you, Lois, for your service to our parish. God bless and keep you.

Carl has served as an Usher at St. Jude for two decades, assisting parishioners and visitors to their pews, coordinating Gift Bearers, and keeping the church clean and tidy. His work ethic and devotion as well as his patient disposition have been very fine qualities in this ministry, as has been his stamina to be able to stand for most of the Mass, sacrificing his comfort so that he might be able to assist someone in need at a moment's notice. Carl is retiring from ushering, and his wife Helen, I am sure, is very grateful that she and Carl will at last be able to sit together at Mass the whole time. Thank you, Carl, for your service to our parish. God bless and keep you.

For those who are living out your baptismal call by serving in a ministry at St. Jude: THANK YOU! For those who would like to serve in some ministry, regardless of age, please contact our offices, and we will be pleased to assist you in your desire to serve our parishioners. Living out our baptismal call is our privilege as well as our responsibility, whereby we become living witnesses to the Catholic Faith and so make our parish church all the more dynamic, vibrant and inviting.



January 9, 2022 The Baptism of the Lord

"We are called to live our Baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for Creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts Baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ Himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our Baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what Baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the One Who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.


