

A Message From Our Pastor Father Carlos

Today the Church ends its liturgical year with the celebration of the solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. This solemnity was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in response to the increasing nationalism and secularism in the world at the time. One of the events of the 1920s that led Pope Pius to declare the Feast of Christ the King was the Cristero War in Mexico. Mexico at the time was under the rule of an atheistic government that was virulently anti-Catholic. Scores of priests and religious had been exiled, and laypeople were severely restricted in the practice of their faith. Those priests and laypeople who wouldn't give in to the will of the government were routinely imprisoned and killed. In response to this faithful Catholics rose up in defense of the faith. One of the heroes of this era was Blessed Miguel Pro, a Jesuit priest who preferred martyrdom for serving his flock rather than exile. As he faced the firing squad and was asked for his last words Blessed Miguel said three words, "*Viva Cristo Rey!*" (Long live Christ the King!).

As we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, we're reminded of just what sort of king Christ is. He went unrecognized as a king and was challenged by many of His coreligionists in His time because they awaited a messiah who would wield political power and who would overturn the tide of historical events. Some hoped that they would go from being the conquered people to being those in power. The mistake in all of this thinking is that they were thinking in purely horizontal terms where what matters is power as humans see it not power as God sees it. If God was like the ancients imagined Him to be, mercurial, vindictive, and wrathful, then maybe a militaristic messiah might have made sense. Jesus on the other hand came, "not to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many." (Mt 20:28)

We can be grateful for such a king. As king, Jesus could demand everything from us, but instead, He gives us everything we have and are and so much more. This king does as that we be willing to follow Him in our daily lives. He asks that as His disciples we be ambassadors of his kingdom, going forth and announcing to others the good news of salvation. The commitments we make as members of the Church in general and as members of this collaborative in particular are our embodiment of the proclamation that the kingdom of God is at hand and in fact, is already here. We proclaim the kingdom that we have received, one where we exist not to be served but to serve and to give our lives as a ransom for many. As we rejoice with gratitude for the King that God has given us let us recommit ourselves to giving Him homage not only with our worship and our prayer but with our living out of the good news and our commitment to bring many more people to know the joy of this kingdom.



What is Stewardship?

The Principles of Catholic Stewardship of Time, Talents and Treasure:

Talent:

When we consider the many skills and abilities God has given others, and us we begin to see how truly remarkable His generosity is. What we choose to do is usually the result of the talents God gives us. Because He has created each of us with a purpose in mind, He gives each of us certain and varied talents.

Stewards of talent recognize that using the abilities God has given them, whether with family, work, parish, or recreation, should serve Him by serving others. As with the use of time, stewardship of talent asks us to share what God has given us generously, not only in our homes and in our work, but also in our parish community. The parish provides many opportunities to share one's talents.

Beyond cultivating their own God-given talents, good stewards also cultivate the talents of others. Often, it takes a personal invitation from one parishioner to encourage another to use their talents for the work of the church. By pointing out another's talent to them and giving them the inspiration to come forward and try, parishioners act as mediators for the Lord. "... People do not hear the Lord's call in isolation from one another. Other disciples help mediate their vocations to them, and they in turn are meant to mediate the Lord's call to others."






GOSPEL MEDITATION

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

We often come to life expecting all of the pieces of the puzzle to nicely fit together. We want and expect harmony, order, and fairness, the achievement of rewards for good behavior, good health, and happiness. We can more easily accept death when it comes naturally after a good long life, but have a real difficulty comprehending the meaning of it all when it is cut short. Willing to put in a good measure of effort, we desire positive results. When things go wrong and life gets hurtful, unjust, and downright ugly, we become unsettled and can quickly fall into despair. This is especially true if we are people of faith who believe in a God who sees things on our terms and works in favor of our life agenda. What happens to our faith when we find ourselves sitting in a mess?

Does it help to know that God understands and that hardship, failure, disappointment, injustice, confusion, and all of life's ugliness do not make faith irrelevant or irrational? God is wonderfully and surprising creative! He turns the tables on not only our understanding of life, but of what it means to be a king. God sends us a king who is not exempt from life's ills but embraces them. The king that God gives to us knows what it means to be poor, suffer insults, be ridiculed, face rejection, endure suffering, be betrayed, and face a most unjust and horrific death. This is our king. Jesus is not a king of prestige or grandeur but a king who brings light to darkness, hope to despair, sinners to mercy, and new life out of death. Christ dances before us pleading with us to hold on, cling to love, avoid being negative, stop feeling cheated, and be strong in faith! There may be hardship and disappointment now but there are more surprises to come.

Once we understand this truth, we will also understand that we are on a most incredible and awesome universal journey to Christ and becoming one in Christ. We all carry within us the image of God, the image of our suffering king. The One who lives in us also lives in all of our brothers and sisters. Failing to see this universal Divine Presence in all is one of the greatest mistakes we can make, for we also fail to see God, our king, as well. There are many things that can bring hardship to life. If we keep our head about us and do not lose hope, we can persevere and strive for the greatest degree of justice possible. Even though there are ample things that can challenge our faith, we also know that our deepest joy comes from union with God and our brothers and sisters. One day, the fullness of that joy will be ours to have when we are all eternally one with Christ our King forever. ©LPI



St. Francesco Antonio Fasani Feast Day November 27

St. Francesco Antonio Fasani (1681 – 1742) lived his whole life as a loving, devout, and atoning man. He entered the Conventual Franciscans in 1695, and 10 years later taught philosophy to younger friars, served as guardian of his friary, and eventually became provincial minister. When his term of office ended, St. Francesco became master of novices and finally pastor in his hometown of Lucera.

Known throughout his various ministries as being loving, devout, and penitential, he was also a well-known confessor and preacher. St. Francesco was a loyal friend of the poor and worked tirelessly to find ways to support them. He was a mystic with such a profound prayer life and supernatural gifts that he was known to levitate during prayer. He was canonized in 1986 by Pope John Paul II.

Uma mensagem do nosso pastor Padre Carlos

Hoje a Igreja termina o ano litúrgico com a celebração da solenidade de Cristo Rei do Universo. Esta solenidade foi instituída pelo Papa Pio XI em 1925 em resposta ao crescente nacionalismo e secularismo no mundo da época. Um dos eventos da década de 1920 que levou o Papa Pio a declarar a Festa de Cristo Rei foi a Guerra dos Cristeros no México. O México na época estava sob um governo ateísta que era virulentamente anticatólico. Dezenas de padres e religiosas foram exilados, e os leigos foram severamente restringidos na prática de sua fé. Os padres e leigos que não cediam à vontade do governo eram rotineiramente presos e mortos. Em resposta a isso, os fiéis católicos se levantaram em defesa da fé. Um dos heróis desta época foi o beato Miguel Pro, um padre jesuíta que preferiu o martírio como preço de servir ao seu rebanho do que o exílio. Ao enfrentar o pelotão de fuzilamento e enquanto eles demandaram suas últimas palavras, o Beato Miguel disse três palavras: "Viva Cristo Rei!"

Ao celebrarmos a Festa de Cristo Rei, somos lembrados de que tipo de rei Cristo é. Ele não foi reconhecido como um rei e foi desafiado por muitos dos seus correligionários no Seu tempo porque eles esperavam um messias que exerceria o poder político e que mudaria a maré dos eventos históricos. Alguns esperavam que deixassem de ser o povo conquistado e passassem a ser os poderosos. O erro em todo esse pensamento é que eles estavam pensando em termos puramente horizontais, onde o que importa é o poder, pois os humanos o vêm, não o poder como Deus o vê. Se Deus fosse como os antigos imaginavam, mercurial, vingativo e colérico, então talvez um messias militarista faria sentido. Jesus, por outro lado, veio, "não para ser servido, mas para servir e dar a sua vida em resgate por muitos". (Mt 20:28)

Podemos ser gratos por esse rei. Como rei, Jesus poderia exigir tudo de nós, mas em vez disso, Ele nos dá tudo o que temos e somos e muito mais. Este rei faz com que estejamos dispostos a segui-Lo em nossas vidas diárias. Ele pede que, como Seus discípulos, sejamos embaixadores de seu reino, saindo e anunciando aos outros as boas novas da salvação. Os compromissos que assumimos como membros da Igreja em geral e como membros desta colaborativa em particular são a nossa encarnação da proclamação de que o reino de Deus está próximo e de fato, já está aqui. Proclamamos o reino que recebemos, um reino onde existimos não para ser servidos, mas para servir e dar nossas vidas em resgate por muitos. Enquanto nos regozijamos com gratidão pelo Rei que Deus nos deu, vamos nos comprometer novamente a homenageá-Lo não apenas com nosso louvor e nossa oração, mas com nosso viver baseado nas boas novas e nosso compromisso de trazer muitas mais pessoas para conhecer a alegria de este reino. - Pe. Carlos

Nosso Senhor Jesus Cristo, Rei do Universo

Muitas vezes ficamos à espera que todas as peças do puzzle se encaixem bem. Queremos e esperamos harmonia, ordem e justiça, a conquista de recompensas pelo bom comportamento, boa saúde e felicidade. Podemos aceitar mais facilmente a morte quando ela vem naturalmente depois de uma boa vida longa, mas temos uma dificuldade real de compreender o significado de tudo quando é encurtadas. Dispostos a fazer um bom esforço, desejamos resultados positivos. Quando as coisas correm mal e a vida fica magoada, injusta e feia, ficamos inquietos e podemos rapidamente cair em desespero. Isto é especialmente verdade se somos pessoas de fé que acreditam num Deus que vê as coisas nos nossos termos e trabalha a favor da nossa agenda de vida. O que acontece à nossa fé quando nos encontramos sentados numa confusão?

Ajuda saber que Deus comprehende e que as dificuldades, o fracasso, a desilusão, a injustiça, a confusão e toda a fealdade da vida não tornam a fé irrelevante ou irracional? Deus é maravilhosamente e surpreendentemente criativo! Ele vira as mesas não só para a nossa compreensão da vida, mas também para o que significa ser um rei. Deus envia-nos um rei que não está isento dos males da vida, mas que os abraça. O rei que Deus nos dá sabe o que significa ser pobre, sofrer insultos, ser ridicularizado, enfrentar a rejeição, suportar sofrimento, ser traído, e enfrentar uma morte injusta e horrível. Este é o nosso rei. Jesus não é um rei de prestígio ou grandeza, mas um rei que traz luz à escuridão, esperança de desespero, pecadores à misericórdia, e nova vida fora da morte. Cristo dança diante de nós implorando a nós para nos agarrarmos, agarrarmo-nos ao amor, evitar ser negativo, parar de se sentir enganado, e ser forte na fé! Pode haver dificuldades e desilusões agora, mas há mais surpresas por vir.

Assim que compreendermos esta verdade, também compreenderemos que estamos numa incrível e incrível viagem universal a Cristo e nos tornaremos um em Cristo. Todos carregamos dentro de nós a imagem de Deus, a imagem do nosso rei sofredor. Aquele que vive em nós também vive em todos os nossos irmãos e irmãs. Não ver esta presença divina universal em tudo é um dos maiores erros que podemos cometer, pois também não conseguimos ver Deus, o nosso rei, também. Há muitas coisas que podem trazer dificuldades à vida. Se mantivermos a cabeça sobre nós e não perdermos a esperança, podemos perseverar e lutar pelo maior grau de justiça possível. Apesar de existirem amplas coisas que podem desafiar a nossa fé, também sabemos que a nossa alegria mais profunda vem da união com Deus e os nossos irmãos e irmãs. 

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
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
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
