

Dear Friends,

Advent is one of the most beautiful times of the liturgical year, but in our culture it tends to get lost as the world around us jumps right from Thanksgiving (or even right from Halloween) to Christmas.

This year, let's not allow ourselves to be cheated out of experiencing Advent authentically and well. Why? So that we will be able to appreciate and experience Christmas authentically, and not just superficially. Even more specifically, it is necessary to experience Advent well so that we will be able to know Christ more deeply, so that our capacity to return that love to Him will be increased and deepened.



For starters, the sheer rapidity of Advent reminds us how fleeting is human life, and how brief is our window for coming to know and love God, and how quickly passes the time in which we are given the opportunity to do all the good we can in this life. In this regard, St. Therese of Lisieux once famously said: "We have only the short moments of this life to work for God's glory. The devil knows this, and that is why he tries to make us waste time in useless things!"

The four weeks of Advent are also traditionally given over to thinking deeply about the four "Last Things," which are: *Death* (than which nothing is more certain), *Judgment* (than which nothing is more exacting), *Heaven* (than which nothing is more wonderful), and *Hell* (than which nothing is more terrible). The CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH explains: *Death puts an end to human life as the time open to either accepting or rejecting the divine grace manifested in Christ. The New Testament speaks of judgment primarily in its aspect of the final encounter with Christ in his second coming, but also repeatedly affirms that each will be rewarded immediately after death in accordance with his works and faith. The parable of the poor man Lazarus and the words of Christ on the cross to the good thief, as well as other New Testament texts, speak of a final destiny of the soul – a destiny which can be different for some and for others (CCC 1021).*

Bringing up the Last Things may seem at odds with the festive nature of this time of year. But a closer examination reveals that this is not the case at all. Here's why: until and unless we realize deeply and personally what Christ saves us *from*, and what it cost Him to save us (His life, and all of His blood), then we cannot even begin to understand His greatness, or what we owe to Him, or what Christmas truly is. Here's something else to keep in mind during these days of Advent: the first part of Advent (from today until December 16) is focused on looking ahead to and preparing ourselves for Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end," as we pray each Sunday in the Creed.

Once again, the CATECHISM explains this truth clearly: *The Last Judgment will come when Christ returns in glory.* Only the Father knows the day and the hour; only he determines the moment of its coming. Then through his Son Jesus Christ he will pronounce the final word on all history. We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvelous ways by which his Providence led everything towards its final end. The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death (CCC 1040). In the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each person's relationship with God will be laid bare. The Last Judgment will reveal even to its furthest consequences the good each person has done or failed to do during his earthly life (CCC 1039).

The second part of Advent (from December 17 until December 24) is focused on readying ourselves for a grateful remembrance of Christ's First Coming at Bethlehem on Christmas. So, at the outset of this brief but beautiful and terribly important liturgical season, the Church prays in these words, the Collect for the Mass of the First Sunday of Advent:

Grant your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet your Christ with righteous deeds at his coming, so that, gathered at his right hand, they may be worthy to possess the heavenly kingdom. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT.

Next weekend's Gospel reading is provided here, so that we can think and pray about it, and be ready to receive it into our minds and hearts when it is proclaimed at Mass.

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." Luke 3:1-6


