

Important Information for Parents with Children Entering Grades 1-8 in September (Families in Faith & Sacramental Preparation Registration)

GRADES 1-8: FAMILIES IN FAITH

Who Needs an Orientation?

Parents whose children are entering grades 1-8 and were not in our Families in Faith Program this past year. You will need to register as a parishioner with the parish if you have not already done so. You may register your family online.

When Does Online Registration Begin for Families who were in the program last year?

Monday, July 26. You'll find the registration link on our website.

Registration deadline is September 10. Late fee of \$50 goes into effect on September 1.

GRADE 2 (usually): FIRST EUCHARIST PREPARATION

Who's eligible to enter our First Eucharist Preparation Program so they can receive First Eucharist and First Reconciliation in 2022?

Children who have been baptized AND have already completed one year of religious education or family faith (here or elsewhere). Most of the eligible children will be entering 2nd grade in September. *These families must also register for our Families in Faith Program (see above).*

GRADES 7 & 8: CONFIRMATION PREPARATION (A TWO-YEAR PROCESS)

Please be aware that your child cannot begin YEAR 1 of Confirmation Preparation in 7th grade unless he or she has completed religious education or Family Faith Formation covering grades one through six inclusive (here or elsewhere).

Students beginning YEAR 1 of Confirmation Preparation (usually 7th grade) do not need to attend an orientation.

Students eligible to begin YEAR 2 of Confirmation preparation: Please be sure that the Religious Education Office has you registered correctly for Confirmation Preparation AND Families in Faith. This paperwork is NOT available online.

2022 Mass Intentions Book Opening Soon

The Parish Mass Intentions Book will initially be open for requests for the year 2022 by filling out the request form between **August 30th thru September 10th**. Those forms will be gathered, and every effort will be made to give everyone their requested dates in the book.

NOTE: The mass intentions requested during this time may be shared by more than one parishioner.

We will close this process for the week of September 13th through the 17th to record all those intentions.

- After September 20th, reserving Mass Times in the book will be based on **availability (first come, first served)**. Please keep in mind that Intentions for any given week may be reserved for a loved one for Liturgical Items such as the Altar Candles, Sanctuary Lamp, Altar Bread and Altar Wine.
- For Mass intention requests from August 30th to September 10th, we are accepting up to **3 per Mass**. The Liturgical Items are restricted to 1 intention (1 request) per week.
- As a result of this new opening method there will be **no limit as to the number of intentions submitted** during the August 30th thru September 10th period.
- **We are no longer publishing the name of the person requesting the Intentions** (just the name of the intention).
- Please pick up these request forms on the bulletin table at the exits of the church or from the Parish Office. It will reflect those dates/times that are exceptions for intention requests (holidays, holy days). It would be greatly appreciated that you print as **CLEARLY** as possible to prevent any misspellings.
- These forms can be placed in the collection basket, mailed, or dropped off at the rectory office.

If this process does not work for your needs, please feel free to meet with Fr. Ed so we can understand how to serve you better. Thank you.



GOSPEL MEDITATIONS

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time
August 8, 2021

The lens through which we view life makes a difference. It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.


But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives come from this one Source of Love. This is the only true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story.

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary
August 15, 2021


