We pray that we might be a source of compassion toward the poor, justice for the oppressed, peace for the troubled, healing for the wounded, and wisdom for the searching.



Second Reading: 2 Peter 3:8-14

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day. The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard “delay,” but he is patient with you, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. Dear Brothers and Sisters,

By now, you probably are aware of our Christmas Mass schedule. Like everything else, our schedule has been adjusted this Christmas due to the pandemic. Unless things change between now and then, I am happy to share a “first” for Jesus the Good Shepherd – our first **OUTDOOR CHRISTMAS EVE MASS!!!**



We have permission from the Archdiocese to have the Mass at 3 p.m. – beginning in the *daylight*, which will mean the Mass will end by *daylight* and you can return to the comfort of your homes by dinner time – still in the *daylight*. If the weather is chilly, that will add to the “Christmas feeling” – so come anyway!!! Following Mass, for those who wish to stay, there will be socially-distanced “caroling” near a bonfire, with hot liquid refreshments along with a visit from St. Nick!

If you are not inclined to the 3 p.m. Christmas Eve Outdoor Mass, kindly consider one of the remaining three Christmas Masses – all in the church.

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we hear of the great prophet, John the Baptist. By any stretch of the imagination, John was “different!” His origins in the desert, his unusual diet [grasshoppers and honey] and his clothing [sackcloth] belie his message of repentance.

But John is the one who proclaims the coming of the long-awaited Messiah, the Son of God, Jesus Christ. We should allow ourselves to be caught up in the excitement of John’s announcement as we move toward Christmas! As John is excited, so should we be.

By focusing on the astonishing news of the Baptist, we can then open our hearts and minds to the even more amazing news of the birth of our savior, Emmanuel – “God-with-us.”





What is the Advent Jesse Tree? "The Jesse tree helps us connect the custom of decorating Christmas trees to the events leading to Jesus' birth. The Jesse tree is named from Isaiah 11:1:
"A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots."

Jesse was the father of King David. We adorn a Jesse tree with illustrated ornaments that represent the people, prophecies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The ornaments of the Jesse tree tell the story of God in the Old Testament, connecting the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across four thousand years of history."

ADVENT WREATH PRAYER FOR HOME—Saturday evening before each Sunday of Advent, gather the household around the wreath. Point out that the wreath is circular, with no beginning or end, like God's love. Explain there are four candles, one for each Sunday of Advent. The third candle is rose because on their third Sunday we celebrate the joy of waiting for Christmas. Before you begin, find the reading John 1:1-5 in your bible, and choose a reader. You can begin with a simple advent song "O Come O Come Emmanuel" or "Soon and Very Soon." Have an older child or adult read the leader parts. You can continue this prayer service each Sunday.

Leader: Since ancient times, people have marked the passage of time with the light of the sun. In this holy season of Advent, we observe the passage of time through the light of this wreath, for each candle represents another week closer to the radiance of the newborn Son Jesus. Our anticipation for his glorious arrival can teach us much about patience as well as sharing the flame of our faith. So let us begin our time of prayer with the sign of the cross.

All: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy-Spirit. Amen.

(Light the candle(s). Then stand and sing an Alleluia.)

Reader: A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. John 1:1-5. (read Gospel passage.)
The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you Lord, Jesus Christ. (All sit and observe silence.)

Leader: God Our Creator, Bless us as we gather around this Advent wreath, Ever anxious for the arrival of your Son, Jesus. Renew us with your patience and The light of your promise. Help us to prepare our hearts so that we are open to your coming into our lives. We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen. (All make the sign of the cross).

COVID-19 UPDATE

Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.



Even though our max capacity is 500, given the shape of the venue, and the pews, we could not safely increase our capacity beyond 125 while keeping 6-ft distances.

With the current pandemic restrictions changing due to COVID numbers going up, please know that we are maintaining this 25% capacity of 125 for each mass, with overflow in the Centre set at 75.

If current conditions concern you, please remember that you can participate in Mass by listening on your car radio at both 8:00am and 10:45am Masses and receive Holy Communion outside.


