From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ:

One of the greetings that we can use to begin Mass is taken from today's Epistle: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." We praise the God who has revealed Himself as a Trinity, a communion of persons. Communion with the Trinity is the goal of our worship. But do we really understand what the Trinity is all about?



This weekend we celebrate Trinity Sunday...officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity." It is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event. On Trinity Sunday, Christians remember and honor the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday is celebrated the Sunday after Pentecost, and lasts only one day, which is symbolic of the unity of the Trinity.

The Preface for today is so powerful and beautiful at the same time:

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation,

always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For with your Only Begotten Son and the Holy Spirit you are one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance.

For what you have revealed to us
of your glory
we believe equally of your Son
and of the Holy Spirit,
so that, in the confessing of the true and
eternal Godhead,
you might be adored in what is proper to
each Person,
their unity in substance,
and their equality in majesty.

For this is praised by Angels
and Archangels,
Cherubim, too, and Seraphim,
who never cease to cry out each day,
as with one voice they acclaim:
Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts...

The Trinity is a mystery, that is a reality above our human comprehension that we may begin to grasp, but ultimately we will only know through worship, symbol, and faith.

We can never fully understand the mystery of the Trinity, but, as the Preface above so clearly articulates, God is three Persons in one Nature, "you are one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person but in a Trinity of one substance." The three Persons of God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—are all equally God, and They cannot be divided. Today we praise our God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The end of the school year in the

coming days brings the excitement of summer and a lesson for us all...as I typically tell our students in St. Bridget School at the end of the year, summer is a time to relax, and enjoy some fun, but it is not time off from being a disciple. Summer is always a good time for each of us to wind down a little, to enjoy some time outside, to visit with family and friends, and to simply "be."

Summer brings long days and lots of sunshine, and that is great for all our outdoor activities but we must never forget that we are always students. We are always learning:

- 1. pick up a good book and read it at the beach or out on your deck or in your hammock.
- 2. stay in touch with the world news through your iPad or any tool of modern technology.
- 3. and above all observe the example of those around us; emulate those things which you admire about them, and learn from their misgivings.



AND REMEMBER that we are disciples of Jesus all year, IN-CLUDING THE SUMMER! Summer can be a sort of spiritual retreat for those who have the time to enjoy some peace and quiet and spend time reflecting on our lives. Perhaps grab a spiritual book to read over the summer by the pool. But please never take a break from

being a follower of Jesus, never forget that your words and actions are to reflect His presence in the lives of those around you, and never forget to attend Mass throughout the summer so that you can be spiritually fed by the Word of God and His Body and Blood in the Eucharist each Sunday. I know a lot of people travel during the summer, but please make the effort to make Sunday Mass, or daily if you can, a part of your summer experience. If you are traveling, a great tool is www.masstimes.org to help you locate a Mass near where you are. My prayer for each of us throughout these coming weeks of summer is that we are rejuvenated physically and spiritually so that when the busyness of our Fall schedules starts up again we will have that strength we need to persevere.



Speaking of Summer I wish to thank those that came out for our First Ever Blessing of the Bicycles and Scooters last Sunday afternoon. I know more and more people begin riding their bikes and scooters once they are home from school so it was fitting we held the blessing just before the summer break. 






Ask Father

Dear Father: How did you choose the path you did? How have you come to know God? And how does anyone know for sure that God is calling them to do what they do or what their vocation is?

Dear friend in Christ,

The key to this question is what we call "discernment." Discernment is a very important topic for young people as they look to their future, so it's a very good question.

The first thing that is very important to know is that God does have a plan for your life and for everyone's life. Sometimes it can be a bit frightening to be open to this plan or even to think about what God may want of you. But the first step to a very happy life is to know that whatever God wants of you is the best way to a life of happiness!

This requires trust and surrender. I think this is hard because we often want to know all we are getting into before we agree to it. But with God, we have to know and trust that He will take care for us and that we will be happy with whatever He has in mind for us. So our prayer may look like this: "Lord, whatever you want of me I will do! I do not know your will right now but I say yes to it anyway and trust that you will show me your plan when I need to know it." In fact, saying yes to God's will before we fully understand it is often the key to having God begin showing us what He wants.

Personally, I found in my life that as God showed me His plan for my life it was something that was slow and consistent. What I mean is that, as I looked back at my time of discernment, I found that I slowly and steadily grew in a conviction of where God was leading me. There were no loud and clear signs for me. Rather, it was His gentle Voice that slowly became clearer and clearer over time. In the end, when I was ready to make the final decision to become a priest, I decided that my conviction was so strong that it must be God Who led me there.

As for knowing for sure, I do believe it's possible to know with deep certitude. It's just a matter of silencing the many thoughts and ideas we have and letting go of all our own preferences and letting God's will take over. All I can say is that you will know it when that happens. In fact, this sort of certitude, which we call the gift of faith, can ultimately become much clearer to us than anything else if we only let it speak to us!

Ryan will attend Mitchell College this fall majoring in Sports Management and Business.




Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

The readings for today can be found at https://bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/061222.cfm

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.



Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all.

For these past eight weeks, we have brought forth quotes from both Pope Francis and the Bishops of the United States which encourage us to Social Friendship and challenge us to end racism. Where do we go, as individuals and as a Church, from here?

"To work at ending racism, we need to engage the world and encounter others—to see, maybe for the first time, those who are on the peripheries of our own limited view. Knowing that the Lord has taken the divine initiative by loving us first, we can boldly go forward, reaching out to others. We must invite into dialogue those we ordinarily would not seek out. We must work to form relationships with those we might regularly try to avoid. This demands that we go beyond ourselves, opening our minds and hearts to value and respect the experiences of those who have been harmed by the evil of racism. ... Love should then move us to take what we learn from our encounters and examine where society continues to fail our brothers and sisters, or where it perpetuates inequity, and seek to address those problems (Open Wide Our Hearts, pg. 23)."

"In imitation of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, 'we want to be a Church that serves, that leaves home and goes forth from its places of worship ... in order to accompany life, to sustain hope, to be the sign of unity... to build bridges, to break down walls, to sow seeds of reconciliation' (Fratelli Tutti Paragraph 276)."

FORMED in FAITH

What happens now? After seven weeks of Sacramental articles, we have to actually come up with a new topic? We've almost forgotten how! Fear not...the Catholic faith never ceases to provide us with worthy topics for discussion. Over the next few weeks, we'll be breaking down and explaining the Nicene Creed!

Also known simply as the Creed, the Nicene Creed was the result of the First Council of Nicaea, an Ecumenical Council of the Church called by Emperor Constantine I in the year 325. Its purpose was to establish a definitive teaching on the divine nature of Jesus Christ, God the Son, and His relationship to God the Father. Pretty important stuff, right?

In the first few centuries after Jesus' Ascension, there were a lot of disagreements amongst the faithful about the finer points of theology and doctrine. Many heresies, such as Arianism and Gnosticism, needed to be officially denounced and stamped out through doctrinal teachings! The First Council of Nicaea was one of 21 official Councils convened throughout the centuries to address such matters.

Okay, now that we have some background on the Creed, let's start breaking it down. This should all sound familiar... after all, we say it every Sunday at Mass!

The Creed begins, "I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible." This establishes a number of important principles:

- 1) There is one Trinitarian God.
- 2) The first Person of this Trinity is the Father.
- 3) He is almighty.
- 4) He created heaven, earth, and everything therein.

While these make sense to us now, these were some pretty radical ideas when they were first posited! The very idea of monotheism, the belief in one god, was a radical shift from what the rest of the world practiced. Think about it! Egyptian mythology, Norse mythology, Greek and Roman mythology, Hinduism, and the vast majority of other ancient religions practiced polytheism, the belief in and worship of multiple gods.

The idea of a Trinitarian God, or one God in three Persons, is even <u>more</u> unique. While a small number of other religions such as Hinduism have some concept of a divine trinity, it is quite rare. We believe that all three Persons of the Trinity are equally worthy of praise, blessing, adoration, and glorification.

God as the Almighty Creator is also a central aspect of our faith. He is not just powerful...He is ALL-powerful. There is nothing He cannot do; as Jesus says in both Luke and Matthew's Gospels, "with God all things are possible." This is a comforting belief; when we face immeasurable odds, when we feel we cannot go on, when our burdens are too heavy for us to bear alone, we can rely on the One Who Can Do Anything to rise to our defense and help us to weather the storm.

This has been a pretty significant bit of Catholic theology, and we're just getting started! Join us next week when we touch on the section of the Creed dedicated to the second Person of the Trinity: God the Son. See you then!



Saint of the Week: Saint Albert Chmielowski

Bio: Saint Albert Chmielowski was born near Krakow (where Father Piotr is from!) in 1845. He was born to a wealthy family and was the eldest of four children. In 1864, the Polish people revolted against Czar Alexander III of Russia. Albert joined the fight, receiving serious wounds that forced the amputation of the left leg. He was a talented painter, and he honed his skills in Warsaw, Munich, and Paris. Albert eventually returned to Krakow and became a Secular Franciscan. After a couple years of ministry, in 1888, he founded the Brothers of the Third Order of Saint Francis, Servants of the Poor. They worked frequently with the homeless and lived completely on alms. Later on, a community of Albertine sisters was established as well. Albert died in 1916, was beatified in 1983, and was canonized in 1989. Saint Albert Chmielowski, pray for




