

Quotes of the Week

In May of 2020, the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee for Religious Liberty began tracking incidents of arson, vandalism, and other destruction at Catholic sites across the United States. October 10 marked the 100th incident: satanic and other hateful graffiti scrawled on the walls before Sunday Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Denver, Colorado.

Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan of New York, chairman of the Committee for Religious Liberty, and Archbishop Paul S. Coakley of Oklahoma City, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, issued the following statement:

“These incidents of vandalism have ranged from the tragic to the obscene, from the transparent to the inexplicable. There remains much we do not know about this phenomenon, but at a minimum, they underscore that our society is in sore need of God’s grace.

“In all cases, we must reach out to the perpetrators with prayer and forgiveness. True, where the motive was retribution for some past fault of ours, we must reconcile; where misunderstanding of our teachings has caused anger toward us, we must offer clarity; but this destruction must stop. This is not the way.

“We call on our elected officials to step forward and condemn these attacks. We thank our law enforcement for investigating these incidents and taking appropriate steps to prevent further harm. We appeal to community members for help as well. These are not mere property crimes – this is the degradation of visible representations of our Catholic faith. These are acts of hate.”

What they want is a welcoming community in which people are kind to each other, a pastor who seems to care, and a liturgy which, for a moment, lifts them out of their day-to-day concerns and puts them in a different space, one in which they can encounter God and try to feed the better angels of their natures.”

“It is both dispiriting and perplexing, with all the fears and distress bearing down on the families and the people of the world, for the bishops to be entangled with the political divisions that continue to roil the country. Instead, they say, it has become a networking opportunity for families looking to improve their fortunes, secure endowments of gold necklaces and make advantageous connections, sometimes with local power brokers who have dozens of godchildren. God parenting, church officials said, had fallen to earth as a secular custom . . .”

Tuesday, November 2, we celebrate the Feast of All Souls. Our remembrance of our deceased relatives and friends on the feast of All Souls comes from a place of conviction and Christian belief that they have joined the company of the holy ones in the presence of God. More so, we believe that their difference-making presence in our lives and the lives of others, through their virtuous Christian life, was based on faith in Christ through their baptism. Let us turn our memorial of the faithful departed into an occasion to renew our baptismal commitment to God through Christ and be present to one another in love and compassion. “I was a stranger and you welcomed me.”

In the next few months, approximately 300 people who were evacuated from Afghanistan in August will be making a new home for themselves here in Rhode Island. These are folks who left their homes and homeland to escape the Taliban, and they're about to enter a whole new world. We can imagine how excited and hopeful they are about their future and a new life here in America. Naturally, they are also anxious as the unknown awaits them.

Aware of the call of our Good Teacher, who will say to those who are welcomed to Father's house on the day of judgment: “I was a stranger and you welcomed me,” our parish will be providing financial and material support to the refugees.

First, we have offered to help families with rent and utilities. As the Diocese works with government officials and the numbers and needs become clearer, the parish finance council will add a line item to our budget that will reflect our generous support to our new neighbors from across the world. Once these funds are set aside, the monthly commitment amount will be published in the bulletin.

This funding will come directly from what you already give and commit to the weekly collection.

In addition to our work with the Diocese of Providence to provide financial support, we will also be partnering with Dorcas International of Rhode Island, which has begun a campaign to collect material goods that the evacuees will surely need as they start from scratch, having left everything behind in Afghanistan except the clothes on their backs! On the weekends of November 6/7 and 13/14, the Social Action Committee will sponsor a drive to collect necessities. Please consider donating any of the following new items. Items (in new condition) can be dropped off in the church hall before or after weekend Masses.

Hygiene items: shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, bars of soap, deodorant, floss, lotion, combs, hairbrushes, shaving cream, razors, feminine pads

Baby supplies: bottles, baby food, diapers, crib sheets, baby wipes, diaper rash cream, sets of clothes

Miscellaneous: basic tool kits, kettles, first aid kits, English dictionaries, umbrellas, electrical cords, outlet strips

Let's fill the church hall with these items, and fill our Afghan brothers and sisters with hope and love!

“**Project Warm Welcome**” is a campaign to collect and distribute winter clothing for the recently displaced Afghanistan refugees. Ava Grosso, a senior at The Prout School, will collect the donations from Christ the King that will be delivered to the base in November. Fort McCoy has taken in 13,000 Afghan evacuees with the capacity to house up to 50,000 total. This collection is also November 6/7 and 13/14.
