Dear Friends,

Welcome to Holy Week!

This week is THE most consequential week of the entire year, because it brings us to the most significant events in the history of the universe.

Holy Week culminates in the Paschal Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, the three days which changed the world forever. During the Masses and Liturgies of the Paschal Triduum, we do not simply re-create or remember events which happened long ago. Rather, these liturgies enable us to enter into the very reality of the original events themselves. In the power of the Holy Spirit, we enter into communion with the Lord Jesus Himself as He institutes the Eucharist, suffers in the Garden of Gethsemane, is condemned to death, dies on the Cross, is buried in the sepulcher, and truly rises to new life.

You will find in today's bulletin a listing of the liturgical events of Holy Week. As you are reading this, I extend to you a personal invitation to be with us, here in church, for the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum, especially the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Liturgy of the Passion and Death of the Lord on Good Friday, and the Great Vigil of Easter in the Holy Night on Holy Saturday.

Interestingly, most Masses begin with the Sign of the Cross and end with a blessing. During the Paschal Triduum, the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper begins with the Sign of the Cross, but there is no blessing at the end. The Good Friday Liturgy has no Sign of the Cross at the beginning, and no blessing at the end. There is no Sign of the Cross at the beginning of the Easter Vigil, but it does end with a solemn blessing. This is because those three liturgies are one liturgy, split over three days. They are best experienced together. I invite and encourage you to be present for all three of them.

Let us be sure to pray for each other during these intensely grace-filled days, and let us especially pray for those who have been distant from the Lord and the Church, that the graces of these days will move them to return to the love and mercy of God the Father, who sent His Son to purchase, with His Blood, the salvation of the world.

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead. John 20:1-9
