



S A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR S

Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate the beautiful feast day of the Baptism of the Lord. This brings the Christmas Season to a conclusion, though our Nativity scene will remain in place until February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, or "Candlemas." This is because, for many centuries, the Christmas Season extended for 40 days, until Candlemas, and the Nativity scene in our church is so beautiful that we can all enjoy it for a little longer.

In any case, as we move from the Christmas Season back to Ordinary Time, this weekend's feast gives us a chance to ask ourselves an important question Pope Francis has repeatedly asked everyone: Do you know the date of your Baptism?

Why? The Holy Father explains it this way:

To know the date of our Baptism is to know a blessed day. The danger of not knowing is that we can lose awareness of what the Lord has done in us, the memory of the gift we have received. Thus, we end up considering it only as an event that took place in the past – and not by our own will but by that of our parents – and so it has no impact on the present. We must reawaken the memory of our Baptism.

Baptism has a three-fold effect on our soul: it washes away the guilt of Original Sin, it makes us a child of God by adoption, and it incorporates us into the communion of the Church. For this reason, the day on which someone receives Holy Baptism is THE most important day of their entire lives!

Finding out the date of your Baptism is easy. Just call the parish where you were baptized, tell them the month and year of your birth, and they'll be able, fairly easily, to locate your name and the date of your Baptism. And then it's something to know and remember. All of us should know the date of our Baptism as well as we know the date of our birth. Many families mark the date of their children's Baptism with a cake or some small celebration with their family, such as a special dessert at dinner that day. That would be a beautiful way to ensure that our children know and remember the date of their Baptism as well.

Saint Augustine put it so succinctly and beautifully when he wrote, "What greater grace could God have given to man, than that the Son of God should

become the Son of Man, so that a son of man" (that's us) "could become a son of God? Ask if this were merited, ask its reason, ask its justification, and see if you will find any answer other than sheer grace."

Pope St. Paul VI, who was Pope from 1963 to 1978, in his encyclical letter *Ecclesiam Suam*, said this, which is something for us all to remember:

To be a Christian, to have received holy Baptism, must not be looked upon as something of negligible importance.

It must be something which thrills the baptized person to the very core of his being. May it be so for each one of us.

Do you know the date of your Baptism?



THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Next weekend's Sunday Gospel reading is provided here, so that we can think and pray about it, and be ready to receive it into our minds and hearts when it is proclaimed at Mass.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invit-

ed to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew -, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him. John 2:1-11
