




Authentic Femininity... For Such a Time as this (Esther 4:14)

Hey, Father!

"Why doesn't the Catholic Church come into the 21st century and change its teaching on certain moral issues?"



I'm not sure which "moral issues" you are talking about. I do know that there are several of them that are getting much attention lately. These issues include: Abortion, Euthanasia, Embryonic Stem Cell Research, Human Cloning and Same Sex Marriage. The Church's stand and teaching about these issues can never be changed as they are based on immutable truths that have come to be revealed to us by God. We read in sacred Scripture: "My ways are not your ways says the Lord". So there are certain truths which cannot be altered by our desiring them to be altered. We cannot "toy" with them and try to conform them to our way of thinking; whether for our own convenience, personal gain or the outright defiance of God. Rather than trying to shake the Church free of its solid rock foundation in order to catapult it into alignment with erroneous present day popular thought, perhaps the world needs to come back to the past to once again listen to and be guided by the wisdom of the Church which it has always possessed and tried to pass on to her people. It holds fast to the truth and proclaims it in the interest of enlightening souls; thus saving them from wrongful thinking which leads to sin. I'm afraid we are becoming blinded to the truth. We don't want to hear it. It has somehow become inconvenient. This is why so many find the Church to be "too much" for them and they walk away from it. All Catholics need to be who they say they are: followers of Christ in the tradition of the Roman Catholic Church. As followers of Christ, He and His Church demand total consent from all those who call themselves "Catholic"to conform their hearts, minds and souls to the truth as it is held and taught by the Church. One cannot consider themselves to be Catholic if they hold any position contrary to that which the Church teaches on the above mentioned moral issues. We need to stop watering down, compromising or tampering with Church teaching. If a person does not agree with what the Church teaches and holds a view contrary to that teaching, they should not consider themselves to be Catholic. Indeed, by the very fact that they hold views contrary to that of the Church they have already cut themselves off from the Church. Truth is the truth, always and everywhere, unable to be changed. The Church is the Church, always and everywhere, unable to be changed. We must love it or leave it. There can be no "lukewarm" (see Revelation 3:16) Catholics. Fr. Green

~ "A word from the Word" ~

27th Sunday of Ordinary Time Cycle B MK 10:2-16

Today's word from the Word is "let." As often is the case, the smallest of words can have the greatest of meanings. This three-letter word has much power behind it. As the word is used within this gospel passage, it is in the imperative case. The imperative of any verb becomes a command; telling someone to do something. Jesus used this tense with many verbs when He was telling someone to do something. For instance: at the Last supper Jesus commanded to the Apostles (and us) to take, eat, drink, do this in My memory. These are all commands for us to partake in the Eucharist. When we couple these commands with the Old Testament command to keep holy the Sabbath, then we know it is imperative that we come to Mass. What is Jesus commanding in this case? He is addressing those who were keeping the children from coming to Him. He wanted them to come to Him to be able to embrace and bless them. So, He ordered "let" the children come to Me. He strengthens this command by also commanding "do not prevent them." It is no surprise that this passage (Mark 10:13-16) is the gospel passage used in the Baptism ceremony. It is a command intended especially for Catholic Christian parents. Parents obey Jesus' command by presenting their children for Baptism. It is up to the parents to bring their children to know, love and serve God all their lives. So, the command to "let" the children come to Me extends far beyond just having the children baptized and getting their relationships with God started. The fact that "let" is such a strong imperative and command shows the seriousness of responsibility Jesus places on parents to do their duty to continue to bring their children to God. So many ignore the command and some have even taken up the notion that they should "let" their children choose and decide what religion they will embrace when they are This is irresponsible, dangerous and fool hearty. No parent should "let" their children choose if they want a relationship with God or not. It would be just as ridiculous for parents to "let" their children decide if and what they eat or don't eat; to take a bath or change their diaper or not; to go to bed at a decent hour or not. If we "let" children choose everything for themselves, their development will be compromised and their physical lives will become endangered. It is the same with their relationship with God. Children will never develop their faith life if parents don't bring them to Mass every week. If it is not important to a parent, it won't be important to a child. Here is where Jesus' command to "let" is fortified by the other command; "do not prevent them." Parents, how are you doing in fulfilling the Lord's commands by "letting" your children come to Him?


