2021 TAX STATEMENTS

On January 17th tax statements will be sent to parishioners who have given \$250 or more in the weekly collection during the 2021 year, using your offertory envelopes. Those parishioners who give through our *FaithDirect*, our e-giving, will be sent a tax statement directly from *FaithDirect*. Or you may download it from your *FaithDirect* account.

SACRAMENTAL CERTIFICATES AND SPONSOR LETTERS

Sacramental Certificates (baptism, first communion, confirmation, matrimony) can be received with a *written re*quest from the individual (providing they are not a minor). In the case of minors (up to the age of 18), parents or guardians will need to submit a written request. Request forms for certificates are available online (www.chcparish.org) or in our Parish Office during office hours (Monday-Thursday 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.). No request will be taken by phone.

Those needing godparent letters for baptism, or sponsor letters for confirmation will also need to submit a written request with the detailed information. Letters will be given for registered parishioners. These will be sent directly to the parish where the baptism or confirmation will take place. These request forms are available as well online (www.chcparish.org) or in our parish office.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

With the continuing surge of COVID cases we have returned to some our safety procedures and practices for everyone's safety and comfort.

Face masks are required for all attending any mass (ages 5 and older), regardless of your vaccination status.

Also, face masks are required when visiting our parish offices.

We have installed air purifiers along the back wall of the church. In so doing, standing along the wall is not permitted since it impedes the proper functioning of the air purifiers.

We also continue to sanitize the entire church after each with our sainting equipment and chemicals.

I again remind you, if you are not feeling 100% - STAY home, until you feel better. Or if you fall ill once you have arrived for mass, please leave and go home to rest. We will certainly miss you. However, this is the BEST practice for your safety and others.

We continue to live-stream ALL of our masses for your convenience. If you aren't able to join in person, join us through live-stream and stay connected to your parish family.

PARENTING POINTERS


It's cold outside. Have a memory party inside. Pull out old photographs and enjoy. Maybe even organize those lost photos.

Answer:



Believing Signs.

At first glance, these readings lead us to bride and groom, gifts, and marriage. But there are important things underneath, important truths at the heart of these proclamations. God has not and will not abandon us (Isaiah). Charisms, that is, gifts of the Spirit, are given to everyone to use for the common good, not just one's own good (Corinthians). The miracle of water to wine is the first of many signs of the Messiah, the Christ (John). God's signs and good activity are everywhere.

What evidence do I have that God is with us still?

Christ is active all the time. What little and big signs of this goodness can I be part of?
