Quotes of the Week

“The pandemic forced us to confront two unavoidable dimensions of human existence: sickness and death. In doing so, it reminded us of the value of life, of every individual human life and its dignity, at every moment of its earthly pilgrimage, from conception in the womb until its natural end. It is painful, however, to note that under the pretext of guaranteeing presumed subjective rights, a growing number of legal systems in our world seem to be moving away from their inalienable duty to protect human life at every one of its phases...

“The resulting economic crisis has highlighted another illness of our time: that of an economy based on the exploitation and waste of both people and natural resources. All too often, we have neglected solidarity and other values that make it possible for the economy to serve integral human development rather than particular interests. We have also lost sight of the social significance of economic activity and the universal destination of goods and resources...

“May the current situation likewise be a catalyst for forgiving, or at least reducing, the debt that burdens the poorer countries and effectively prevents their recovery and full development.”

- Pope Francis, in his annual address to the members of the Holy See diplomatic corps on Monday.

“No, I wasn’t scared because I wasn’t scared to die. I’m happy to be with you, but I would wish to be somewhere else – join my big brother and my grandfather and my grandmother [in heaven].”

- Sister Andre Randon, a religious sister in France who turned 117 years old this week and survived COVID-19, on whether she was scared of the virus. Last year, on her 116th birthday, she was asked if there was a recipe for living a happy life, and she answered: “prayer and a cup of hot cocoa every day.”

“Enrollment in Roman Catholic schools in the United States dropped 6.4% from the previous academic year amid the pandemic and economic stresses — the largest single-year decline in at least five decades, Catholic education officials reported Monday...

“Elementary and middle schools were harder hit with a collective enrollment decline of 8.1%, compared with a 2.5% decline for secondary schools. Pre-kindergarten programs saw the steepest drop, 26.6%.”

“Declines in enrollment at the primary grade levels may lead to a delayed but significant impact on secondary school enrollment within the next five to 10 years, proving potentially disastrous for secondary school viability,” the [National Catholic Education Association] said in an analysis of the new data.

“Over 200 Catholic schools closed or consolidated at the end of the 2019-2020 school year. On average, approximately 100 Catholic schools close or consolidate – a rate that is six times higher than the average number of new Catholic schools (approximately 15 per year). Elementary schools made up a disproportionate share of school closures;

186 of the 209 (89%) Catholic schools that closed or consolidated were elementary schools.”

ASH WEDNESDAY 2021

Here are a few things to keep in mind as we approach Ash Wednesday on February 17, which marks the beginning of the season of Lent:



- Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation – in 2021, or ever.
- Masses will be celebrated at 7am, 9am, Noon, and 7pm. Registration for Mass is required. Please use the parish web site to make a reservation or call the parish office.
- This year, in keeping with Vatican and diocesan pandemic guidelines, ministers will not be imposing ashes on anyone's forehead. Instead, after the sermon, everyone will be asked to remain at their pew and kneel. At this time, a minister will walk through the empty row in front of you and sprinkle ashes on top of your head. (This is the regular practice in some parts of the world.)
- This year, nothing is said by the minister when ashes are being sprinkled, and there is no response.
- Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat for Catholics. (In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat). For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is allowed to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
- Traditionally, the entire season of Lent is a time of penitential observance, when Catholics are called to devote more of their time to fasting, prayer, and charity.
- A final note from Fr. Jared: plant-based burgers, such as Burger King's Impossible Whopper, do not contain meat and are therefore perfectly acceptable foods for Catholics to eat in good conscience on any day of abstinence!

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Everybody has a place at the table, and nobody deserves to feel inferior, unworthy, unwanted, or marginalized. It is not part of God's vision. Jesus came to heal, make things whole, set things right, and restore relationships. No one is to feel unwelcome or alienated from the community. Whether we like it or not, this message is at the core of the Gospel. It makes a lot of sense when you think about it. Perhaps this is why people kept coming from everywhere to listen to Jesus speak and to be in his presence. He made perfect sense. Most of us have no issue buying into this vision. We run into trouble, however, when we fall into the trap of privilege and power. We diverge from God's vision when the powerful begin to control who is entitled to wholeness and inclusion, and greed becomes a driving force. Prejudice and entitlement have no place in the kingdom of God, and even the most needy and hurting among us are worthy of the compassion Jesus desires to offer. There are no easy solutions to the world's dilemmas. But one thing is for certain, no one can be singled out, excluded or mistreated. Everyone matters.

CATHOLIC SCHOOL TUITION AID

Our parish policy is to allocate catholic school tuition assistance to parishioners using a needs-based formula. Aid is considered for students in grades K-12. This year we will again utilize the services of FACTS which is the same process used by the schools in the diocese and most other parishes to allocate their financial aid. We hope by utilizing FACTS we can more efficiently and effectively assist our parishioners in obtaining the appropriate level of aid. Families need to only fill out one FACTS application per family for all children and all schools. When completing the application select Christ the King Rectory Kingston as recipient of the information. The application can be found at www.online.factsmgt.com, and must have a COMPLETED status by March 31.



REFLECTION

The Gospel of Life is often hard to swallow, and we would rather keep those we consider unclean, different or unfixable in a place by themselves. It is hard to see them with us, but they deserve to be. There is far too much violence in this world and the result of that violence is the assault on human life. Many are forced to leave the place they call home in search of safer ground, finding few if any along the way who will help them. How different today's Gospel story would be if Jesus gave in to what was politically correct at that time. The leper would have been turned away and a soul, already beaten down by disease and fear, would have experienced an even deeper wound. Jesus wouldn't have captured much attention from anyone, nor would he have mirrored the Father's compassion and love.

Where do we stand with all of this? Do we at least understand that God's vision is often in conflict with the vision put forth in our world and even the one we advance ourselves? There is no doubt that it is incredibly challenging to find a place for everyone at the table. This challenge is compounded when the systems of operation and structure that are so ingrained in us affirm power and privilege rather than inclusivity and justice. Everything really goes askew when the powerful begin to control who is entitled to wholeness and inclusion, and greed becomes a driving force. Prejudice and entitlement raise their ugly heads and we find ourselves with quite a mess. It's time to admit that things have been a mess for a very long time. The mess needs to be healed, not by erasing it but by allowing God to touch it and make it whole. We need to bring God back to the center of life where God belongs. There are no easy solutions to the world's dilemmas. But, knowing that wholeness, healing, and dignity are worthy pursuits, we can more confidently labor to achieve God's vision. ©LPi




FRIENDLY VISITOR MESSAGE

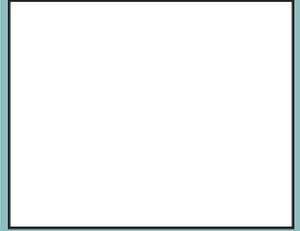
