I thank Father White for his beautiful homily, and I thank Dr. Claude Matalanis for designing the mechanism which dropped the rose petals at the end of the Mass, echoing the centuries-old custom of doing so at the Pantheon in Rome on Pentecost Sunday. I am most grateful to our wonderful team at the Parish Office for attending to the thousand-and-one logistical details that went into the weekend. Kate Gombos (as always) captured beautiful images of the celebration, and I thank Katrina and our musicians for the beautiful music at the Mass.

Most of all, I give thanks to God for calling me, unworthy as I am, to serve Him as His priest. Please pray for me, and please pray for the intention of new priestly vocations, especially from our parish and in our diocese.

Please **mark your calendar** and join us for next Sunday's **Corpus Christi Procession!** It will take place immediately following the 11:00 Mass. We live in an age when our Catholic Faith is increasingly marginalized, ridiculed, and dismissed. So this is one concrete opportunity to bear public witness to our Catholic Faith. We are **joyful** to be Catholic, and unashamed of our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

At the conclusion of the 11:00 Mass, the procession will begin. We will join our choir in singing Eucharistic hymns along the way. Servers will be continually incensing the Blessed Sacrament. And bells will announce to all the presence of the Lord as He passes by. The procession will go out from the front doors of the church, head south on Shelton Road, and then will turn west onto Center Road, reaching the N.I.A. Gazebo, where Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will be imparted. Then we will retrace our steps back to church, where a final Benediction will be imparted from our altar. It should take about an hour after Mass. But Jesus hung on the Cross for us for three hours! There will be cold water available in the lobby of the church after the procession for everyone.

The canopy which will be held over the Blessed Sacrament during the procession is nearly 150 years old, and was made by Fraefel & Co. in St. Gallen, Switzerland, which was one of the world leaders in ecclesiastical embroidery at the time. In the culture in which we live, beautiful liturgical objects in the service of the Sacred Liturgy sometimes provoke the ritual question: Does Our Lord really *need* something like that? The answer is: of course He doesn't need it! But - He *deserves* it.

The canopy is embroidered with Eucharistic images, as well as four lines taken from the Corpus Christi sequence, *Lauda Sion*, written by St. Thomas Aquinas over seven centuries ago:

ECCE PANIS ANGELORUM
FACTUS CIBUS VIATORUM
VERE PANIS FILIORUM
NON MITTENDUS CANIBUS.

Translated, this means
BEHOLD THE BREAD OF ANGELS
MADE THE BREAD OF THOSE ON THE WAY
[TO HEAVEN]
TRULY THE BREAD OF THE CHILDREN [OF GOD]
WHICH ON DOGS MAY NOT BE SPENT.

The last line is a reference to Matthew 15:26, in which Jesus said "It is not right to take the bread of the children and throw it to the dogs."

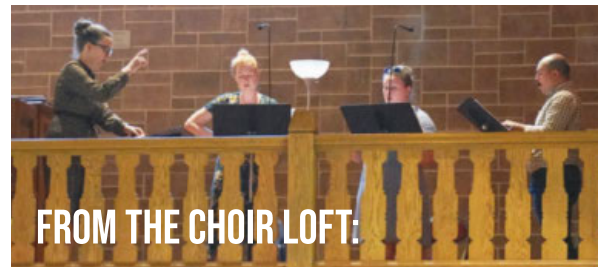

FROM THE CHOIR LOFT:

On this Trinity Sunday, we give praise to God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. In our Communion Hymn, *Firmly I Believe, and Truly*, we profess our faith in the Trinitarian mystery. This text was written by St. John Henry Newman, an English theologian, scholar, and poet. *Firmly I Believe, and Truly* is taken from "The Dream of Gerontius", which was Newman's longest poem, and written after he had converted to Catholicism from Anglicanism. "The Dream of Gerontius" follows the main character, Gerontius, through his dying moments, and his reawakening as a soul approaching judgment; much of the imagery used by Newman was inspired by Dante's Divine Comedy. At this point in the poem, Gerontius is unsure what the after-life holds for him. His friends are gathered around and praying for him, and Gerontius prays to God for mercy, making this final profession of faith before his death. In this setting of the hymn, Newman's Latin text in which Gerontius prays for mercy has been eliminated, leaving only the hymn of praise. This text has been set to many tunes, but this particular setting is to the tune SHIPSTON. It was set by Ralph Vaughan Williams who was responsible for collecting many English folk tunes, like this one, harmonizing them, and turning them into hymns for the Anglican church. Its lilting melody and harmonic structure in D major make it a fitting tune for such a profound hymn of praise.

NEXT SUNDAY'S GOSPEL: THE SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST [CORPUS CHRISTI]

Next weekend's Sunday Gospel reading is provided here, so that we can think and pray about it, and be ready to receive it into our minds and hearts when it is proclaimed at Mass.

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever." *John 3:16-18*

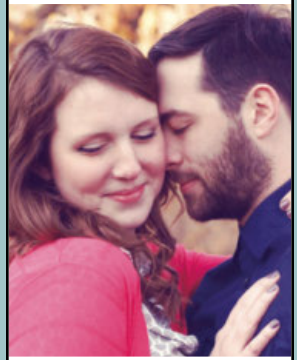

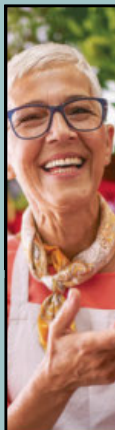

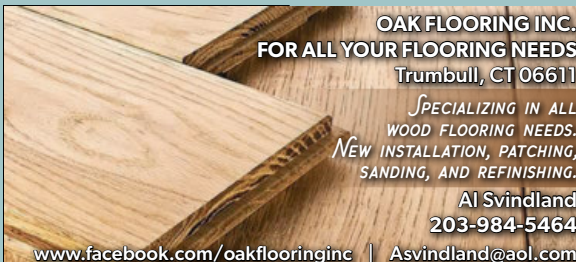
