A Message From Our Pastor Father Carlos

There are many expressions that we use so frequently that we assume that they must surely have come from sacred scripture or some other profound font of wisdom. One of these expressions came to mind as I was reflecting on this week's gospel. I'm sure most of us have heard the expression, "Pray as though everything depends on God; act as though everything depends on you." It's definitely not from sacred scripture and in fact, it's not quite clear who first said it. It's been attributed to St. Augustine, St. Ignatius of Loyola and many others. Regardless of who said it first, given how frequently we hear it it's worth reflecting on how truthful or useful an expression it may be. As an expression, it presents us with an interesting principle of life but it's not one that we seem to balance very well.

We seem to do well at working as if things only depend on us. It's altogether too easy to get into patterns of busyness where we feel we're accomplishing a lot but where we're also burning ourselves out in the process. It's not a healthy principle to wear ourselves out as though everything depends on us. As we see in this Sunday's Gospel, even the Lord upon whose shoulders rests all of creation and salvation history took time to rest. This temptation to act as though everything depends on us also reduces the space that we leave for God to act in our lives and it reduces our attention to the unfolding of divine providence.

On the other hand, the advice to pray as though everything depends on God can lead us into the temptation to spiritual and physical laziness to sit back and wait for things to resolve themselves without input on our part.

As with most things, the truth is somewhere in the middle. Instead of giving into believing that we must solve everything or that we must sit passively and idly by we would do well to follow the path that Jesus sets for us. He encourages us to pray with confidence and without anxiety. He assures us that God is infinitely and perfectly mindful of our needs. At the same time, he reminds us that rather than putting energy into our worries we should use that energy for cultivating our gifts and talents because in God's divine providence we are often the answer to each other's prayers, whether it's lending a hand with a particular task or offering the precise word of encouragement at the opportune moment. We may not even know what we're saying or doing, but if we're constantly rooted in prayer and if we allow God to work in us and through us then we can be sure that we will do great things in union with Him. In the end, Jesus gives us the best snippet of wisdom when he gives us his greatest commandment, "You must love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself." (Lk 10:27, Mt 22:36-40, Mk 12:28-31). If we strive to live by this everything else will fall into place. —Fr. Carlos



Gospel Meditation & Reflections

GOSPEL MEDITATION 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There's an ordinary pine grove located on a tree farm not too far from town where life's stresses and demands seem to melt away. It is here that all that seemed so important out there no longer is and one can get lost in the rows of trees and majestic beauty. God is here and all is good. We need to connect with the Divine Source of all that is in order to understand what it is we are doing and why we are doing it. Otherwise, things stop making sense and bitterness can overcome one's spirit. It's okay to play once in a while and to discover that place of profound life and peace. People always have needs and there is constantly something to do. And while all of that is necessary and we are needed, there is also that inner solitude within that needs to be celebrated and released.

We all need a pine grove. It's that little place we can go and leave all that consumes us behind. It's a place where technology can be set aside and wonder, and awe given some time. We don't have to text, calculate, or orchestrate anything in the pine grove. It is a somewhat deserted place where all of that can be set aside and we can just be. The anger, frustration, exhaustion, discouragement, helplessness, and occasional apathy, all can fall to the ground like all of those pine needles that once held their place on the branch of a Frasier Fir. The needles can let go. We can let go. We are beings connected with Being and we all need to remember what really matters, who really matters and what life is truly all about. We need to find that place where we can rest and let go of all of the barnacles we accumulate. Rest, breathe, seek, and love.

The world will need us again when we leave the pine grove. It will all be waiting for us, beckoning for our attention. But we will have prayed and will have marveled at the silence and the beauty of goodness. We can go back, ready, and eager to listen, to help, to heal, to cry, to embrace, and attend to all that is asked of us. But, having let go of the distractions in that deserted place we will have a renewed sense of purpose. We will know better Who it is we serve and what we are meant to do. It will all be clearer now that we have been Divinely touched and refreshed.



Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different?


Answer:

Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Testament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures included 46 books. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have been written in Hebrew. And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old Testament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and Wisdom (as well as portions of the Books of Daniel and Esther). This means that the Protestant Old Testament only includes 39 books, while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46 books. Both Catholic and Protestant Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Testament.





Uma mensagem do nosso pastor Padre Carlos

Há muitas expressões que usamos com tanta frequência que presumimos que certamente devem ter vindo das escrituras sagradas ou de alguma outra fonte de sabedoria profunda. Uma dessas expressões me veio à mente enquanto eu estava refletindo sobre o evangelho desta semana. Tenho certeza de que a maioria de nós já ouviu a expressão: “Ore como se tudo dependesse de Deus; trabalhe como se tudo dependesse de você.” Definitivamente não vem das escrituras sagradas e, na verdade, não está muito claro quem foi o primeiro em dizer isso. Já foi atribuído a Santo Agostinho, Santo Inácio de Loyola e muitos outros. Independentemente de quem foi o primeiro em dizer isso, dada a frequência com que a ouvimos, vale a pena refletir sobre o quão verdadeira ou útil uma expressão pode ser. Como expressão, apresenta-nos um princípio de vida interessante, mas não é aquele que parecemos equilibrar muito bem.

Parece que trabalhamos bem como se as coisas dependessem apenas de nós. É muito fácil entrar em padrões de ocupação em que sentimos que estamos realizando muito, mas também estamos nos esgotando no processo. Não é um princípio saudável nos desgastarmos como se tudo dependesse de nós. Como vemos no evangelho deste domingo, até o Senhor sobre cujos ombros repousa toda a história da criação e da salvação teve tempo para descansar. Essa tentação de agir como se tudo dependesse de nós também reduz o espaço que deixamos para Deus agir em nossas vidas e também reduz nossa atenção para o desenrolar da providência divina.

Por outro lado, o conselho de orar como se tudo dependesse de Deus pode nos levar à tentação da preguiça espiritual e física. Pode tentarmos a sentar e esperar que as coisas se resolvam sem ajuda de nossa parte.

Como a maioria das coisas, a verdade está em algum lugar no meio. Em vez de nos entregarmos à crença de que devemos resolver o tudo ou que devemos nos sentar passivamente e preguiçosamente, faríamos bem em seguir o caminho que Jesus nos ensina. Ele nos encoraja a orar com confiança e sem ansiedade. Ele nos garante que Deus está infinita e perfeitamente atento às nossas necessidades. Ao mesmo tempo, ele nos lembra que, em vez de colocar energia em nossas preocupações, devemos usar essa energia para cultivar nossos dons e talentos, porque na providência divina de Deus muitas vezes somos a resposta às orações uns dos outros, seja ajudando com uma determinada tarefa ou oferecendo a palavra precisa de encorajamento no momento oportuno. Podemos nem saber o que estamos dizendo ou fazendo, mas se estivermos constantemente enraizados na oração e se permitirmos que Deus trabalhe em nós e através de nós, então podemos ter certeza de que faremos grandes coisas em união com Ele. No final, Jesus nos dá a melhor expressão de sabedoria ao nos dar seu maior mandamento: “Você deve amar o Senhor seu Deus e seu próximo como a si mesmo”. (Lc 10:27, Mt 22: 36-40, Mc 12: 28-31). Se nos esforçarmos para viver de acordo com isso, tudo mais se encaixará. —Pe. Carlos

Todas as atividades acontecerão na St. James ,560 Page st Stoughton.




