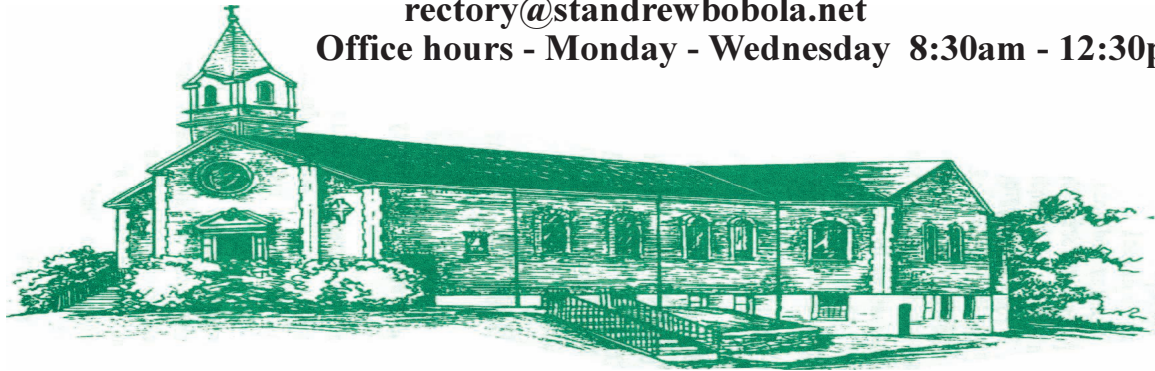

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time – September 16, 2018

“Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.” (MARK 8:34) When we truly believe that all we have is a gift from God, then we must be willing to give up some things so that we can share our blessings as God intended. Living a stewardship lifestyle means not only being responsible for our own life, but the lives of others as well.

REFLECTION

Jesus asks his disciples a question completely out of the blue: “Who do people say that I am?” Christ really wants to know who his disciples thought he was. Yet he leads them by degree to the tougher and more committing questions. The first question – who do people say I am – provokes thought and is easy to answer; all the disciples participate in the answer. The second question requires something more. It involves that introspection and self-examination that closeness to Christ always provokes. Only Peter had the courage to respond. Like the disciples in the Gospel, throughout our own spiritual journey Christ will give us surprise examinations and pop quizzes – moments when we, too, will be asked to evaluate who Jesus really is for each of us.

Judging by God’s Standards: Like the disciples in the Gospel, the closer we draw to Christ, the more he reveals himself. Once the disciples know and accept Jesus as the Messiah, it is important they know the type of Messiah he is. Many misconceptions abound, and all conceive of the Messiah in terms that are all too human. He is not the political liberator who will cast off the Roman dominion and make life “easy.” Rather, he is the Redeemer of the human person. In no uncertain terms, Jesus makes it clear to Peter and the disciples that the Messiah is the Suffering Servant of Yahweh, who must suffer greatly and be rejected.

Bound to Christ by the Cross: Peter thought he was doing Christ a favor by trying to dissuade him from the suffering he predicted would be coming. Yet Peter received the surprise of his life. His well-intentioned but completely misinformed attempt got him the worst possible rebuke from Christ, “Get behind me, Satan.” Christ makes it clear that his disciples must be ready to follow in his footsteps. The path to salvation necessarily leads through the sorrow and joy of the cross.

Conversation with Christ: Lord Jesus, conform my heart to yours. Help me to value events and things the way you do. Help me love you above all things and be especially ready to follow you when it means a personal sacrifice or discomfort for me. Sustain me, Lord in my efforts to follow in your footsteps.

Resolution: Today I will accept difficulties with joy.

REFLEKSJA

Gdy słyszymy, że Jezus zapytał swoich uczniów o to, co mówią o Nim ludzie, wcale się nie dziwimy. Nie ma niczego nadzwyczajnego w tym, że chce się wiedzieć o notowaniach we własnym środowisku. My też co chwilę „nadstawiamy ucha”, by usłyszeć, jak to się potocznie mówi, „co ludzie gadają”. Po co to robimy? Chyba po to, by dowiedzieć się o tym, kim jesteśmy w oczach otaczających nas ludzi. Dla wielu osób jest to sprawa życia i śmierci. Jest to dla nich delikatne, więc „obchodzą się z opinią publiczną jak z jajkiem”. Wiedzą, co komu mają powiedzieć, by zawsze mieć dobrą opinię. Dla wielu jest to tym bardziej istotne, ponieważ są świadomi tego, że większość ludzi nie wnika w szczegóły konkretnych sytuacji, tylko przyjmują poglądy w takiej formie, w jakiej zostały im przedstawione. Z tego powodu plotki tak łatwo się rozchodzą. Nikt nie analizuje i nie ocenia ich prawdziwości, tylko przekazuje je dalej. Z racji na swoją pikantność i nietuzinkowość, są bardzo ciekawe i łatwe w przekazywaniu. To z kolei jest podstawą niesamowicie niebezpiecznego mechanizmu, który zauważył Joseph Goebbels: „Kłamstwo powtórzone tysiąc razy staje się prawdą”. Dobrze, wiemy już trochę na temat negatywnych skutków źle działającej opinii publicznej. Teraz warto zastanowić się, dlaczego skorzystał z niej Jezus. Wydaje się, że wykorzystał ją na dwa sposoby. Wsłuchajmy się w nie, ponieważ dzięki nim umocni się również nasza relacja z Bogiem. Chrystus zainteresował się opinią publiczną na temat swojej Osoby, gdyż dzięki niej może ocenić, czy w swoim głoszeniu nie rozmija się ze słuchaczami. Gdyby to, co mówi powodowało zupełnie inne skutki niż zamierzał, oznaczałoby, że Jego nauczanie jest „ponad głowami”. On mówi jedno, a ludzie rozumieją drugie. Dlatego pytanie o opinię jest zawsze wartościowe. Pokazuje nam, jak odbierają nas inni ludzie. Czy dostrzegają oni w naszych słowach i czynach miłość? Czy to, co robimy jest dobrze odbierane? A co, jeśli jest negatywnie oceniane, chociaż my wszystko robimy z czystej intencji? Co wtedy? Widocznie ludzie nie rozumieją naszych postaw. Tak to bowiem jest, że opinia ludzka kieruje się schematami. Bardzo niewielu ludzi stara się zrozumieć postępowanie innych. Przeważnie wszyscy są wpisani w tę samą miarkę i gdy „nie czynią tego, co wszyscy”, są uważani za złych. Dlatego słowa innych na nasz temat nie są oddaniem prawdy o nas, tylko „poglądem innych”. Warto się z nim liczyć, by coraz lepiej praktykować chrześcijańską miłość. Nie można jednak być przez opinię publiczną zastraszonym. W niej jest tylko „ziarno prawdy”, a nie cała prawda. Traktujmy to, jako głos w sprawie, a nie jak wyrocznię. Jezus bardzo dobrze z tego skorzystał. Drugą wartością, którą uzyskał z opinii publicznej na swój temat, było zbadanie swoich uczniów. Mógł dzięki temu sprawdzić czy Jego najbliżsi towarzysze są „pod wpływem innych”. Po to najpierw zadał pytanie o stosunku ludzi do siebie, a dopiero później zachęcił do opowiedzenia przez apostołów własnych przemyśleń. Jezusowi bardzo zależało na tym, by Jego bliscy uczniowie byli ponad tym, co się mówi na targach i w innych publicznych miejscach. Chciał, by mieli niezależne myślenie.

“We are at war. A war without borders. No one is exempt. The bloodless battle affects us all... No man is exempt. No woman excused. The fight has come full force.”

Now there is “a clarion call of the Holy Spirit to engage in spiritual warfare through prayer, fasting, and sacrifice.”

Our Lady gave a clarion call at Quito, LaSalette, Fatima and other apparitions.

We’re reminded that the “spark” from Poland in 2017 as people prayed at the borders for the country then ignited another in Ireland, then the British Isles. Ordinary people answered along with priests and bishops “physically surrounding their nations in active prayer.”

Now the United States is being called upon to do the same at this critical moment in history — to pray at rallies coast-to-coast on Oct. 7.

“We are being called upon to help turn our country back towards God. We must acknowledge as a people that we have turned away from God; we’ve allowed the kingdom of Satan to assault us, we must confess our errors, turn away from the darkness, and repair what we as a Church and as a nation, have wrought,” the homily continues.

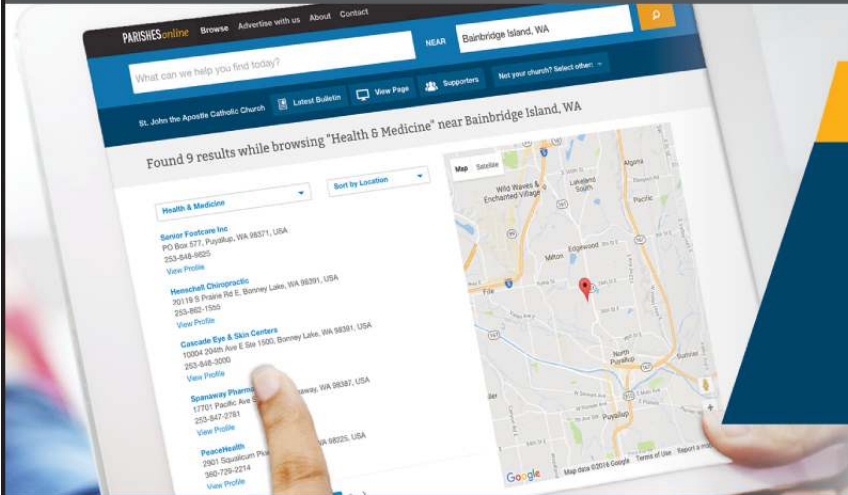
