THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY



*"From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty
has done great things for me and holy is his Name. He has cast
down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly."*

- Lk 1:48b-49, 52

A Message From Our Pastor Father Carlos

Typically, when a saint's feast falls on a Sunday unless it's the patronal saint of a Church or place where the Mass is being celebrated, the celebration is omitted in favor of the celebration of the Sunday Mass with its proper readings and prayers. During certain seasons such as Advent, even solemnities, which are important celebrations of events in the life of our Lord, and aspects of our faith are moved to Monday giving precedence to the Sunday celebration. So when December 8, the patronal feast for our Immaculate Conception parish and a holy day of obligation, falls on Sunday in Advent, the Immaculate Conception is celebrated on Dec. 9 because Sundays in Advent outrank solemnities. During ordinary time things are a bit different. Solemnities of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints take precedence over the Sundays of ordinary time. That's the case with our celebration this Sunday as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary instead of the 20th Sunday in Ordinary time.

The dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary was formally declared by Pope Pius XII in 1950. The Catholic Church teaches that the Virgin Mary "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." There is no scriptural passage that tells us that this happened, though there is at least one scriptural account of someone being taken up into heaven with the assumption of the prophet Elijah. (2Kings 2:9-12). Though there isn't a scriptural note of Mary's Assumption it has been part of our Christian tradition since the earliest times of Christianity. It's fascinating for instance to note that while we have relics of thousands of saints we have no relics of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Had her body remained on Earth surely those relics would abound.

Historical and theological curiosities aside this feast with its readings and prayers teaches us much about being disciples and missionaries. Mary's entire life was lived at the disposal of God. She would not have been prepared to receive the invitation of the incarnation had she not already been steeped in faith and rooted in prayer. She shows us that our life makes the most sense and is the most fruitful when we make space and time to listen to God and follow His invitations. She also shows us that God's invitations are given to us not so that we can proclaim how special we are but rather so that we can proclaim God's glory and put our lives at the service of others. It's striking that after the annunciation, Mary sets out not for personal recognition but rather to serve her cousin who was also pregnant and in great need. She is the first missionary disciple.

As disciples of the Lord let us ask Our Lady's intercession to teach us to listen to God's invitations and to go joyfully to share the good news wherever God may lead us.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

WWJD bracelets were all the rage about 25 years ago in Christian circles. I've always wondered if a WWMD bracelet might not make just as much sense, and maybe more. What Would Mary Do?

I would argue that Mary was the most exemplary steward who ever lived. Her answer was always "Yes." Yes, Lord, I am Your handmaiden. Yes, I will visit Elizabeth, and help her in the last difficult months of pregnancy. Yes, I will bring my son up in the Mosaic law and present him at the Temple of Jerusalem. Yes, I will give him to the crowds and to public ministry. Yes, I will offer him on this Cross, if it is Your will.

Yes, yes, yes.

Well, I can't be like Mary, we think to ourselves. There's an intimidation factor with the Blessed Mother and Catholics sometimes — one that almost exceeds that of Christ. Perhaps it's because we are in awe of the fact that she was not divine in any way — she was a mere creation, like us — but somehow, she always had the courage to say yes. How could she do it, when we find it so hard?

Well, God certainly lavished on Mary extraordinary graces. Her lack of original sin liberated her to conform her will to God's.

But God is impatient to give us, too, all the graces we need to be a steward in the example of Mary. He's waiting for us simply to ask. Just as in Adam we died, so in Christ — through Mary — we live.

What can we say yes to today, in Mary's example?

Gospel Meditation & Reflections

The Story of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: “We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory.” The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. In following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However by the 13th century there was universal agreement. The feast was celebrated under various names—Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption—from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a solemnity.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary’s assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, Revelation 12 speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil. Many see this woman as God’s people. Since Mary best embodies the people of both Old and New Testaments, her assumption can be seen as an exemplification of the woman’s victory.

Furthermore, in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Paul speaks of Christ’s resurrection as the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus’ life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary’s share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven.



What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

Answer:

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God’s will, living each day with confidence in God’s mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus’ public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: “For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church’s coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people.”

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God’s grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.



Uma mensagem do nosso pastor Padre Carlos

Normalmente, quando a festa dum santo cai em domingo, a menos que seja o santo padroeiro duma Igreja ou local onde a missa está sendo celebrada, a celebração é omitida em favor da celebração da missa dominical com suas leituras e orações próprias. Durante certos períodos, como o Advento, até mesmo as solenidades, que são celebrações importantes de eventos na vida de nosso Senhor, e aspectos de nossa fé são transferidos para a segunda-feira, dando precedência à celebração dominical. Assim, quando 8 de dezembro, a festa patronal da nossa paróquia da Imaculada Conceição e um dia sagrado de obrigação, cai no domingo do Advento, a Imaculada Conceição é celebrada no 9 de dezembro porque os domingos do Advento superam as solenidades. Durante o tempo ordinário, as coisas são um pouco diferentes. As solenidades do Senhor, da Bem-aventurada Virgem Maria e dos santos têm precedência sobre os domingos do tempo ordinário. É o que acontece com a nossa celebração neste domingo, ao celebrarmos a Solenidade da Assunção da Bem-Aventurada Virgem Maria, em vez do 20º domingo do tempo comum.

O dogma da Assunção da Bem-Aventurada Virgem Maria foi formalmente declarado pelo Papa Pio XII em 1950. A Igreja Católica ensina que a Virgem Maria "tendo completado o curso de sua vida terrena, foi assumida de corpo e alma na glória celestial". Não há passagem bíblica que nos diga que isso aconteceu, embora haja pelo menos um relato bíblico de alguém sendo levado ao céu com a assunção do profeta Elias. (2 Reis 2: 9-12). Embora não haja uma nota bíblica da Assunção de Maria, a assunção faz parte da nossa tradição cristã desde os primeiros tempos do Cristianismo. É fascinante, por exemplo, notar que embora tenhamos relíquias de milhares de santos, não temos relíquias da Bem-Aventurada Virgem Maria. Se seu corpo tivesse permanecido na Terra, certamente essas relíquias abundariam.

As curiosidades históricas e teológicas ao lado, esta solenidade com suas leituras e orações nos ensina muito sobre ser discípulos e missionários. Toda a vida de Maria foi vivida à disposição de Deus. Ela não estaria preparada para receber o convite da encarnação se já não estivesse imersa na fé e enraizada na oração. Ela nos mostra que nossa vida faz mais sentido e é mais fecunda quando reservamos espaço e tempo para ouvir a Deus e seguir seus convites. Ela também nos mostra que os convites de Deus não nos são feitos para que possamos proclamar o quanto somos especiais, mas para que possamos proclamar a glória de Deus e colocar nossas vidas a serviço dos outros. É impressionante que, após a anunciação, Maria não busque reconhecimento pessoal, mas sai para servir sua prima, que também estava grávida e necessitada. A virgem Maria é a primeira discípula missionária.

Como discípulos do Senhor, peçamos a intercessão de Nossa Senhora para nos ensinar a ouvir os convites de Deus e ir com alegria para compartilhar as boas novas onde quer que Deus nos leve.


