



Letter from the Pastor

The Reverend Jeffrey V. Romans, KCHS

Dear Friends in Christ:



The Penitential Rite of Mass usually takes one of two forms common to the practice of the liturgy. We typically do one of the following:

1. Pray the Confiteor, which begins, **I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned...** This is followed by the prayer of absolution by the priest, (although these words lack the efficacy of the sacrament of penance (GIRM 51), they are a fitting reminder that we all seek God’s mercy, especially as we come together to celebrate his sacred mysteries), **May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.** This then is followed by repeating **Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy.**

2. Pray with a series of invocations addressed to Christ followed by the **Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy.** The most commonly used is:

You were sent to heal the contrite of heart, Lord, have mercy.

You came to call sinners, Christ, have mercy.

You are seated at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us, Lord, have mercy.

However, there is another option. I would like us to begin using this option over the next few weeks. It goes like this:

Priest: Brethren (brothers and sisters), let us acknowledge our sins, and so prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries.

Priest: Have mercy on us, O Lord.

All: For we have sinned against you.

Priest: Show us, O Lord, your mercy.

All: And grant us your salvation.

Priest: May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.

This is a beautiful exchange between the Priest and the People based on the scriptural passages of Baruch 3:2 and Psalm 85:8. Let’s put it into use in the coming weeks and learn another way to acknowledge our sins and our need for God’s mercy!

This past Wednesday the Holy Father, Pope Francis, appealed to all people of goodwill to take any COVID vaccine “authorized by the competent authorities.”

Here is the full statement issued:

“In a brotherly spirit, I join in this message of hope for a brighter future. Thanks to God and to the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from COVID-19. They grant us the hope of ending the pandemic, but only if they are available to all and if we work together.

Being vaccinated with vaccines authorized by the competent authorities is an

act of love. And contributing to ensure the majority of people are vaccinated is an act of love. Love for oneself, love for one’s family and friends, love for all people. Love is also social and political, there is social love and political love, it is universal, always overflowing with small gestures of personal charity capable of transforming and improving societies (cf. *Laudato si’*, no. 231, cf. *Fratelli tutti*, 184).



Vaccination is a simple but profound way of promoting the common good and caring for each other, especially the most vulnerable. I pray to God that everyone may contribute their own small grain of sand, their own small gesture of love; no matter how small, love is always great. Contribute with these small gestures for a better future.

God bless you, and thank you.”

That said, again as I have over the past few months, I urge all who are eligible to be vaccinated to PLEASE GET VACCINATED.

My friends, I know there are a lot of conspiracy theories out there, I know there are a lot of mixed views on the vaccines, I know there is misinformation about Catholic moral teaching, and I know there is hesitation in the minds of even some of you, but I urge you to get the vaccine! I did!

Archbishop Blair has declared in official statement that “Catholics should feel free in good

conscience to receive any of the vaccines currently available...for the sake of their own health and the common good.” My friends, all three vaccines have proven to be safe and effective in combating COVID 19, and only by being vaccinated in great numbers will we realize the herd immunity that is essential to ending this pandemic.



So my message to all of you is very simple...it is not a sin to receive any of the vaccines...in fact it is an act of charity that could help protect others whom you encounter each day! **Get vaccinated...it is an act of love!**

UPDATE ON COVID-19 Archdiocesan protocols...For the concern and respect for all Catholics in the Archdiocese of Hartford, Archbishop Blair announced and requested on August 7th, that all those attending Masses and other events be strongly encouraged to resume the wearing of masks due to the rise in the virus infections in our State. I personally think this is a wise and prudent decision and highly recommend ALL to wear a mask.

Important Information...last weekend an announcement was made in Christ the Bread of Life Parish in Hamden that will impact me in the coming weeks. I share the following announcement that will be in their parish bulletin this weekend with you so you are aware of this additional responsibility I will have temporarily:

“As was announced by Monsignor Shanley, Vicar for Clergy for the Archdiocese of Hartford, at all the Masses last weekend, our Pastor, Father Anyanwu is on a personal leave.

During this time Father Eduar Gutierrez, from Most Holy Trinity in Wallingford and Our Lady of Fatima in Yalesville, will be in residence here as Temporary Parochial Vicar and attend to the pastoral and sacramental needs of our parishioners. Father Jeffrey Romans, Dean of Deanery #6 and Pastor of Saint Bridget of Sweden in Cheshire, will be the Temporary Administrator and deal with financial and administrative matters. Please pray for our Pastor and for these two priests who are serving us at this time.”



This is meant to be short-termed assignment to assist this parish in a time of need. With Father Eduar there to handle the day-to-day ministry to the parishioners, and with the continued assistance here of Father Federico, I am confident this additional assignment will not effect the quality of ministry you have come to experience and deserve in the weeks ahead.

As you may be aware, the parishes of Hamden are currently in the process of merging all into one parish similar to what we did here in Cheshire back in 2017. Please pray for all involved in this process and for the people of Christ the Bread of Life Parish.

Ask Father

Dear Father: Jesus said "ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and the door will be opened for you." (1) Are these synonyms or is there a progression here? (2) How do we carry this out in our life (besides praying)?

Dear friend in Christ,

Thanks for this question. I really like that you are engaging with Scripture.

- 1) I have always thought of them as synonyms. They all speak to me of a soul that is **actively searching for God, not passively drifting through life**. There's a big difference. God responds to those who are hunting for him. I recommend checking out a Commentary to see what the great saints and theologians thought of this passage as well.
- 2) Yes, by trusting. Trusting means letting go of the need to be in control. It also means not manipulating events, circumstances and people to try make everything happen the way we want. It means a posture of surrender and confidence that the Lord will take care of everything.

Today is the Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

For our Gospel today we hear the conclusion of the "Bread of Life discourse" in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. In the preceding verses, which we have heard proclaimed in our liturgy over the past few weeks, we have heard Jesus explain that he is the Bread of Life, given so that those who believe may have eternal life. This discourse follows the miracle in which Jesus fed more than five thousand people with five barley loaves and two fish. As Jesus has been teaching these things, John's Gospel describes a murmuring crowd unable to accept Jesus' words. In today's Gospel, the crowd has dwindled in number, and John no longer references them, or the Jews. Instead John describes the questioning of those considered to be Jesus' own disciples.

Today's Gospel first records the response of those in the crowd who are described as Jesus' disciples. Just as the larger crowd had struggled with Jesus' teaching, these disciples also cannot accept Jesus' words. Jesus is said to know about their murmuring. He responds by acknowledging their unbelief and by reiterating that only those chosen by the Father will follow Jesus to the end. John's Gospel reports that many of those who had been Jesus' disciples ceased to follow him at this point. The number of people following Jesus dwindled from a crowd of more than 5,000 to only 12 people. And it is to these Twelve that Jesus now turns his attention.

Simon Peter's response to Jesus' question as to whether those closest to him will also leave, reminds us of the reports of Peter's confession of faith in the Synoptic Gospels. Peter announces, on behalf of all the Twelve, that they have come to believe all that Jesus has taught about himself: Jesus is the one from God in whom they have found the path to eternal life.

This conclusion of the Bread of Life discourse focuses on personal faith in the life of Christian discipleship. Each person must make his or her own judgment about who Jesus is and in doing so determine the way of life that he or she will follow. God's grace invites us to be Jesus' disciples, but each person must respond to the grace of God and confess as his or her own the belief that Jesus is the one from God. This faith then commits us to the path of life, leading us to eternal life.



Saint of the Week

Saint Joseph Calasanz

Feast Day: August 26th

Bio: Saint Joseph Calasanz was born on September 11th, 1556 in Aragon, Spain. He was extremely well-educated, studying both canon law and theology while in seminary. While he had a position of power within the Church waiting for him, he left it all behind to open a free school for deprived children in Rome. They received an influx of children, and soon needed larger facilities. Popes Clement VIII and Paul V both aided the school financially, and soon other schools were opened. More and more men were drawn to this movement, and Joseph soon established a religious community: the Clerks Regular of Religious Schools, also known as the Piarists or the Scolopi. He was appointed Superior for life, a great honor! Joseph’s work did not go unchallenged, as many opposed educating the poor for fear of greater social mobility. Many within the Church sought to discredit the Piarists, and Joseph actually died aged 92 in the midst of these investigations. Thankfully, the good name of his order was restored after his death. Saint Joseph Calasanz, pray for us!

Apologetics 101: New Series!

The Hard Sayings of Jesus

This week we begin a new series exploring some of the difficult and controversial sayings of Our Lord.

“If the world hates you, remember it hated me first.” - John 15:18

- It can be uncomfortable to hear Jesus speak of hatred. And yet we know from painful experience that the world around us is filled with it.
- The Christian life is the process by which we empty ourselves of hatred and do our best to transform the world into the love, peace and joy of the Kingdom of God.
- Yet, the culture, as Jesus points out, has always been hostile to the Gospel and always will be.
- This is because the Gospel calls us to conversion, to change, to repentance. And people do not want to change.
- Jesus goes before us in all things. He experienced the hatred and wrath of the world when he was rejected, despised and eventually crucified.
- If we are to be his followers, we too will experience the hatred and rejection of the world. We must make a fundamental decision in those moments – **do we want to gain favor with the world or with God?**
- Let’s take a look at our lives. Do we try to downplay our beliefs so as not to make other people uncomfortable? When was the last time we experienced hatred for our Christian faith? **If we have not, perhaps we are not living our faith as boldly as we are called to.**


