


Authentic Femininity... For Such a Time as this (Esther 4:14)

Hey, Father!

This program is tremendously important to all parishioners as we share the faith which we love and

Our public school system does a good job of teaching our children the things they will need to know to master our world. Knowledge of science, math, history, geography etc. is so very important for any child to grow and become a productive member of society. But our public school education lacks one thing. It is not allowed, not equipped and not qualified to provide our children with a religious education. This important part of everyone's life focuses upon coming to know and love the true God who created all things and put them in the order in which science finds them. They can't mention that it is God who so masterfully arranged our world in a completely calculable way which we can learn by studying mathematics. It was God who formed our planet and made the oceans, rivers and mountains which they get to know about in Geography. Our past comes alive for our students in the study of history and the social sciences a part in which God has played His part. To leave out the study of God as the source of all things and all knowledge is to leave out a very crucial part of a child's education and development. Our Religious Education program seeks to fill the void. What the public schools won't and can't teach your children, we will!! To master the world through education is a great thing but even greater than this is to come also to know, love and serve the Lord in this world and to be happy with Him forever in the next. ~ "A word from the Word" ~

26th Sunday of Ordinary Time Cycle B MK 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Today's word from the Word is "Gehenna." It is capitalized because it is the formal name of a place. According to Wikipedia, "Gehenna is a small valley in Jerusalem. In the Hebrew Bible, Gehenna was initially where some of the kings of Judah sacrificed their children by fire. Thereafter, it was deemed to be cursed (Jer. 7:31, 19:2-6). In rabbinic literature and Christian and Islamic Scripture, Gehenna is a destination of the wicked. This is different from the more neutral Sheol/Hades, the abode of the dead, or Hell. In the King James Version of the Bible, the term appears 13 times in 11 different verses as Valley of Hinnom, Valley of the son of Hinnom or Valley of the children of Hinnom. The Valley of Hinnom is the modern name for the valley surrounding Jerusalem's Old City, including Mount Zion, from the west and south. It meets and merges with the Kidron Valley, the other principal valley around the Old City, near the south-eastern corner of the city." Suffice it to say, it was not a nice place to be. In the sense of the word referring to hell, "Gehenna" is not a formal name for hell itself. It can refer to any place of extreme torment or suffering. In His warning against sinfulness, Jesus describes the place of "Gehenna" as a place "where their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched." It is said that "Gehenna" referred to a smoldering garbage dump outside the city of Jerusalem. The garbage would get infested with maggots and would perpetually self-combust. This would explain what Jesus meant when he referred to "Gehenna" as the unpleasant place of worms and fire. This would be no place to live and, as such, would not be a place of life. Jesus says that sinners can "enter life" rather than a place of death if they cut themselves off from what is causing them to sin. We can conclude from all this that "Gehenna" is certainly not a pleasant place. Jesus speaks, then, of the whole concept of divine retribution and punishment. The punishment fits the crime, or in this case, the punishment fits the sin. Cutting off one's hand or plucking out one's eye in order to avoid falling into sin or leading others to sin would be far more pleasant than being cast into "Gehenna." This passage and pronouncement of Jesus is also a dire warning to anyone who would harm a child or lead a child to sin. In light of the clergy sex abuse scandal one would wonder if guilty clergy offenders, such men should tremble as they read this passage. It is a personal warning to them. This passage also reminds us that we cannot ignore any of what Jesus said or scoff at the notion of the eternal fires of hell. Hell is a real place about which Jesus spoke often. He is giving a serious and stern warning to all. Whatever leads us to sin, we need to literally cut it out.


