

≪ A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ≪

The Instruments of the Passion

Dear Friends,

The days of the Lord's Passion are approaching. Next weekend, all the statues and images in church will be veiled in violet for Passiontide.

I'd like to highlight the painting in the Memorial Chapel of an angel holding the Instruments of the Passion, which are various objects associated in Christian iconography with the Passion of Christ. Each one of them is food for thought and prayer during these days of Lent. This painting is found on the left panel of the Sacred Heart triptych. (Both panels will be closed throughout Passiontide). The Instruments of the Passion, as depicted there, include:

The whip used by the soldiers when Our Lord was scourged at the pillar. **The Crown of Thorns:** Then Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged. And the soldiers wove a crown out of thorns and placed it on his head, and clothed him in a purple cloak, and they came to him and said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck him repeatedly. Once more Pilate went out and said to them, "Look, I am bringing him out to you, so that you may know that I find no guilt in him." So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple cloak. And he said to them, "Behold, the man!" (JOHN 19: 1-5)

The Cross on which Jesus was crucified

The Nails: Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your king?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, and carrying the cross himself he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha. There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus in the middle. (*JOHN 19: 15-18*)

The Holy Sponge, set on a reed, with which gall and vinegar were offered to Jesus. Some of the bystanders who heard it said, "This one is calling for Elijah." Immediately one of them ran to get a sponge; he soaked it in wine, and putting it on a reed, gave it to him to drink. But the rest said, "Wait, let us see if Elijah comes to save him." But Jesus cried out again in

a loud voice, and gave up his spirit. And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth quaked, rocks were split, tombs were opened, and the bodies of many saints who had fallen asleep were raised. (MATTHEW 27: 47-52)

The **Holy Lance** which with a Roman soldier (St. Longinus) pierced the side of Christ. But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs, but one soldier thrust his lance into his side, and immediately blood and water flowed out. An eyewitness has testified, and his testimony is true; he knows* that he is speaking the truth, so that you also may come to believe. (*JOHN 19: 33-35*)

The seamless robe of Jesus.

The dice: When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them into four shares, a share for each soldier. They also took his tunic, but the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from the top down. So they said to one another, "Let's not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it will be," in order that the passage of scripture might be fulfilled, that says: "They divided my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots."

An important detail to notice is that the dice (the "lots" cast by the soldiers) read out the numbers 3 – 2 – 4, which is an allusion to March 24, the joyful day in 2019 – six years ago this week – on which St. Catherine of Siena Church was consecrated to the worship of the living God.



THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT:

The sisters of Lazarus sent word to Jesus, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when



he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, "Let us go back to Judea."

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world."

He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, "Where have you laid him?"They said to him, "Sir, come and see." And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him." But some of them said, "Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?"So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb.It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the dead man's sister, said to him, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Jesus said to her,"Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?"So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you for hearing me.I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me." And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!"The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth.So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go."

Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him. *John* 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45


