

A Message From Our Pastor Father Carlos

This week with the celebration of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi we cap off three Sundays during which we are reminded of the truths that are essential to our Christian faith. These feasts all speak to us of the nature of God and of the relationship God wants to have with us. Our belief in the Trinity expresses God's nature as a community of love, while also making clear that there is only one God. In celebrating the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist, we celebrate the fact that God does not want a long-distance relationship with us. He wants to dwell in our midst. The Father and the Son send the Holy Spirit to be the animating presence who guides and instructs the Church. The Church also has the great gift that Jesus chose to dwell forever with us not just in spirit, but truly sacramentally present in the Eucharist. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in #1324 says "*The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." "The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it.*

Lex orandi, lex credendi is a guiding principle of the life of faith. It loosely translates to: our way of praying expresses our beliefs. If we believed, as others do, that Jesus intended the Eucharist to be a symbol or a memorial then our way of expressing our faith would be very different. However, everything we do as Catholics revolves around the reality and power of the Eucharist. We take Jesus at his word when He says that the Eucharist is His body and blood, and this makes all the difference for us. So, from time to time we need to take stock to make sure that the way we live reflects what we profess to believe.

Jesus comes to encounter us, but what do we do to prepare ourselves for Him? Our participation in Sunday Mass should be the most important hour of our week. There are many things we can do to prepare for this hour. It is because of the Eucharist that we should hold the Sacrament of Reconciliation in such importance. If we believe we are about to receive the Lord of the Universe, then we should take time to make sure we've prepared a beautiful place for Him to dwell. Another thing we can do is to take some time of quiet prayer before Mass and after receiving the Eucharist. Our life of faith should be one of relationship; relationship with God and with each other. All too often in our distracted busyness our life of faith and our participation at Mass becomes just another item on a cluttered checklist. This week God invites us to pause, and to restore order to that relationship so that we become more aware of the great gifts He's giving us and so that we allow those gifts to make a difference in our lives. Let's take God up on this invitation!





GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is, who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, “the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist.” What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God’s sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God’s love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well. “There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us.” Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God’s unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. Nourished, united, and strengthened by the Eucharist, let us individually and collectively, bring this wonderful gift to all we meet, especially the poor with whom we have a special connection. ©LPi



Question & Answer ~ Patron Saints

Why are some saints honored as “patron saints”?

Answer:


Each person is unique and each of us has different gifts, interests, talents, and, yes, even struggles and areas where we need to grow. This is no less true of those holy women, men, and children who have been canonized or beatified.

Because we believe that the saints and blessed are both models of faith and intercessors, Christians have looked to certain holy people as role models and heavenly protectors for occupations, spiritual charisms, and even places. Although the Church sometimes names a person as a patron saint (e.g. Saint Philip Neri as the patron of Rome, Saint Clare of Assisi as the patroness of television, or Saint Aloysius Gonzaga as the patron of youth and young adults), more often it is popular devotion that inspires lay Christians to turn to a particular saint or blessed for heavenly help and support. This is how, for example, Saint Cecilia came to be honored as the patroness of musicians, Saint Toribio Romo as patron of migrants coming into the United States, and Saint Gertrude of Nivelles as patroness of cat lovers. Although there are official and unofficial lists of patron saints, we should always feel free to ask any and all the saints to give us their patronage and protection in whatever it is that we need. ©LPi

New Mask Policy as of May 29th for the Catholic Parishes of Stoughton

As of Saturday May 29th, masks are no longer required for vaccinated people in the State of Massachusetts. The State does advise that non-vaccinated people continue to wear masks.

As we reopen, we understand that people will be at different levels of comfort and readiness for mask removal and sitting near each other. Please be respectful of each other and the boundaries people will set for themselves and their families.

The celebration of the Eucharist is the highest form of worship in the Catholic Church and it is our long standing tradition to pray for the dead at Mass. Anyone can ask for a Mass to be offered for a special intention; the most common being for the repose of the soul of someone who died. We reserve one intention per Mass and you can schedule a Mass by contacting the parish office.

Uma mensagem do nosso pastor Padre Carlos

Esta semana, com a celebração da Solenidade de Corpus Christi, encerramos três domingos durante os quais somos lembrados das verdades essenciais à nossa fé cristã. Todas essas festas nos falam da natureza de Deus e do relacionamento que Deus deseja ter conosco. Nossa crença na Trindade expressa a natureza de Deus como uma comunidade de amor, ao mesmo tempo que deixa claro que existe apenas um Deus. Ao celebrar o Espírito Santo e a Eucaristia, celebramos o fato de que Deus não quer um relacionamento à distância conosco. Ele quer habitar em meio de nós. O Pai e o Filho enviam o Espírito Santo para ser a presença animadora que guia e instrui a Igreja. A Igreja também tem o grande dom que Jesus escolheu para habitar para sempre conosco não apenas no espírito, mas verdadeiramente sacramentalmente presente na Eucaristia. O Catecismo da Igreja Católica no nº 1324 diz: “A Eucaristia é «fonte e cume de toda a vida cristã». «Os restantes sacramentos, assim como todos os ministérios eclesiais e obras de apostolado, estão vinculados com a sagrada Eucaristia e a ela se ordenam.”

Lex orandi, lex credendi é um princípio orientador da vida de fé. Isso se traduz vagamente como: nossa maneira de orar expressa nossas crenças. Se acreditássemos, como outros, que Jesus pretendia que a Eucaristia fosse só um símbolo ou um memorial, então nossa maneira de expressar nossa fé seria muito diferente. No entanto, tudo o que fazemos como católicos gira em torno da realidade e do poder da Eucaristia. Acreditamos na palavra de Jesus quando diz que a Eucaristia é Seu corpo e sangue, e isso faz toda a diferença para nós. Portanto, de vez em quando, precisamos fazer um balanço para ter certeza de que a maneira como vivemos reflete o que professamos acreditar.

Jesus vem ao nosso encontro, mas o que fazemos para nos preparar para Ele? Nossa participação na missa dominical deve ser a hora mais importante de nossa semana. Há muitas coisas que podemos fazer para nos prepararmos para esta hora. É por causa da Eucaristia que devemos dar maior importância ao Sacramento da Reconciliação. Se acreditamos que estamos prestes a receber o Senhor do Universo dentro de nós, devemos reservar um tempo para nos certificar de que preparamos um belo lugar para Ele morar. Outra coisa que podemos fazer é fazer um tempo de oração silenciosa antes da missa e depois de receber a eucaristia. Nossa vida de fé deve ser de relacionamento; relacionamento com Deus e uns com os outros. Com muita frequência, em nossas ocupações distraídas, nossa vida de fé e nossa participação na missa tornam-se apenas mais um item de uma lista desordenada. Esta semana, Deus nos convida a fazer uma pausa e restaurar a ordem nesse relacionamento para que nos tornemos mais conscientes dos grandes presentes que Ele está nos dando e para que possamos permitir que esses presentes façam uma diferença em nossas vidas. Vamos aceitar este convite de Deus!
