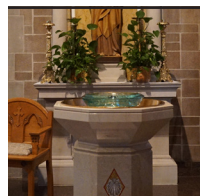

✧ A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ✧

Dear Friends,

On Tuesday, May 5th, Bishop Caggiano was here to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on seventy-two 8th graders from St. Catherine of Siena School and our Religious Education program. We warmly congratulate these fine young people, and wish them the best of God's blessings during this very special time for them and their families.

The CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH explains so beautifully that: "It is evident from its celebration that the effect of the Sacrament of Confirmation is the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost. From this fact, Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace:

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!"
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;
- it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross" (n. 1302, 1303).

But let's also talk about the elephant in the room.

Here at St. Catherine's, we invest a lot of time and energy into making sure that the candidates for Confirmation receive as sound and thorough a formation for this sacrament as we can give them. The day of their Confirmation is beautiful and joyful, and the Bishop and I encourage all of them to practice their faith consistently and confidently.

And then.... sadly, we never see many of them again.

We all "get" it that life for high school students and their families is packed with sports and activities and obligations and a thousand other things. But the time right after Confirmation is just when our newly-confirmed young people, and their families, need God, the Church, the sacraments, and the life of grace, the most! So let's not just sit by and look the other way, because that doesn't help anyone.

As one parishioner recently said to me, "The more you go, the more you go. And the more you don't go, the more you don't go." Truly, I wish everyone could see that active engagement in the life of the Church really is a "game changer." For everyone. It matters! And it makes a difference not just in time, but also in eternity: both in this world, and in the world to come.

When families drift away, everyone loses out. We miss them, and we don't want them to be swept away by the tide that carries everyone downstream, away from God, and away from the peace that only He can give. So don't be afraid to pass this column along to someone you think should see it.

It's very much addressed to and meant for our newly-confirmed students and their families. It is a warm invitation to let the grace of the Sacrament of Confirmation start to really work in the souls of those who have just received the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

The formula for that is simple: daily prayer, Mass every weekend, and regular confession. People who have been away from the regular practice of the Faith are just one good confession from returning. We're always here for you. Our doors, and our hearts, are open to you. There's no time like the present. And it makes all the difference in the world.

CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS

Staff and friends have been hard at work making all kinds of improvements and upgrades across the campus properties. Here are some highlights:

MSGR. SHEA MEMORIAL: Msgr. Shea always talked about having an outdoor statue of St. Catherine made, to place somewhere on our parish grounds. And we are now fulfilling his wish; The project is currently well underway in Italy! **Cody Swanson**, who sculpted the beautiful bronze statue of the Risen Christ in the St. Catherine of Siena Mausoleum at Gate of Heaven Cemetery in Trumbull, is one of the most talented sacred artists in the world today. An American, he lives and works in Florence, Italy. We have asked Cody to create a custom statue of St. Catherine for our parish campus. It will be installed on the lawn in front of the Rectory, dedicated to Msgr Shea, and blessed by Bishop Caggiano this fall. There, it will welcome everyone who comes onto our beautiful grounds.

CAMPUS: The high water level in the area north of the main parking lot continues to create challenges. The most recent challenge was the sink hole in the parking lot. We were fortunate our friends at Pepper's Landscaping took quick action.

A tree near the Parish Office building was removed as it was a danger to the building and others. and Pepper's Landscaping mitigated water issues in that area as well.

McCLINCH FAMILY CENTER: Windows were stained and repaired in an effort to extend their life. And the exterior doors were repaired and sanded.

People tell us they're proud of our church when they drive by. That's in part because we've been able to keep our campus looking like a park, which is just as it should be. Our campus is the place of the Blessed Sacrament. Where Jesus is should look its best.



CONFIRMATION

Together with the entire parish, we congratulate the 72 young men & women of our parish who were confirmed in the Faith of the Church.

Each Confirmand is anointed with Sacred Chrism, accompanied by words expressing clearly the effects of the Holy Spirit. WALKING TOGETHER IN FAITH THROUGH ACCOMPANIMENT

Across the Diocese of Bridgeport, many experience loneliness or spiritual disconnection. Through The One, the Diocese responds by offering pastoral accompaniment and home visits through Pastoral Companions, and one on one spiritual friendships through Walk With One.

The Bishop's Appeal supports these ministries and makes this work possible as we continue growing One in Christ.

As of April 17, we have received \$64,590 from 143 donors bringing the parish to 47% of its \$136,300 goal.

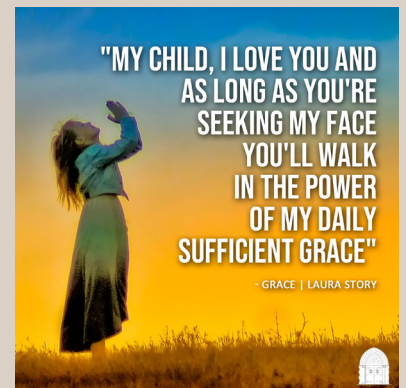
