# From the Pastor's Desk

#### Dear Friends in Christ:

First and foremost...on this Father's Day Weekend I offer to all fathers, grandfathers, uncles, Godfathers, and all who fill the role of father in other people's lives a very HAPPY FATHER'S DAY! Please know that each of you are in our prayers. We celebrate each of you today!



For some in our parish we realize that this is a difficult day; some may be alone on this day away from their children, others may be mourning the recent death of their father or grandfather, and others may be struggling with the reality of not being able to be a father. I assure all of you of our prayers as well.

Today let those of us who fulfill the role of father in any way seek the grace we need to take our roles seriously and pray that Saint Joseph help us each day to make a difference in the lives of others.

May Saint Joseph, foster father to Jesus, pray for all of us. Happy Father's Day!

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, otherwise known as Corpus Christi Sunday. This Feast goes back to the 13th century, but it celebrates something far older: the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion at the Last Supper.

It is the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ—the source and summit of our lives as we learned from the Second Vatican Council—which we celebrate each time we come together for Mass, that provides us the grace and strength we need to live as followers of Christ in our world.

We know that during the persecutions of the early Church, the disciples would meet in the Catacombs to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass because the Eucharist was the source of their strength to remain steadfast in their newfound faith.

And so for us today the Eucharist, the Mass, is the very center of our lives as Catholic Christians; it is the source and summit of our Christian life. At Mass we are fed with the Word of God and nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ so that we can go forth glorifying the Lord by our lives, and announcing the Gospel in our own words and deeds.



Today's feast can help us to grow in understanding of the Eucharist and our reverence for this great sacrament. We certainly need this reminder, don't we. We have the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle behind our altar, but many times we ignore His Presence and treat the Church merely as a meeting place—it is so much more than that. And what makes us

different from so many of our fellow Christians is that we believe that the Blessed Sacrament is not merely a symbol. No. We believe it is the very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

As Catholics, we believe the Eucharist truly is the Body and Blood of Jesus. We believe this because Jesus said so, Himself. And we know that when God speaks, stuff happens. Let there be light. I baptize you. Telitha Cum – little girl, get up. In Chapter 6 of John's Gospel Christ tells us, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

And then He says, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you."

Some of the disciples had a hard time believing this and walked away. But Jesus did not stop them to say that they took Him too literally, nor did He say they misunderstood Him. No he didn't soften his words or back down so that people wouldn't get upset. Rather, He repeated it again, and then amplified it.

What Jesus gave to those first disciples who did not walk away scandalized by his words was the very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ—that which we modern day members of the Body of Christ receive week after week in an act of thanksgiving and sacrifice. And every time we come to Mass we are present at the foot of Calvary – the place of Christ's sacrifice – which is why we often refer to what we do here as: "The Sacrifice of the Mass."

The Eucharist unites us with one another in community, and it strengthens us on our journey to the kingdom. Like all sacraments, it is a

sign that God is with us on our pilgrim journey.

St. Augustine said "Believe what you see, see what you believe and become what you are: the Body of Christ." When we say "Amen", we are saying "Yes! I do believe! I do believe this is the Body and Blood of Christ and that I will be the Body of Christ to others."

As we gather here today our bishops throughout the country have called for "a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission 'for the life of the world." My friends, we MUST deepen our own devotion to the Eucharist—by prayer, faithful attendance at Mass, and Eucharistic Adoration. Let each of us pledge to find ways to grow in deeper appreciation for and reverence to the Holy Eucharist.

Finally, a word on vocations! As you know the dioceses in our state are in dire need of vocations to the priesthood. At a recent gathering for the Knights of Columbus, I addressed those gathered on this very topic and shared with them some sobering statistics about the reality of life in the Church here in America.

Among those statistics was the reality of the priesthood in America. There are a third fewer priests today in this country since 1965 despite a 68% increase in Catholic membership (a number primarily so high due to parishioners coming from the Hispanic cultures). The median age of priests is now 59, and around 40% are over the age of 65 making retirement and death the top reasons for the decline.

And, as we prepare for this Eucharistic Revival in our country, we must remember what Saint John Paul II wrote in his letter to priests on Holy Thursday of 2004, and let these words sink in, "there can be no Eucharist without the priesthood, just as there can be no priesthood without the Eucharist."


THE TIME IS NOW to start truly encouraging young men to consider that the Lord may be calling them to the priesthood. Priests do not

drop out of the sky, they come from among families, and your families please God.

If we love the Eucharist, and the Church, then we will do all we can to encourage young men we encounter everywhere to consider what the Lord is calling them to do with their lives, and to consider the very possibility that God may be calling them to the priest-hood of Jesus Christ.

We cannot wait for others to encourage them, we must encourage them, we may be the only person to do so, so don't hesitate.

I can tell you firsthand it is a privilege to serve as a Priest! Every day to be able to bring the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ to others in the Eucharist, to see their desire for the Lord, to be able to preach His word, to baptize His sons and daughters, to minister to those in need of His mercy or His healing, and to simply be the presence of Christ in the everyday lives of His people is such a mystery, such a miracle, such a privilege, and such a joy!



I have been thinking seriously about a prayer which was on my Ordination Prayer Card and one that I often reflect on in my personal prayer. It is the prayer known as "A Priest" by Jean-Baptiste Henri Lacordaire, a Dominican priest from the 1800's. It goes like this:

To live in the midst of the world without wishing its pleasures;
To be a member of each family, yet belonging to none;
To share all suffering; to penetrate all secrets;
To heal all wounds; to go from men to God and offer Him their prayers;
To return from God to men

to bring pardon and hope;
To have a heart of fire for Charity,
and a heart of bronze for Chastity
To teach and to pardon,
console and bless always.
My God, what a life;
and it is yours,
O priest of Jesus Christ.

Oh how I hope and pray I have lived these words out in my priesthood these nineteen years, and I hope and pray to be able to continue to live these words out in the years of ministry to come!

I also hope and pray that God will send many more young men who seek to do His will and live their lives in accord with this prayer and in service to His people.

- Your bank or credit card information is stored on secure servers contained behind firewalls and other defense systems to prevent unauthorized access.




#### Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today, the second Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate a second solemnity, which marks our return to Ordinary Time. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At one time, this day was called *Corpus Christi*, Latin for "the Body of Christ." In the most recent revision of the liturgy, the name for this day is expanded to be a more complete reflection of our Eucharistic theology.

The feeding of the 5,000 is the only one of Jesus' miracles to appear in all four Gospels. Luke places it between Herod's question, "Who is this about whom I hear such things?" and Peter's response to Jesus' question about who he thought Jesus was: "You are the Messiah of God." In Luke the feeding is not the result of Jesus' compassion for the crowd but is instigated by the disciples. They wanted Jesus to send the crowd away to town. Instead Jesus tells the disciples to give them some food on their own.



The passage is meant to remind us of two feedings in the Old Testament: the feeding of the Israelites in the desert and Elisha's feeding of 100 people with 20 loaves in 2 Kings 4:42-44. It is also connected to the institution of the Eucharist. As in the Last Supper accounts in Matthew, Mark, and Luke and in Paul's account in 1 Corinthians 11:23-24, Jesus takes bread, looks up to heaven, blesses the bread, breaks it, and then gives it to the disciples. In using this exact language, Luke is reminding his readers that in this miracle Jesus is doing more than feeding hungry people as God did for the Israelites and the prophet Elisha did as well. The bread he gives is his body, which he will continue to give as often as the community breaks bread in remembrance of him in the Eucharist.

#### Ask Father

Dear Father: I spent one year in the occult, but I recently became a Christian, and I regret my past. I found out about the mark of the beast, and I am worried now, because the mark is supposed to be on the right hand or the forehead, and last year I got a tattoo on my right hand. Will I not be forgiven for that?

Dear friend in Christ,

Praise God for your conversion and His work in your life! Thankfully, there is no sin or evil that we choose that is beyond the Lord's mercy, provided that we turn away from it with sorrow and humbly ask for His forgiveness. The Lord can surely forgive your decision to get a tattoo that is evil or contrary to the Christian faith.

#### Two suggestions:

- 1. I have heard of similar situations where people have had the tattoo removed OR had an artist "Christianize" the current tattoo. This can relieve you of a permanent reminder of the Occult and instead, you'll have a reminder of Christ the Victorious King who conquers all evil.
- 2. If you are Catholic, I highly encourage you to visit with your local priest in order to renounce your past involvement with the Occult. We have some beautiful and powerful prayers that were specifically written to break any bonds, promises, or oaths that may have invited demonic influence in a person's life. This is a powerful spiritual remedy and can provide a greater experience of the freedom that the Lord Jesus desires for your life.

#### FORMED in FAITH

It's time for Part 2 of our series on the Creed! If you missed last week's edition, go back and check it out (past bulletins can be found at <a href="https://www.cheshirecatholic.org/bulletin">https://www.cheshirecatholic.org/bulletin</a>). There's some important info in there about where the Creed comes from, why it was written, and the reason that we say it each Sunday at Mass.

Now that you've read Part 1, you'll remember that the Creed begins, "I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible." We discussed that this establishes that there is one Trinitarian God, the first Person of which is the Father. It also establishes that He is almighty, and that he created heaven, earth, and everything therein.

We now move into the largest section of the Creed: the section on God the Son. We'll be splitting this section into two parts; here's what we'll focus on this week: "I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

Whooooo boy, there is a lot to unpack there! **This section is the largest for two reasons.** Firstly, as we spoke about last week, there was a popular heresy in the early centuries of the Church (Arianism) that denied the Divinity of Christ. In addition, God the Son is the Person of the Trinity who came to us in human form (Jesus Christ), so it is natural that He be the Person about whom the most is known to us.


So, what does it all mean? What's established here? Great questions! We'll tell you:

- 1) The second Person of the Trinity is the Son.
- 2) The Son is "of the same substance" as the Father, and no less worthy of praise or worship.
- 3) The Son was instrumental in the creation of all things.
- 4) The Son came to us in human form as Jesus of Nazareth to atone for our sins by His death.
- 5) Jesus' mother, Mary, was a virgin; He was miraculously conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Clearly, a Trinitarian God has three Persons, and the second Person is God the Son. The second point, that the Son is "of the same substance" as the Father, is a direct repudiation of Arianism. The third point also reinforces the Son's primacy, as "through Him all things were made." The last two points deal with the Incarnation, one of the two most significant events in human history (alongside Jesus' Resurrection).

The importance of the Incarnation cannot be overstated. God came down from heaven and walked among us. **He spoke to us in His own voice, shared our human experience in all its pain and imperfections, and showed us the path to heaven.** He even surrounded Himself with Disciples who would spread the news of His miracles and teachings, which is why we have the Gospels!

This is why we stand when the Gospel is proclaimed. We show our gratitude for the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and our respect for the words that He spoke to us. After all, how could we not revere words spoken from the very mouth of God? As an excellent praise and worship song says, "Oh, what a Savior... isn't He wonderful?" See you next week for Part 3!

#### Saint of the Week: Saint Joseph Cafasso

Bio: Saint Joseph Cafasso was born in 1811 in Italy. From a young age, he loved to attend Mass and stood out for his humility and prayer life. He was ordained a priest and spent many years teaching at a seminary in Turin. He taught fervently against Jansenism, an overly scrupulous spirituality obsessed with sin and damnation that was popular at the time. He encouraged the priests he instructed to join the Secular Franciscans, remain devoted to the Blessed Sacrament, and receive daily Communion. Joseph was widely revered as an excellent preacher. confessor, and prison minister. One of his pupils went on to become Saint John Bosco, and Joseph was the one who urged him to establish the Salesian order. Saint Joseph Cafasso died in 1860 and was canonized in 1947.




