# A Message From Our Pastor Father Carlos

Rejoice! The purple color that we see most of Advent in the candles and in the vestments reminds us that this is a season of waiting and preparation. Preparation involves some pain as we take away those things which are holding us back, and as we're stretched to grow in new ways. That's why the color of this season is the same as that of Lent which is also a time of preparation and conversion. Both seasons lead us to celebrate the coming of Christ, first in His birth and then in His resurrection.

In the midst of both Advent and Lent we have a "rose" Sunday, Gaudete Sunday in Advent and Laetare Sunday in Lent; both of these Latin words mean the same thing: Rejoice! The rose color of this week reminds us of what's in store. It's meant to mimic those first rays of a sunrise that begin to shine through the darkness of night. Christ came to remind us that darkness never has the final word, and that light will triumph in the end. Since we know what's in store, even in the midst of times of preparation we are meant to live with the joy that this confidence gives us. Catholics are often caricatured as the people of "no", of "don't do this" and "don't do that!" However, if we truly embrace our baptismal call, we discover that our life is not one of denial but rather one of acceptance. After all the greatest human word which was spoken was, Mary's simple "yes" to the angel's invitation. The spirit of this yes was one of wonder and rejoicing marveling at the goodness of God whose ways are mysterious but whose fidelity in fulfilling his promises is never outdone. The power of Mary's acceptance brought God's glory into her life and it has continued to pour out through all of salvation history since then. Our lives as Christians should follow in the footsteps of that great yes. Mary's example makes clear for us that a yes to God doesn't mean a life free of trials and suffering. However, she makes equally clear that if we're faithful in response to God's invitations the trials shall pass and all we'll be left with is unending joy and heavenly glory. God calls us to strip away certain things, and He calls us to live in certain ways, but He doesn't do it to hinder us. God guides us because He has better things in store for us than what we might settle for on our own. The greatest witness we can give to our baptismal call is to live joyfully. This season of preparation is a good time to ask God's help in setting aside those things which keep us from following Him, from giving our yes to His invitations and most of all let us renounce those things that keep us from, most fully experiencing the joy God has prepared for us.—Fr. Carlos

3rd Sunday of Advent


“From silly devotions and sour-faced saints, good Lord, deliver us!” St. Teresa of Avila

St. Therese of Lisieux reminds us that, “Joy is not found in the material objects surrounding us but in the inner recesses of the soul. # Uma mensagem do nosso pastor Padre Carlos

Alegrem-se! A cor roxa que mais vemos do Advento nas velas e nas vestes nos lembra que este é um tempo de espera e preparação. A preparação envolve um pouco de dor à medida que removemos as coisas que nos prendem e à medida que somos forçados a crescer de novas maneiras. Por isso a cor deste tempo é igual o cor da Quaresma, que é também um tempo de preparação e conversão. Ambas as estações nos levam a celebrar a vinda de Cristo, primeiro em Seu nascimento e depois em Sua ressurreição.

No meio do Advento e da Quaresma temos o Domingo da "rosa", o Domingo de Gaudete no Advento e o Domingo de Laetare na Quaresma; ambas as palavras latinas significam a mesma coisa: Alegrem-se! A cor rosa desta semana nos lembra o que está por vir. O objetivo é imitar os primeiros raios do nascer do sol que começam a brilhar na escuridão da noite. Cristo veio para nos lembrar que as trevas nunca têm a palavra final e que a luz triunfará no final. Já que sabemos o que nos espera, mesmo em meio dos tempos de preparação, devemos viver com a alegria que essa confiança nos dá. Os católicos são frequentemente caricaturados como pessoas do "não", do "não faça isso" e "não faça aquilo!" No entanto, se realmente abraçarmos nosso chamado batismal, descobrimos que nossa vida não é de negação, mas sim de aceitação. Afinal, a maior palavra humana que foi falada foi o simples "sim" de Maria ao convite do anjo. O espírito deste sim foi de admiração e alegria maravilhando-se com a bondade de Deus cujos caminhos são misteriosos, mas cuja fidelidade em cumprir suas promessas nunca é superada. O poder da aceitação de Maria trouxe a glória de Deus para sua vida e espalhou a glória de Deus por toda a história da salvação desde então. Nossas vidas como cristãos devem seguir o exemplo desse grande sim. O exemplo de Maria deixa claro para nós que um sim a Deus não significa uma vida livre de provações e sofrimento. No entanto, ela deixa igualmente claro que se formos fiéis em resposta aos convites de Deus, as provações passarão e tudo o que nos resta é alegria sem fim e glória celestial. Deus nos chama para nos livrarmos de certas coisas e nos chama para viver de certas maneiras, mas Ele não faz isso para nos impedir. Deus nos guia porque tem coisas melhores reservadas para nós do que aquilo que podemos inventar por nós mesmos. O maior testemunho que podemos dar a nosso chamado batismal é viver com alegria. Este tempo de preparação é um bom momento para pedir a ajuda de Deus para deixar de lado aquilo que nos impede de segui-Lo, de dar o nosso sim aos seus convites e, acima de tudo, renunciemos aquilo que nos impede, e assim experimentemos mais plenamente a alegria que Deus preparou para nós. - Pe. 
