



FROM FR. JASON



Dear Brothers and Sisters:

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says to Simon Peter, "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." Jesus promised that even hell will not prevail against his Church. In every century, hell sure as hell has tried. The Catholic Church has always been public enemy number one to all evil tyrants and all atheist revolutions. Many times, it seemed that the Church was dying, but she always resurrected. If the world lasts for another ten thousand years, or even more, we can be sure of only two things that will last with it. That would be the people Israel and the Catholic Church. God made two solemn covenant promises to them, and God never revokes His promises.

Let's look at the other part of what Jesus says to Simon Peter. It is almost a joke that Jesus calls Simon 'Peter,' or 'rock.' In the four Gospels, Peter looks like anything but a solid and reliable rock. Peter constantly says and does the wrong thing. He fails to fulfill the request of Jesus in the Garden of Geth-semane right before His arrest. Jesus finds him asleep with James and John. At Jesus' trial, he would deny he ever knew Jesus three times. After Jesus' death, Peter is completely overwhelmed by his sin and the discovery of his own weakness and quits. He goes back to the only work he feels he can do, fishing. If Jesus had called him 'Sandy' instead of 'Rocky,' perhaps the other disciples would not have been surprised.

Did Jesus make a mistake with Simon Peter? No way. Jesus does not make mistakes. All of Peter's mistakes and failures were part of his training. His failures humbled him; the mistakes made him little. The history God did with Peter made it impossible for him to later steal God's glory after Pentecost. Peter *became* a rock after Pentecost when the Holy Spirit took control of his life.

The change is undeniable if we contrast Peter in the Acts of the Apostles with Peter in the Gospels. In Acts 2:14, we read, "Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed to them, "You who are Jews, indeed all of you staying in Jerusalem. Let this be known to you, and listen to my words." No longer denying Jesus in front of others nor overwhelmed by his own weakness, he risks everything to evangelize. Jesus' words in this Sunday's Gospel about Peter being the rock are not a present observation but a future *prophecy*. Jesus knew who Peter was of himself, but He also knew what Peter would become with His help.

Today, Jesus asks us the same question he asked Peter, "But who do you say that I am?" God is doing a History of Salvation with each of us. Are we aware of it? Could it be that God has to show us we are no better than Peter? Is it possible that, like Peter, it is necessary we be emptied of ourselves so that we can be filled with Him? No doubt. I know one thing, I never planned to become a priest. I had other plans for sure. But as I tried to find the answer to the question Christ asks us today, I discovered that His plans were way better. And with His help, we can all become "Rocky."

FAITH FORMATION

We offer three programs:

Faith Formation (1st-6th grade)

Meets on Wednesdays after school from 3:45 pm-5:00 pm. Classes begin and end in the Church and are taught by volunteer catechists. Discounts will be given to those families who volunteer a parent as a catechist for the Faith Formation year.

Youth JAM (Youth Jesus and Mary, 7th and 8th grades)

Meets on the third Sunday of the month from 4:30 pm-7:00 pm, September thru May.

Parents will be REQUIRED to volunteer to help during those sessions AT LEAST one of the Sundays of the year. We need at least two parents every Sunday session.

Every family will have a meeting with Fr. Jason in September. Sign-ups to volunteer for specific days will be done at the meeting with Fr. Jason and will be on a first-come-first-served basis.

Confirmation (9th grade)

Meets on the Third Sunday of the month for an hour after the 10:30 AM Mass (11:30 AM-12:30 PM) September thru May.

Parents will be REQUIRED to volunteer to help during those sessions AT LEAST one of the Sundays of the year. We need at least two parents every Sunday session.

Every family will have a meeting with Fr. Jason in September. Sign-ups to volunteer for specific days will be done at the meeting with Fr. Jason and will be on a first-come-first-served basis. Payment will be collected at the time of registration. Fees are as follows: for 1 child \$215, two children \$240 and three or more children \$265; a \$50 Sacramental Fee will be added to students in second and ninth grades.

The Passion of Saint John the Baptist

"I tell you among those born of women, no one is greater than John," Jesus told the crowds (Luke 7:28). John the Baptist, the forerunner, came to prepare the way of

the Lord, and he did that from the first moments of his life. In his mother's womb, he leapt for joy at the nearness of the Lord.

He preached repentance to the people, preparing them for the coming of the Kingdom, and baptizing them with water so that they might be prepared to receive baptism "with the Holy Spirit and with fire". Even in his death, John prepared the way for the Lord.

He boldly told Herod that he was violating the law in taking his brother's widow as his wife, and Herod had him arrested and imprisoned and then executed. Even in his martyrdom, he prepared the way of the Lord, pointing to the way of the cross.



Memorial of Saint Augustine

Bishop and Doctor of the Church
Saint Augustine of Hippo (354430) is one of the four great Latin
Fathers of the Church. Augustine
was born in North Africa in present-day Algeria. His mother was
Saint Monica and his father, Patricius, a pagan. Augustine showed
early promise as a scholar, but he

disappointed his mother by espousing Manicheism (gnostic religion) and leading a hedonistic life (a life devoted solely to pleasure), even living with a mistress with whom he had a child. Eventually, due to Monica's prayers, he decided to become a Cristian and was baptized by Saint Ambrose in Milan. He became a priest, and later, the Bishop of Hippo. Augustine was a prolific writer and is credited with writing one of the first autobiographies, his *Confessions*. His books, homilies and letters are a rich source of theological insight still mined today by students of every Christian denomination or ecclesial community.

Who Do You Say That I Am?

I once knew a very devout woman whose adult godchild had fallen away from the practice of the faith. This godchild still believed in God, and even felt a sense of belonging in the Church. He was a good and kind person. But poor catechesis and a society that confuses pleasure with joy had left him lax in practice, without an appreciation of the sacraments. He was making choices that threatened his soul.

His godmother wanted more for him. She planned to speak with him about his life, hoping to encourage him to return to the practice of the faith. She knew that, when she brought this up, he would reply that it wasn't important to attend Mass or to receive the Eucharist, that was all just "extra."

She told me that she was going to begin their conversation by asking him the question Jesus poses to Peter in Matthew 16:15 — the critical question in all our lives, the question whose answer will define what we become in this world and the next.

Her godson knew the answer. She was confident, unshakably, that he did. He may have forgotten it or ignored it. He may have tried to convince himself he wasn't entirely sure. He may have refused to give an answer. But he knew it. He knew the answer.

There is a reason that, after Peter's response, Jesus gives him the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

"Who do you say that I am?"

Let our whole lives be our answer.

"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." — Matthew 16:16
