❧ A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ❧



Dear Friends,

This Christmas, I would like to share with you a reflection which I have found very moving and insightful. It is adapted from a talk by one of my favorite spiritual writers, the late Mother Mary Francis, P.C.C., who was Prioress of the Poor Clare Monastery of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Roswell, New Mexico. I offer these thoughts to you for your own prayer during these days of Christmas:

The Second Reading of the Christmas Mass at Dawn says, "The kindness and generous love of God our Savior appeared" (Titus 3:4). This is what must appear in our lives - kindness and love. This is what we are called to give to God by giving it to one another, and we can never give of it too lavishly. The wonderful paradox, the miraculous paradox, is that the more we give kindness and love, the more we have to give. We do not exhaust our small resources; on the contrary, it is only by giving of them that we increase them. The more we are kind and loving to God, the more kindness and love we have to give.

Christmas must mean more to us every year, and we must not be afraid of immersing ourselves in its joy. It is the most natural thing in the world to be deeply moved at the manger, at the sight of that small Person who is the Redeemer of the world, and that this was the way he chose to come, out of all possible ways of coming. He chose this way of sacrifice; his first expression of love was in the context of sacrifice. And he is showing us that it is this way that our love is to be expressed always. Let us hold this before our eyes so that we can show by our way of living that truly here also, in our lives, the kindness and love of God have appeared.

This is the mystery of the Incarnation: that he took on our human nature, and that we are to give back to him what he took from us. He came to our level to lift us to his level.

So let us dwell on these things, as together we enter into the mystery of Christmas. Let the kindness and love of God appear here, in our own lives, and he will take care that they will radiate out into the world - even as from a most obscure cave they did radiate throughout the world, and are meant to be continued in each of us as a new incarnation of his love.

With these thoughts, together with Father Bochanski, Deacon Toole, and the Parish Staff, I extend to you and your family my warmest best wishes for a joyful and peaceful celebration of the birth of Our Lord this year, together with a promise of a very special remembrance of you and your intentions at the Masses of Christmas.

Next Sunday's Gospel:

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Next weekend's Sunday Gospel reading is provided here, so that we can think and pray about it, and be ready to receive it into our minds and hearts when it is proclaimed at Mass.

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.*" Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

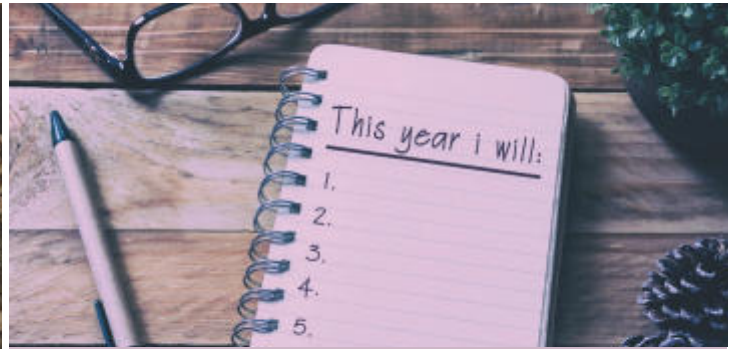
