S A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR S Don't Forget the Neediest this Lent!

Dear Friends,

The **three pillars of Lent** are prayer, almsgiving, and fasting, which are spoken of by Our Lord in the gospel passage we heard on Ash Wednesday.

Day by day of this holy season, we turn our attention and our priority to these, each of which is an necessary way of fulfilling the call of our Baptism, being faithful to Christ, and deepening our friendship with Him.





I'd like to focus today specifically on **almsgiving**.

"Alms" is an unusual word. Its origin is the Latin word eleemosyna, which itself derives from word Greek eleēmosunē, which means "compassion." Interestingly, the word "compassion" comes from the Latin "cum passio" meaning "suffering with." So, if we are compassionate to someone, we are suffering with them, we are a companion to them, we are helping to lighten their burden by showing them that they are not alone.

There are, of course, many ways to give alms, and there are many worthy recipients. Giving money to the poor does not replace actually getting our hands dirty and serving the poor personally, but sharing of our material resources is something good, and necessary, and beautiful.

During the season of Lent, our local Church, which is our diocese, provides us with a concrete opportunity for almsgiving in the Annual Bishop's Appeal. The money given to the Appeal does not go the Bishop personally or to the Diocese; it goes through the Bishop and the Diocese to those who are most in need.

I ask you to join me in supporting the charitable work of our Bishop and our Diocese this Lent by supporting the Annual Bishop's Appeal. Above is a QR code you can use in this regard if you wish. And we are deeply grateful to the 110 families who have already stepped up to help us with our goal. As of March 14, we have received \$53,586 from 110 donors bringing the parish to 39% of its \$136,300 goal.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Giving alms to the poor is a witness to fraternal charity: it is also a work of justice pleasing to God" (n. 2462).

And St. Leo the Great, back in the 5th Century, said: "Those who are unequal in their capacity to give can be equal in the love within their hearts."

LAETARE SUNDAY / THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT:

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" — which means Sent —. So he went and washed, and came back able to see.

His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is, " but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am."

They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet."

They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out.

When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him. *John* 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38


