Happy Easter! We continue to bask in the glory of what we celebrated last weekend, namely, the resurrection of Jesus Christ! He is Risen! Alleluia!

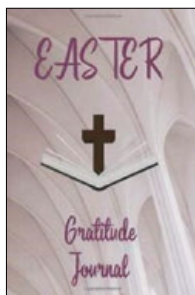

This weekend we celebrate, as we do every year on the Sunday following Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday.

This devotion is a popular devotion in the life of the church and perhaps it is part of your own regular prayers. This devotion was initiated through the writings of now Saint Faustina, a young Polish nun, who sought to remind others that God is merciful and forgiving and we too must show mercy and forgiveness. This is what the Church has always taught through scripture and tradition, but through Saint Faustina's writings we are called to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone — especially the greatest sinners. The message of mercy is that God loves us — all of us — no matter how great our





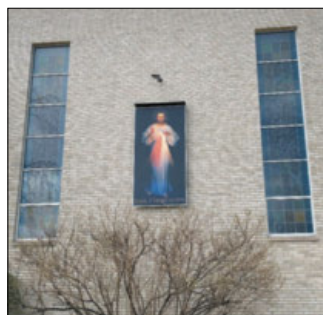
sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

We will have two special experiences this Divine Mercy Sunday.

First, we welcome Bishop Juan Miguel Betancourt, Auxiliary Bishop of Hartford, as the main celebrant of our 10:30AM Mass. Bishop Betancourt was ordained as auxiliary bishop of Hartford on October 18, 2018. We are pleased to welcome him for a visit to our parish family. Welcome Bishop Betancourt!

Second, we will join together at 2PM for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which will conclude with the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3PM. There will also be the opportunity for confessions during this time. There is a Plenary Indulgence attached to the Chaplet of Divine Mercy for Divine Mercy Sunday which can be offered for another person or even someone who has died. A Plenary Indulgence is the cancellation of ALL temporal punishment that we owe to God due to our sins! To receive a Plenary Indulgence, you must go to confession, receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the pope. That should be done in the days leading up to the feast. Then, on Divine Mercy Sunday, you must “in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus.”

I wish to also publicly thank Father Ed Nadolny and the Good News Fund for the recent addition to our North Campus of an outdoor image of Divine Mercy. You may have noticed it over the past couple of weeks since it was installed on the Saturday of Palm Sunday weekend. But then again, you may not have if you weren't paying attention as you drove into our parking lot. Many who came to work last week did not notice it until I mentioned it and pointed it out. Father Nadolny, through his Good News Fund, has generously donated an outdoor painting of the Divine Mercy and we have put it up on the side of our Saint Bridget Church. Here it is in this photo.



A special word of gratitude to those who worked so hard on the Fridays of Lent to provide our annual Lenten Suppers. A very big thank you to Heather and Ed LaFrance who coordinated and made these Lenten Suppers happen once again. After two years of not being able to offer them it was such a joy to be back together on the Fridays of Lent to enjoy a simple supper and then come together for the Stations of the Cross.



I know many hands make light work and many hands were chipping in each week to assist in preparation, in the kitchen, and in cleaning up. I am especially grateful to our young people from the Confirmation Program who served our parish family those Fridays in a variety of ways and for showing us the generosity of spirit that exists in our young people today. You inspired me and for that I thank you!



HELP NEEDED to assist orphans at Orphanage #1 in Lodz, Poland which currently has over 40 children from Ukraine. If you would like to “adopt” a child in this orphanage we have a list of items that are needed and particular sizes for them as well. We have a parishioner who is willing to coordinate this effort and all you need to do is call the rectory office and we will give you her name and number. She is working with a network in New Britain who will bring packages to Poland on a regular basis so we will provide a location for drop off here and then we will get the items to the location in New Britain for packaging and shipping. You can (and it would be great) send items on more than one occasion forming a bond with the children. Items needed include: t-shirts, jeans, socks, light jackets, sweatpants, track suits, sandals, flip flops, sneakers, under garments, shorts, bathing suits, swim trunks, hats, baseball caps, vests, blankets, hair ties, earrings, umbrellas, phones, tablets, iPads, earbuds, wrist watches, and sunglasses.

As always, remember to pray for vocations, pray for our young people, pray for our parish families and ask God's blessings as we strive to build His kingdom here. Please know that I am praying for you, and I ask for your prayers for me, that together through the intercession of Saint Bridget of Sweden, our Patroness, and Blessed Michael McGivney, and united in the Eucharist, we will reflect the presence of Jesus to the world. Please pray for me and know I am praying for you! Continued prayers for all to know and experience the joy, the peace, and the hope of the Risen Christ! Since today we are still in the Octave of Easter, I say, once again, Happy Easter!

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday

Today's reading, from the Gospel of John, is proclaimed on the second Sunday of Easter in each of the three Sunday Lectionary cycles. This should alert us to the significance of the encounters with the resurrected Jesus described in this reading. This Gospel combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas, the disciple who doubted.

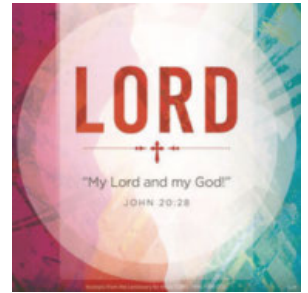
Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit but in bodily form. We do not know exactly what this form was like. Earlier in John's Gospel, when Mary of Magdala first encountered the risen Jesus, she did not recognize the figure standing before her until Jesus spoke to her. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples walking on the road to Emmaus did not recognize Jesus until he broke bread with them. We know from readings such as today's that in his resurrected body, Jesus was no longer bound by space; he appeared to the disciples in spite of the locked door. And yet, on this resurrected body, the disciples could still observe the marks of his Crucifixion.

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun. As Jesus was sent by God, so too does Jesus send his disciples. This continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit binds us together as a community of faith and strengthens us to bear witness to Jesus' Resurrection.

Jesus' words to his disciples also highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness and reconciliation are gifts to us from Jesus. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share these with others. This is another essential aspect of what it means to be Christ's Church. The Church continues Jesus' ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation.

Thomas, the disciple who doubts, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of disciples. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples. It is part of our human nature to seek hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death is, indeed, the same Jesus who was crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative who obtains this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who had died. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed for we have not seen and yet have believed.

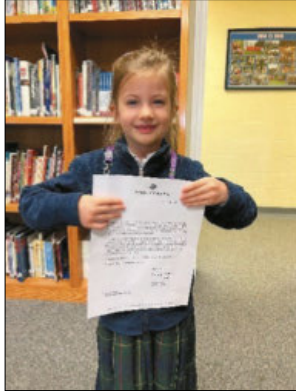

the enduring call to love *a pastoral letter against racism*

Pope Francis released the Encyclical *Fratelli Tutti* in 2020. We, a small group of parishioners, met to read and discuss the Pope's letter addressing fraternal respect and love for all. We want to spread his message.

Pope Francis teaches us that "each act of love towards a neighbor is an outward movement of God's grace in the world that unites and moves us to foster a true sense of social friendship, which values each human person." FORMED in FAITH

Welcome back to Formed in Faith! This week is the first in a 7-week series we're starting about the Sacraments. **It occurred to us recently that it's never a bad idea to have a refresher on the matter of the Sacraments!** Did you know that only specific types of bread and wine may be transubstantiated into the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, or that the change of a single word can invalidate a Baptism? Join us on this journey to learn the ins and outs of the Sacraments!

We're starting with the first Sacrament that Catholics receive: Baptism. This is timely, as we just welcomed our RCIA candidates into the Catholic faith in Baptism at the Easter Vigil Mass last weekend! **Baptism is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation, along with the Eucharist and Confirmation.** In Baptism, we are initiated into the relationship of Christ's love.

The Sacrament of Baptism pardons our sins, rescues us from the power of darkness, and brings us to the dignity of God's adopted children. **Once we are baptized, we are truly God's children.** But what does it look like? What's required for someone to be baptized? And how does it all work?

The vast majority of Catholic baptisms are performed on infants. All who are baptized must have at least one godparent. **A godparent must a) be at least sixteen years old b) be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic, and c) not be the parent of the one to be baptized.** Pretty simple requirements, right?

There are a couple of technicalities and exceptions; call the Parish Office at 203-272-3531 to schedule your child's Baptism or if you've been asked to be a Godparent! But let's assume the godparents are all set, the parents have attended their Baptism prep class, and the date is all set and ready to go. **What needs to happen on the actual day?**

At the Baptism itself, the celebrant welcomes the child (as presented by the parents and godparents) at the entrance of the church. After the parents and godparents affirm that they will raise the child Catholic, there is a pertinent Gospel reading. Following this, all present pray a series of intercessions for the one to be baptized.

This is followed by a prayer of exorcism (yes, that kind of exorcism). The celebrant asks the Lord to cast out the power of Satan and set the child free from original sin. **The child is then anointed with the Oil of Catechumens, blessed olive oil that is consecrated during the Chrism Mass each Holy Week.** This is one of three sacred oils used in the Sacraments; more on the others later!

After this, the celebrant blesses the Baptismal water, and we come to the renunciation of sin and profession of faith (which we all echo when we renew our Baptismal vows, just as we did this past weekend). **The parents and godparents make these vows on behalf of the child, because infants can't talk!** Okay, this is it. We've made it to the moment of Baptism.

At this point, the celebrant pours water over the child's head three times, saying "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The child is then anointed with Chrism, another of the three sacred oils mentioned earlier (**symbolizing the Holy Spirit's choosing of the child as one of God's adopted children**).

Finally, the child is clothed in a white garment as a symbol of purity and their newfound Christian dignity. **The parents then light a candle from the Paschal Candle on behalf of the child, symbolizing the light of Christ that now lives in them.**

This has been the first of seven deep dives into the Sacraments. **We'll see you next week, when we take a hard look at Reconciliation!**

Ask Father

Dear Father: Why do we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday?

Dear friend in Christ,

One week after the Easter Triduum, Catholics celebrate the feast of Divine Mercy.

Divine Mercy Sunday concludes the Octave of Easter, and focuses on Christ's gift of mercy for the whole world. St. John Paul II said it is "the Easter gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to humanity." It is a gift that God has given out of love for all of us.

Divine Mercy Sunday is a day of prayer when we ask the Lord to renew our trust in His merciful love, so that we might live it more fully in our lives. Our willingness to make sacrifices out of love for Him in return for all that He has suffered for us helps us to understand how His mercy is to be shared with all.

The feast was promoted by St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who kept a diary in the 1930s of Christ's private revelations, telling her of His message of mercy. She wrote that she first saw a vision of Jesus on February 22, 1931. He had rays of mercy streaming from His heart. Christ told her to have an image painted to represent the vision and to write below it, "Jesus, I trust in you!"

St. Faustina died of tuberculosis in 1938 at age 33. St. John Paul II canonized her in 2000 and declared Divine Mercy Sunday a worldwide feast day. Two years later, he granted a plenary indulgence for those who participate in the devotion. St. John Paul II was canonized on the feast of Divine Mercy in 2014.

To receive the graces of the plenary indulgence on Divine Mercy Sunday, along with the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Holy Communion and prayers for the intentions of the pope), the faithful, while in a state of grace and detached from venial sin, are asked to take part in the prayers and devotions the Second Sunday of Easter held in honor of Divine Mercy in any church or chapel, or else they should recite the Our Father and Creed before the Blessed Sacrament adding a devotional prayer to our Lord.

Catholics also are encouraged to pray the novena of Divine Mercy, which begins Good Friday and ends the Saturday before Divine Mercy Sunday; to pray the Divine Mercy chaplet; and to be merciful toward others through words, actions and prayers.

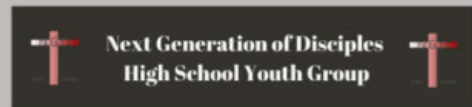

Saint of the Week: *Saint Peter Chanel*

Bio: Saint Peter Chanel was born in France in 1803. Contrary to popular belief, he did not own a popular fashion and perfume brand! From a young age, he had an interest in mission work. He became a priest as a young man, and quickly made an impact by reviving a parish in a “bad” district. At the age of 28, he joined the Society of Mary, the Marists. He taught in seminary for five years, but eventually made his way to Western Oceania for mission work. The bishop of the area left Peter and another Marist on Futuna Island northeast of Fiji. He promised to return in six months...but was actually gone for five years. Peter worked extremely hard to learn the local language and adjust to life on the island. Despite severe poverty and difficulty making headway with the locals, he always remained serene, gentle, patient, and courageous. When he was able to convert the local chieftain's son, the chieftain became angry. He had Peter murdered in 1841, but it didn't have the desired effect! Within two years of the Saint's death, the whole island had become Catholic. Peter was canonized in 1954 and is renowned as the first martyr of Oceania. Saint Peter Chanel, pray for us!

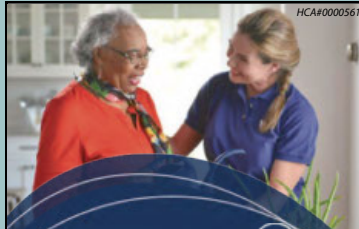
