

Dear Friends,

We have now reached Passiontide, which is the last and most intense phase of Lent. The violet veils hide the Crucifix from our eyes; hidden as well are the statues of the Saints. This ancient practice has its origins in the former liturgical calendar, in which, on this Sunday, the Gospel reading was taken from the eighth chapter of the Gospel of St. John, which says, in part:

"The Jews said to Jesus, 'You are not yet fifty years old, and you have seen Abraham?' Jesus said to them, 'Amen, amen I say to you, before Abraham came to be, I AM.' So they picked up stones to throw at him; but Jesus hid himself, and went out of the temple area."

Because of the hardness of heart of those who rejected Our Lord (which is all of us, at times, through sin) the Church recalls this event, and withdraws from our eyes the image of Christ crucified by veiling it, along with the images of the Saints, for the duration of Passiontide. The crucifix is unveiled after the Good Friday Liturgy of the Passion and Death of the Lord, and the rest of the images are unveiled just prior to the Easter Vigil.

The veils are of violet, which is the color of penance. This reminds us of the sufferings of Christ, together with our need for penance, in reparation for our sins. This veiling also conveys the deep sorrow which the Church feels over the suffering and death of her Divine Bridegroom, Jesus Christ.

Duncan Stroik, the architect for our Christ at the Center sanctuary project, completed just over six years ago, in an editorial in Sacred Architecture magazine, which he publishes and edits, wrote:

"In order to better prepare for Easter, we fast from images and sometimes instruments. For visual and aural people, this is a powerful shock to the system. Statues, paintings, and, in some places, even crucifixes are covered with purple fabric. The saints are there, in form, but we cannot see their image—they are veiled in mystery. It is the last penance of Lent: the giving up of images, which are, theologically, windows into the divine. And then with the Triduum, we do not just fast but we also strip the altar in preparation for the Crucifixion; and on Good Friday we come to church, but there is no Mass. All of this makes the Easter Vigil more spectacular: the Easter fire in darkness and then a single candle leading to a church full of candlelight and the reappearance of the saints, beautiful flowers, and iconography of the Resurrection."

This year's celebrations of Holy Week will be especially beautiful. On Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, nothing is more important than living those days with Our Lord in and through the Church's liturgical celebrations. Please mark your calendars, please plan to be with us as once again we enter into the days that changed the world.

HOLY THURSDAY VISIT TO THE SEVEN CHURCHES

April 17, immediately following the Mass of the Lord's Supper



Every year on Holy Thursday, the Mass of the Lord's Supper does not end as usual; instead, the celebrant, servers, and assembled faithful process with the Blessed Sacrament from the altar to a beautifully decorated repository usually located outside the church's sanctuary. This movement to the repository brings us into the moment at which Jesus and the Apostles left the Upper Room and moved to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Christ underwent his agony of anguished prayer.

At the Garden of Gethsemane, an additional suffering for Christ was that he found his disciples asleep during his hour of need. "He said to Peter, 'So you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak'" (Mt 26: 40-41).

Through the centuries, generations of Catholics, moved by Christ's haunting and poignant question, have responded to him and accompanied him in his agony by maintaining a vigil of prayer and presence with him at the repository, which represents the Garden of Gethsemane. There they are present before the same Christ, now in the Eucharist, who suffered in the Garden on Holy Thursday.




