

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

In the year 1300, Pope Boniface VIII decreed the first-ever Holy Year, or Jubilee Year. In the seven centuries which have passed since that time, the Church has observed Jubilee Years with regularity: at first it was every 100 years, and then every 50 years, and now it is every 25 years.

So the last "ordinary" Holy Year was in 2000, opened by Pope St. John Paul II, and the next one will be in 2050, and so on. Sometimes there are "extraordinary" Jubilee Years too, such as 2016, which was the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, decreed by Pope Francis.

Each of the four major basilicas in Rome (St. Peter's, St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls) has a Holy Door which is opened only during a year of jubilee, and is bricked up at all other times.

Pictured here is the Jubilee Door of St. Peter's Basilica, which was opened by Pope Francis on Christmas Eve, 2024. It was my privilege to walk through this Jubilee Door earlier this month, and as I did so I carried with me everyone here at St. Catherine's.

So, what exactly is a Jubilee Year, why does it matter, and how can each of us enter into it, deriving spiritual benefit and renewal from it?


A Jubilee Year is a privileged opportunity for all the faithful to have an intensified experience of God's grace – God's divine life – at work within us and all around us.

Of course, it is up to each of us to enter into this opportunity for ourselves, and not let this privileged opportunity pass by without capitalizing on it.

The theme of Jubilee 2025 is "Peregrinantes in Spem" or "Pilgrims in Hope." Hope is something we could all use more of, especially given the dangerous and worrisome state of the world these days.

Hope must be distinguished from mere optimism. Optimism is the tendency to "look on the bright side" of things, presuming that everything will inevitably get better and better.

Hope, rather, as the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, is: "the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit. ... The virtue of hope responds to the aspiration to happiness which God has placed in the heart of every person; it takes up the hopes that inspire our activities and purifies them so as to order them to the Kingdom of heaven; it keeps us from discourage-



ment; it sustains us during times of abandonment; it opens up our heart in expectation of eternal beatitude. Buoyed up by hope, we are preserved from selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from charity. (CCC, 1817-1818).

One is the most beautiful reflections on hope ever written is Pope Benedict XVI's masterful encyclical letter "Spe Salvi" or "Saved in Hope."

I would suggest that a beautiful way of entering into this Jubilee Year whose theme is hope is to read "Spe Salvi" carefully, and bring it to your prayer. Speaking personally, it has been my practice to reread "Spe Salvi" every year since it was published in 2007. I am always deeply nourished and strengthened by it, and with each re-reading I am always struck by something new.

THE THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written: The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21
