OFFERTORY PROCESSION RETURNING!

The offertory procession (presentation of the bread and wine by participants at Mass) will return as part of the Sunday Mass on the **weekend of July 24/25**. This prelude to the Eucharistic Prayer reminds us that during the consecration, our simple gifts of bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Please consider participating when you come to Mass, especially if you are offering a special intention for that Mass. Just go to the main doors of church and take the fish symbol. (It will be hanging on the wall above the gift table) At the end of the Creed, go to the gift table, return the fish, and get the bread and wine to bring forward, which precedes the collection. The ushers are advised, in the event that no one has taken the fish, to ask someone to participate.

NOTE: this is a new registration procedure for ALL students.



Quotes of the Week

“In these days of being hospitalized, I have experienced once again how important good health care is, accessible to all, as it is in Italy and in other countries. Free health care, that assures good service, accessible to everyone. This precious benefit must not be lost. It needs to be kept! And for this everyone needs to be committed because it helps everyone and requires everyone’s contribution... I would like to express my appreciation and my encouragement to the doctors and all the healthcare workers and staff of this and of other hospitals. They work so hard!”

- Pope Francis, speaking to crowds last Sunday from the balcony of a 10th floor window at Gemelli University Hospital in Rome, one week after undergoing intestinal surgery. He has since returned to the Vatican and resumed his ministry.

And it is difficult even for me to say how to live with it now. You’ll have to atone your whole life for the sin you committed — that you thought about yourself and not another person.”

“Catholic dioceses that are struggling to recover from decades of communist persecution will receive \$3.56 million for ministry and outreach thanks to the generosity of American Catholics to the annual collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe that is taken up in most dioceses each winter.

“In June, the USCCB Subcommittee on Aid to the Church in Central and Eastern Europe awarded 208 grants to dioceses in 23 nations that were once behind the Iron Curtain.

“[Bishop Jeffrey M. Monforton of Steubenville, Ohio, said:] ‘Catholics who have given to this collection are reaching out in love to aid their brothers and sisters who suffered so much for their faith and are helping a new generation to grow spiritually in very difficult circumstances. Thanks to those gifts, parishes are being renewed, critical social ministry is taking place, and bonds of love are formed between Catholics on opposite sides of the world.’”

“All male Christians in Fantio and Dolbel, two towns in the Tillabéri region in South West of Niger Republic, have been wiped off by Jihadists. The terrorists also burnt a statue of Virgin Mary... desecrated the Blessed Sacrament by throwing the sacred hosts on the ground, [and] finally set the church on fire. This is the third parish in this part of Niger that has been abandoned due to terrorist attacks.”

“Religion provides a space to deal with our doubts. The Scriptures and the history of the saints are full of stories of people of faith who had doubts. So often people who allow for no doubt in their lives, as if doubt is a sign of weakness, rigidly hold on to points of view only because they would be shaken if they admitted uncertainty. Religion allows us to be human, and humans are full of doubts.

“Religion also brings us together in community, easing some of our deepest fears that we are all alone. Community life is where burdens are shared, important moments are celebrated, we experience the comfort of depending on one another and we learn most about ourselves.

“The Irish novelist James Joyce famously wrote that Catholic means, ‘Here comes everybody.’ Today, Chicago parishes celebrate Mass in no less than 25 languages. Our diversity as a faith community mirrors the profile of our immigrant nation and provides us with an experience of a new kind of unity that values, rather than fears, the differences each of us brings to community life. In a word, religion practiced by a community marked by diversity serves as a leaven in society, allowing the best in each person to be appreciated by all.”

“A gang of alleged fraudsters who dressed as cardinals to trick victims out of millions of euros have been caught in an undercover sting operation by police officers disguised as priests. Italy’s Carabinieri police set their trap after receiving reports of the five fraudsters tricking at least €1.7 million out of victims in 20 different scams. Dressing as cardinals and priests, the men would offer business owners large loans on generous terms, all backed by the Vatican bank. All they requested upfront was a cash guarantee, only to vanish the moment it was paid.”

ANNUAL PARISH OUTREACH

As God's people, we believe that you can't count your blessings without sharing them. This is why the parish dedicates a portion of our income each year to helping charities and agencies in our community that help those who are in need. Our financial support helps worthy not-for-profit organizations whose mission is rooted in the Gospel and consistent with the Catholic tradition. We are now preparing to set aside next year's funds, and we are asking for your help. Parishioners are invited to nominate non-profit agencies that provide food, shelter, clothing, or medicine to the poor. Charities that are nominated are fully vetted by the Stewardship Committee and Diocesan Social Ministry Office, then referred to the Finance Council. If you would like to nominate a charity, see the guidelines below.

1. The agency must be not-for-profit, and its goals and methods must be consistent with the mission of the Gospel and consistent with Catholic tradition.
2. The agency should be responding directly to the clearly identified primary needs of the individuals: food, shelter, clothing, and medicine.
3. There must be a demonstrated management structure in place to administer and oversee the use of funds.
4. The majority of funds will support local and state agencies, but national and international agencies will also be considered.
5. Nomination forms are available at the church entrances. Only completed nomination forms will be accepted and reviewed for consideration.


REFLECTION

There's an ordinary pine grove located on a tree farm not too far from town where life's stresses and demands seem to melt away. It is here that all that seemed so important out there no longer is and one can get lost in the rows of trees and majestic beauty. God is here and all is good. We need to connect with the Divine Source of all that is in order to understand what it is we are doing and why we are doing it. Otherwise, things stop making sense and bitterness can overcome one's spirit. It's okay to play once in a while and to discover that place of profound life and peace. We can go back, ready, and eager to listen, to help, to heal, to cry, to embrace, and attend to all that is asked of us. But, having let go of the distractions in that deserted place we will have a renewed sense of purpose. We will know better Who it is we serve and what we are meant to do. It will all be clearer now that we have been Divinely touched and refreshed.


