

WELCOME

It is the mission of the Church of St. Anselm to live the Gospel by forming a Catholic community to foster personal and spiritual growth, and justice and peace in the community at large. This shall be accomplished by preaching the word, celebrating the sacraments, serving the parish and the community and by celebrating our community spirit.

BAPTISM

Baptism is a sacrament by which the Christian community welcomes new members. At St. Anselm Church, we emphasize sacramental preparation consisting of a four part Parish Baptism Process which the infant is always present. Each session, Welcoming, Gathering, Celebrating, and Reflecting, focus on the relationship a child enjoys as a person blessed by God. Sponsors for Baptism should be practicing Catholics, at least 16 years old, who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. To schedule Baptism, please call the church office, at least one month in advance. There are no Baptisms during Lent.

PENANCE

The sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation is offered every Saturday 5:00 - 5:30pm or by appointment.

MARRIAGE

Preparation for Christian Marriage begins at least one year prior to the planned date for a wedding. The Common Policy of Church in New Jersey is followed in our parish. Marriage Preparation includes Engaged Encounter or Pre-Cana.

VISITATION OF THE SICK

Please contact the Parish Office concerning hospitalized and homebound parishioners wishing to receive sacraments or parish visits.


PLEDGE


