

# A Message From Our Pastor Father Carlos

Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, and Happy Epiphany of the Lord! This feast traditionally is celebrated on January 6 and rounds out the 12 days of Christmas, but for many years now the Church in her wisdom has moved the feast to the closest Sunday in order to make it possible for more people to enter into the celebration. The downside of this is that some years, like this one, the 12 days of Christmas get sliced a bit shorter, but the upside is that the Christmas season is by no means over. The feast of the Epiphany marks one of the traditional ending points for the Christmas season, but in many places, including the Vatican, nativity scenes and decorations are left up for forty days until the feast of the presentation of the Lord which takes place on February 2.

There's absolutely nothing wrong with celebrating a lengthy Christmas season and now that we've made it past the consumerist trappings which our popular culture imposes on this time of year, we're freer to focus on the true reason for these holy days, and so it's important that we not be too eager to leave this season behind. Instead, let us take the remaining days of the Christmas season as an opportunity to reflect on what it's all about. The gift-giving and the feasting give us a glimpse of the meaning of this season as we rejoice at sharing love and joy with the people that God has placed in our lives. However, it isn't until we take those experiences and those people and gather around the altar of the Lord for the celebration of Mass that we truly appreciate the significance of what God did for us at Christmas.

Today's feast of the Epiphany helps us to understand the magnitude of the gift God has given us. The coming of the magi to adore the Christ child illustrates the fact that God's love is not poured out for a small subset of humanity. God's love is not some stamp we receive that admits us into an exclusive club. In the Eucharistic prayer when the priest prays over the chalice he says, "Take this all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." However, this is not to say that Jesus' blood, and by extension, God's love, is only poured out for a small clique of people. God's love is poured out for all people; the only catch is that we have to be willing to accept it.

All of salvation history has been oriented towards God's desire that humanity share in His love. Remember, at the beginning of time God created everything not out of necessity but rather out of love. It's difficult to wrestle with this mystery of divine love. It's much easier to live at the surface and to experience these celebrations as something we do rather than as divine events which have the power to do something to us. However, the example of the wise men invites us to go deeper. They invite us to read the signs that God leaves for us and to follow those signs. When the wise men followed the signs, they found the Christ child and, in that experience, they found the source of their being and the fulfillment of their desires. Should you expect any less from God?

This Christmas season, ask God for the necessary gifts to become more aware of His presence in your life and of how He desires to shine through your life into the lives of others. Merry Christmas!—Fr. Carlos

### The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.



# Gospel Meditation & Reflections

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### The Epiphany of the Lord

In his Apostolic Exhortation, *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: “Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.” Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, “Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God’s love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being.”

Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.

### Dropped Host

**Question:** What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground?

**Answer:** This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the ministers respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

## The Sacrament of Marriage

Couples planning a wedding should call the parish office to set up a meeting with the Pastor. Dates cannot be set by phone or e-mails. After meeting with the Pastor and proper church paperwork has been completed, a wedding date can be booked. A wedding date should be arranged with the church before making any other plans.


Baptisms are held the 3rd Sunday of the month at St. James and the 4th Sunday of the month at Immaculate Conception.

## St. Elizabeth Ann Seton | January 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

# Uma mensagem do nosso pastor Padre Carlos

Feliz Natal, Feliz Ano Novo e Feliz Epifania do Senhor! Esta festa é tradicionalmente celebrada no dia 6 de janeiro e completa os 12 dias do Natal, mas há vários anos a Igreja em sua sabedoria mudou a festa para o domingo mais próximo, a fim de permitir que mais pessoas entrem na celebração. A desvantagem disso é que em alguns anos, como este, os 12 dias do Natal ficam um pouco mais curtos, mas o lado bom é que a época do Natal não acabou de forma alguma. A festa da Epifania marca um dos tradicionais pontos finais da temporada de Natal, mas em muitos lugares, incluindo o Vaticano, presépios e decorações são deixados por quarenta dias até a festa da apresentação do Senhor, que ocorre no 2do de Fevereiro.

Não há absolutamente nada de errado em celebrar uma longa temporada de Natal e agora que superamos as armadilhas consumistas que nossa cultura popular impõe nesta época do ano, estamos mais livres para nos concentrar no verdadeiro motivo desses dias sagrados, e assim é importante que não estejamos demasiado ansiosos para chegar ao fim de esta temporada. Em vez disso, vamos aproveitar os dias restantes da temporada de Natal como uma oportunidade para refletir sobre o que está acontecendo. A entrega de presentes e a festa nos dão um vislumbre do significado desta temporada, enquanto nos regozijamos em compartilhar o amor e a alegria com as pessoas que Deus colocou em nossas vidas. No entanto, só quando pegamos essas experiências e essas pessoas e nos reunimos em torno do altar do Senhor para a celebração da missa é que realmente apreciamos o significado do que Deus fez por nós no Natal.

A festa da Epifania nos ajuda a entender a magnitude do presente que Deus nos deu. A vinda dos reis para adorar o menino Jesus ilustra o fato de que o amor de Deus não é derramado só para um pequeno subconjunto da humanidade. O amor de Deus não é um selo que recebemos que nos admite em um clube exclusivo. Na oração eucarística, quando o sacerdote reza sobre o cálice, ele diz: “Tomai, todos, e bebei: este é o cálice do meu Sangue, o Sangue da nova e eterna aliança, que será derramado por vós e por todos, para remissão dos pecados.” Isso nos lembra que o sangue de Jesus e, por extensão, o amor de Deus, não é derramado apenas para um pequeno grupo de pessoas. O amor de Deus é derramado por todas as pessoas; o único que é preciso é que temos que estar dispostos a aceitá-lo.

Toda a história da salvação é orientada para o desejo de Deus de que a humanidade compartilhasse de Seu amor. Lembre-se, no início dos tempos, Deus criou tudo não por necessidade, mas por amor. É difícil lutar com este mistério do amor divino. É muito mais fácil viver na superfície e experimentar essas celebrações como algo que fazemos, em vez de eventos divinos que têm o poder de fazer algo por nós. Porém, o exemplo dos Reis Magos nos convida a ir mais fundo. Eles nos convidam a ler os sinais que Deus nos deixa e a seguir esses sinais. Quando os reis seguiram os sinais, encontraram o menino Jesus e, nessa experiência, encontraram a fonte de seu ser e a realização de seus desejos. Você deve esperar menos de Deus?

Neste período de Natal, peça a Deus os presentes necessários para se tornar mais consciente da presença de Deus em sua vida e de como Ele deseja brilhar em sua vida e por meio de você na vida de outras pessoas. Feliz Natal! - Pe. Carlos

### A Epifania do Senhor

Na sua Exortação Apostólica, A Alegria do Evangelho, o Papa Francisco refere um pensamento do Papa Bento XVI: "Ser cristão não é o resultado de uma escolha ética ou de uma ideia elevada, mas sim do encontro com um evento, uma pessoa, que dá à vida um novo horizonte e um rumo decisivo." Hoje celebramos um encontro com a Pessoa de Jesus Cristo! Este acontecimento simples mas sagrado no tempo muda drasticamente a vida humana, apontando-a para um novo horizonte e dando-lhe uma direção decisiva. Mas também se encontra nos fiéis que vêm na Epifania de Deus uma libertação de estruturas e sistemas que nos magoam, uma estreiteza da mente e do coração que nos contrai, e uma absorção na nossa auto-agenda que nos impede de ver algo além de nós mesmos tão importantes.

Foi-nos dada a acusação de pregar esta Boa Nova. Se ao menos pudéssemos encontrar uma maneira de ser mais eficaz, poderia ter a chance de fazer o que Deus pretendia que fizesse. Há sempre o amanhã e a nossa memória daquela nova luz brilhante que brilhou tão brilhantemente que a noite de Belém nos aponta para a verdade e nos lembra que somos amados. ©LPi
