For Your Reflection

The Times We Have Been Given To Live In

Timothy O'Donnell, President of Christendom College, Instaurare, Winter 2021-22

Alexander Solzhenitsyn, most famous Soviet dissident, outspoken critic of communism and great prophet of our time, once observed, "The problem of our time is very simple. Men have forgotten God." That truly is the problem of our time. But as our founder, Dr. Darren Carroll, would always say, "Truth exists, the Incarnation happened." Any course of study or interest that we undertake in which God is denied or ignored is exactly like a ship without a rudder. It will be subject to every shift of the wind, host of pressures and will just move with current ideologies. It will move you into the shallows. We're living in an age which recent popes have characterized as "a culture of death," "a dictatorship of relativism," and a "throwaway culture." It started by throwing away Dixie cups and ends up throwing away babies. We have very little respect for tradition in our culture and society. We sacrifice our unborn children to gods of convenience and licentiousness, and we dishonor the memory of our parents and our grandparents by rejecting tradition.

Despite our challenges, I recall the wise words once preached by St. Augustine: "No we must not grumble, my brothers, as the apostle says. Some of them murmured and were destroyed by serpents. Is there any affliction now endured by mankind that has not endured by our fathers before us? What sufferings of ours can even bear comparison with what we know of their suffering? You may think past ages were good, but only because you are not living in them. Have we forgotten the flood? The calamitous times of famine and war whose history has been recorded precisely in order to keep us from complaining to God on account of our own times. Just think what those past ages were like. Is there anyone who does not shudder to hear or to recall them? Far from justifying our complaints about our time, they teach us how much we must be thankful." So wrote the great doctor of grace as the Roman Empire crumbled and vandals swept across Spain and were entering into North Africa to attack his city.

These are the times we have been given to live. We have been brought together as a community, part of God's providence, to achieve something great together. The good news is that we don't need to seek greatness alone. Bolstered in friendship and prayer, we have each other and, most importantly, we have Our Lord. French Jesuit, St. Claude Colombiere, confessor and spiritual director of St. Margaret Mary wrote: "All spiritual writers agree that the best sign you can have of solid devotion is amendment of life and perseverance in good. I began to amend my life by frequenting Holy Communion, after having tried every other way and failed. When I went rarely to Holy Communion, I had no end of bad habits and imperfections which I deemed insurmountable. I uprooted these by multiplying my communions. Everytime I omitted frequent Communion, I felt my weaknesses more. When I received communion again, I felt fervor re-enkindle in my heart. No fervent soul has ever relaxed who did not first leave off receiving the Holy Eucharist."



The "club" was approved by the Moline-Coal Valley School District Board of Education on Jan. 10 and the first ASSC meeting took place on Jan. 13. According to reports: "Parents at an Illinois elementary school are expressing concern after the local school board approved a new extracurricular club for children that will be led by members of The Satanic Temple and held in school facilities.
