
WELCOME

LITURGY

CELIAC DISEASE

Our liturgical documents state the: "The bread for celebrating the Eucharist must be made only from wheat". For those with Celiac disease, this is a challenge. Over the past few years, some host-making companies have developed a "low gluten" host which contains less than .01% gluten. If you have gluten intolerance and would like to receive the "low gluten" host, you will find them on the credence table marked "Low Gluten Hosts". You may place the host in the pyx on the table labeled LG. See the priest or deacon before Mass to alert him that you will be receiving a "low gluten" host. At communion you then receive a "low gluten" host. The "low gluten" hosts have been improved over the past two years and taste and look like the real wheat hosts. Should you have any questions, please see Fr. Carrier.

COMMUNION

Do you have trouble coming forth to receive Eucharist at Communion time? If you do and would like to receive the Eucharist from where you are seated in the church, please notify Fr. Carrier or Deacon Bill when you arrive. Communion will be brought to you at the conclusion of Communion.

THANK YOU FOR COMING ON TIME

Each portion of the Mass has a specific role in fostering our union with Christ. Please don't sell yourself short, and please don't shorten your encounter with Jesus in the Sunday Mass. Visitors always comment very favorably on our prayerful worship which is the most precious hour of the week. As we consider what sacrifices we can make for the Lord, might we not make a special effort to come into church before Mass begins, and to remain until the priests and ministers process out at the end of Mass. Couldn't we try to give to the Lord those few extra minutes?
