THE SUNDAY CONNECTION LIVING THE GOSPEL IN OUR DAILY LIVES

There are many stones in our paths that keep us from truly living and being free. Some of these boulders have been there for a very long time. They have been there so long that they have even settled into the soil of our lives with other weeds, vines, and compacted soil keeping them firmly in place. We find them hard to move and trying to do so can be exhausting. What are these suffocating albatrosses that keep us so tethered and immobile? They are many things.

They are past childhood wounds and hurts that stem from disappointment, rejection, or abuse. People may have told us we were unwanted, that the world is frightening, that there are only some acceptable feelings you can have and others you cannot. We may have tried to love someone or struggled to figure out how and were met with rejection. Maybe we trusted someone completely and were betrayed. We come to life collecting barnacles that begin to attach to other barnacles and before you know it, we have a mass of solid matter blocking our vision and keeping us from moving. We live in fear. We are afraid of losing what we have, afraid that the future will be empty, afraid that we won't succeed



and even more afraid that we will not be loved. There is so much fear. Didn't Jesus tell us not to worry and to not be afraid? Either we believe in the message of Easter, or we don't!

Go confidently into the night. Walking with God you will find the light and strength you need. Often without even knowing, God will move those boulders and stumbling blocks that bind us and, with putting one foot in front of the other and looking forward, we will move. The resurrection of Christ is really all about receiving the gifts of trust and faith and doing new things. The rocks that bind us keep us spinning the same wheels and doing the same things. When was the last time you threw caution to the wind and actually did something totally out of character and different? This is where we find God, in the spontaneous, the adventurous, the fun, and the creative choices we make! God is not boring and stuck. God is exciting and engaging. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Find a way to trust that this is true and live.

PASCHAL CANDLE DONATION


Our Paschal Candle at Our Lady of the Snows Church has been donated in loving memory of Robert Francis Barnack.

NEXT SUNDAY... DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



The world was in the midst of the Great Depression in 1931 and the memories of WWI were still very much alive in the minds of Europeans when, in Poland, a sister of the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, Faustina Kowalska, is said to have been personally visited by Jesus.

According to her diary, an image was revealed to her of the Risen Lord from whose heart shone two rays, one red (representing blood) and the other "pale" (symbolizing water), with the words at the bottom: "Jesus, I trust in you." Sister Faustina wrote in her diary that Jesus told her: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish."

When she was canonized in 2000 at the direction of fellow countryman, Saint Pope John Paul II, he proclaimed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, thereby widely promoting the devotional practices associated with Saint Faustina's visions, already popular in parishes.

Please join us next Sunday, April 24th, at 3pm for our Divine Mercy Liturgy at Our Lady of the Snows Church as we together commemorate Divine Mercy Sunday.

A NURTURING COMMUNITY

LECTORS: All men, women, and high school students are invited to proclaim the Scriptures at all Masses.


ALTAR SERVING: All boys and girls of the parish who have completed the third grade are invited to serve as acolytes for weekend liturgies and special liturgical celebrations.

HOSPITALITY TEAM:

These ministers help create a culture and spirit of hospitality, while also ensuring the liturgy flows smoothly.

MUSIC MINISTRY:

We welcome singers and a variety of instrumentalists to lead us in singing God's praises at worship.



SACRAMENTAL LIFE AT OLS

BAPTISM: First time parents are asked to attend a pre-Baptismal class, available by appointment at the Parish Center.

EUCHARIST: This joyful celebration takes place each year as young girls and boys are welcomed into the full community of faith at our Parish.

CONFIRMATION: A yearly journey of all 8th graders who have been enrolled in our Religious Education program for at least 2 years, or attend Cathlic School.

MARRIAGE: Contact the Parish Center at least 6 months in advance of your desired wedding date so preparations can be made for your celebration.

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK: If a member of your family has become sick or hospitalized, please contact us.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Any parishioner who is homebound and would like to regularly receive the Eucharist may contact the Parish Center to schedule a visit.

FUNERALS: Please notify the Parish Center at the time of your loved one's death so that we may assist in the planning of the funeral.

FOSTERING FAITH IN OUR YOUTH

YOUTH GROUP: This organization seeks to energize the youth of *Our Lady of the Snows Parish* in strengthening a relationship with Jesus Christ. In addition to regular activities throughout the year, our Youth Group Committee plans to offer a variety of summer experiences.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: "Growing the Seeds of Faith" is the primary goal of our K-8 program, which includes sacramental preparation, cluster groups led by dedicated Catechists, and weekend classes at OLP School. VBS: This fun and active way for children ages 4 - 9 to learn about God's love is offered in a week-long summer session.

DO YOU WANT TO LEARN ABOUT MENTAL ILLNESS AND SUPPORT FROM THE CHURCH?

You are Invited to Attend a Five Part Education Series for Families on Mental Health.

The Scranton Mental Health Ministry at the Cathedral of Saint Peter is presenting this five-part series for families on mental health and mental illness to reduce stigma and discrimination through education and factual information about mental health conditions. The series reinforces the core Christian belief that everyone has dignity and value and should be fully welcomed into the Church and the community.

TUESDAY APRIL 19

The Impact of Mental Illness on Individuals and Families

A discussion on what it is like to live with a mental illness and how it can impact a family. The discussion will be led by Jeri McNulty and Amy Morgan who are with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) "In Our Own Voice" program. They will provide a personal perspective on living with mental health conditions. Their presentation will change attitudes, assumptions, and ideas about people with mental health conditions.

Spirituality and Mental Illness

Faith and spirituality bring peace and healing to people living with mental health challenges and illnesses. We can find spiritual support through communion with the Saints and with each other while living with mental health challenges and illnesses.
